MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING  
Between the  
SEMINOLE SOIL AND WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT  
And  
SEMINOLE COUNTY

Upon this 9th day of October, 1974, this Memorandum of Understanding was entered into by the Seminole Soil and Water Conservation District, hereinafter called the District, and the County of Seminole hereinafter called the County.

Recognizing the need for joint effort in improving the environment and safeguarding natural resources, the District and the County enter into this Memorandum of Understanding.

The District will provide technical assistance to the County as requested in accordance with existing policies and available resources.

THE DISTRICT AGREES TO:

1. Arrange for able technical assistance of the Soil Conservation Service as may be needed and available to:
  - a. Assist with inventorying soil, water, and plant resources.
  - b. Help with land use planning for the future.
  - c. Provide soil maps and interpretations.
  - d. Provide suggested criteria for conservation measures.
  - e. Review and comment on selected development plans as requested.
  - f. Provide suggestions for the installation and maintenance of conservation measures.
  - g. Study water management, erosion, sediment and land use problems to provide suggested solutions.
  - h. Provide investigative and interpretive reports and help prepare conservation plans as requested.
2. Help arrange for assistance from other local, State or Federal cooperating agencies.
3. Assign priority for accomplishing the work required.
4. Consult with the County on any proposed project or plan affecting the natural resources.

The County will cooperate with the District in the development and implementation of land and water use programs using resource data and technical information provided by the District.



THE COUNTY AGREES TO:

1. Utilize sound soil and water conservation principles giving consideration to the needs for water management, erosion and sediment controls, beautification, wildlife enhancement and preservation, and the proper disposal of wastes.
2. Counsel with the District concerning present and future plans for development of the County. Consider soil information and limitations and other technical information provided by the District in plan development.
3. Consider and comment on the District's long range program and projects for watershed protection and resource conservation and development as they would apply to the County plans and activities.
4. Be responsible for the adoption of criteria, standards and designs needed for implementing the provisions of this memorandum.
5. Provide adequate interim information and plans for any development for which review is requested.

IT IS MUTUALLY AGREED THAT:

1. The District and the County will meet at least annually to jointly develop or revise their plans for mutual cooperation.
2. Material and information developed by either party or jointly will appropriately recognize the contributions of each.
3. This memorandum may be amended or terminated at any time by mutual consent of the parties hereto or may be terminated by either party by giving sixty (60) days notice in writing to the other.
