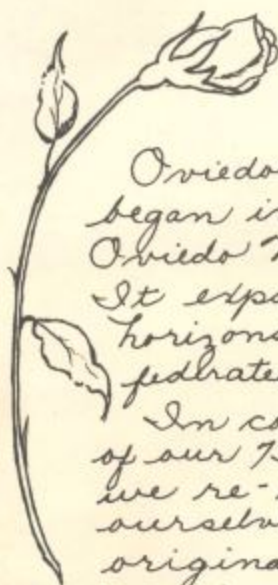

Thursday, February 5, 1981

Members of the Oviedo Woman's Club will mark their 75th year of service to the community by holding a gala Anniversary Reception on Sunday, February 22.

Partners in their 80s report to work as usual

Dick Tucker and Jack Branham Sr. are expected to go to work as usual today. So, what is unusual about that? For one thing, Tucker is observing his birthday — his 82nd.

His partner, Branham, is a year and a half older. He will be 84 in August.

Back on Sept. 15, 1925, they opened their firm, Tucker and Branham, in an office in the old Florida Bank Building, now known as No. 1 N. Orange Ave. in downtown Orlando.

From that one-room, two-man office, they have built one of the most successful insurance and agricultural loan businesses in Florida — maybe even in the Southeast.

Today, their firm employs 52 persons and occupies a large office building on East Central Boulevard overlooking Lake Eola. Tucker and Branham also has branch offices in Winter Garden, Sanford and Groveland.

Fifty-six years after starting, both men report for duty every day. Branham works about half a day. Tucker puts in a full day. A few years ago they decided he would work three days a week, but he hasn't gotten around to that yet, except during hunting season.

Through the years, both have distinguished themselves with their contributions to the community. For example, some longtime members of the Country Club of Orlando say that Branham saved the club from bankruptcy. He is a retired director of the Orange Bowl and chairman emeritus of the Central Florida Blood Bank, which he has served since 1942. Tucker has been president of virtually every organization in which he has held membership, including the Orlando Area Chamber of Commerce, Central Florida Fair and Florida Mortgage Bankers.

It may be surprising these days to find two people who have worked together — and have been friends — for 56 years.

"Oh, we've had disagreements, but we've always had sense enough to sit down and talk it out," said Branham.

"We're both tolerant, I guess, but Jack is more tolerant," added Tucker, grinning.

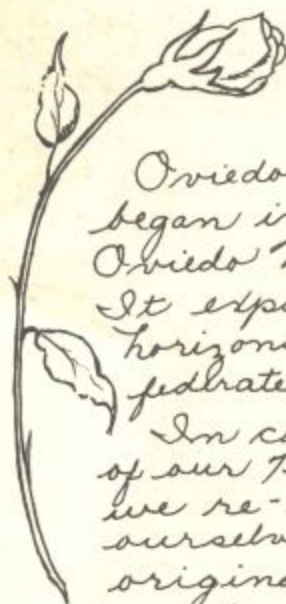
