CATH IDEAL OF ST. JOHN-THE-BAPTIST, CHARLESTON, S. C .- 25



This cathedral, artistically and architecturally, is regarded as one of the most magnificent buildings in the south, constructed of Connecticut brownstone, about 200 feet long from the main entrance to the vestry, from the floor to the apex of the vaulted roof is 60 feet, the main altar is an exquisite work of Vermont marble, and the other altars are of marble. There are fifty stained glass windows from Munich reproducing masterpieces of great artists.
