

We have an agreement with Delta Youth Alliance for providing ticketing to interested teens to come to our concerts for free. We feel it's important for us to provide positive role models to gay/lesbian/bisexual youth.

Our small ensemble OUTLOUD! has other performances that the chorus as a whole cannot fulfill, and during the winter Holidays our Dickens Carolling ensemble "Don We Now," travels to private parties and other special events singing songs that celebrate the holidays.

We also socialize. Earlier this month, the chorus held it's annual retreat up in the Ocala woods, and last month we celebrated our 9th birthday.

The chorus is about much more than singing, and we highly encourage you to join us as either a singing member, or a support person. The Orlando Gay Chorus is a proud member of GALA, the Gay And Lesbian Association of choruses. Every four years GALA has a week-long festival of music. In 1992 The Orlando Gay Chorus traveled to Denver, Colorado for it's first festival. For those 30 performers, it was a life-changing experience. Trying to explain to those members that were unable to attend just what the experience was like was futile.

In 1996, the Festival was in Tampa, Florida, and almost the entire chorus was able to spend at least part of the week experiencing it. Those people that had never been before were completely stunned, and suddenly understood exactly what we were unable to convey to them with mere words.

Next year, GALA 2000 will be in San Jose, California, and we will once again be travelling to perform and experience a GALA Festival. Unfortunately, although we <u>do</u> know the way to San Jose (sorry, but I just HAD to), we also know that we can expect each member of the chorus to spend \$1,300 to \$1,500 in expenses. This fact, unfortunately, means that many people will be unable to go. The chorus organization would love to foot part of the bill for these people, but the money just isn't there. We <u>will</u> be underwriting a portion of each performing member's delegate fee, but that won't be enough to help some people.


