DR. CHARLES CALLAHAN

Music Director

Charles Callahan is a native of Cambridge, Massachusetts, where he began his musical studies at the Boston Archdiocesan Choir School. In 1971 he received a full scholarship to the prestigious Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia. Following graduation from Curtis, Callahan was awarded a grant to study in Belgium with the famous composer and organist, Flor Peeters. Callahan taught at the Catholic University of America in Washington, D.C., where he earned his doctorate in 1978. He came to Florida from Middlebury College in Vermont, where he was Composer in Residence and directed the noted Middlebury College Choir. Dr. Callahan has become one of the leading performers and composers of organ and choral music in America. His recordings are on Vista and Pro Organo labels. Dr. Callahan is presently on the faculty of Rollins College and Director of Music and Resident Composer at the Knowles Memorial Chapel in Winter Park.

KEN THOMPSON, II

Accompanist and Associate Director

This is Mr. Thompson's twelfth year in the Orlando area. He has directed over one hundred musical productions ranging from professional shows at local theme parks to children's theatre. He is currently Director of Music at an Orlando church and teaches voice, vocal auditions and piano privately. Ken is also an owner of Florida Living and Design, a design company specializing in custom landscaping, irrigation systems and outdoor lighting. Mr. Thompson will be attending Stetson University in Fall '92.

SUELLEN FAGIN-ALLEN

Guest Soloist

Suellen is a graduate of Rollins College with a degree in vocal performance. She has a master's degree in Church Music from Ohio State University. She has been the organist and choir director for two local Episcopal churches and is presently the associate conductor for the Knowles Memorial Chapel Choir. She has also performed with the Bach Festival Choir and the Orlando Opera Company, and is a founding member and on the Board of Directors of Music Orlando, which sponsors an annual summer chamber music series. Suellen is a practicing attorney in the Orlando area.







CHORUSES CHORUSES

Orlando Gay Chorus is a member of GALA Choruses (the Gay and Lesbian Association of Choruses), an international alliance of over 100 men's, women's and mixed choruses dedicated to providing leadership and inspiration to the lesbian and gay movement through excellence in the choral arts. GALA Choruses produces a choral festival every four years, with the next in Denver in 1992. GALA Choruses also plans annual conferences for directors and managers, addresses problems of mutual concern, and assists with the sharing of music holdings.

United States member choruses are in Albuquerque, Asheville, Atlanta (2 choruses), Austin, Baltimore, Boston (2), Buffalo, Charlotte, Chicago (2), Cincinnati (2), Cleveland, Columbus, Dallas (2), Denver (3), Des Moines, Detroit (2), Green Bay, Harrisburg, Honolulu, Houston, Indianapolis (2), Kansas City (2), Lansing (2), Lexington, Little Rock, Long Beach (2), Los Angeles (2), Memphis, Miami/Ft. Lauderdale (2), Milwaukee (2), Minneapolis/St. Paul (3), New Haven (2), New Orleans, New York City (2), Oklahoma City, Omaha, Orlando, Philadelphia (3), Phoenix, Pittsburgh, Portland (3), Princeton, Richmond, Roanoke, Rochester (3), Sacramento (3), St. Louis (2), San Antonio, San Diego (2) San Francisco (4), San Jose, Santa Cruz, Santa Fe, Seattle (3), Syracuse, Tacoma, Tampa (2), Tucson, Washington, D.C. (2), and West Hollywood. Canadian choruses are in Calgary, Ottawa (2), Toronto, Saskatoon, and Vancouver (3), and there are GALA Choruses in Berlin, Germany, London, England, and Sydney, Australia.

A DOZEN DON'TS (AND A DO) A Checklist of Concert Etiquette

- 1. If you insist on arriving late, refrain from traipsing down the middle aisle. This is not a wedding and you are not the bride. Go sit someplace and be discreet. For a change.
- 2. Please remove all severe hats. The gentleman behind may be searching for a husband, and we wouldn't want him to overlook the chorus.
- 3. Don't try to settle up who-owes-who while the chorus is performing. Honestly, you'd carp about "Who had the tuna fish?" in the middle of *Do You Hear What I Hear?*
- 4. Don't betray your lack of breeding. Keep your shoes on.
- 5. Do not snap your purse open and shut during a musical selection. This is tacky.
- 6. Stifle all sneezes, eructation, and flatulence. Even if it pops out your ears.
- 7. The experienced concertgoer will sorta preview the event by looking at his program and discovering what pieces are "grouped together." (This is a very technical concept.) If you have the slightest doubt as to whether a piece is finished, refrain from applause. You should be able to figure this out by the conductor lowering his hands and a visible look of relief sweeping across the baritones.
- 8. Eventually (believe it or not) you'll hear a song you recognize. You may even know the words. You may want to sing. Please don't! (The basses only learned their Fa-la-las last week and they're so easily swayed.)
- 9. When the chorus sings piano (*i.e. softly*), this is an achievement. This is not your opportunity to cough, murmur lovingly in your escort's ear, shuffle in your seat, or rearrange your coiff. (We do tape these events.)
- 10. Noise abatement is even more crucial when the chorus sings pianissimo (very softly) and pianissi-issimo (soft to the max). Our elegantly trained and demandingly precise music staff has spent countless hours of time perfecting OGC's goosepimpling piani, but alack, our recordings sound like we're doing a benefit at The Old Sinus Home.
- 11. Use the intermission for reviving your social calendar. Don't over-commit yourself. Arrange no more than five "must-get-togethers" for after the concert. Avoid scheduling perennial no-shows. Above all, don't dump your date.
- 12. At the end of the evening, don't bruise people in haste to get to your parking place. I only thought Uncle Elmer was that crass.

After the concert, warmly invite a favored performer to meet you for drinks. Introduce the performer to all eligible singles present (including yourself). Bug out when necessary. Should you not have a keenly developed social sense, one of your mutual friends should smile warmly and say, "It has been so nice for you to introduce us."
