

CLASS HISTORY

One of the dumbest classes ever to come through the doors of O. H. S. was the first grade of 1932.

We started out in the first grade with eleven pupils and now we have only three. Those who started were: Lex Abell, Robert Lee, Daniel Lukas, Andrew Mertan, Wayne Miller, Kathryn Aulin, Betty Mikler, Sharon Murphy, Martha Carraway, Jack King, and Annie Alice Kennedy.

We lost Jack King, Wayne Miller, and Annie Alice Kennedy the first year, but gained three more--Arthur Richards, Billy Casteel, and Harrie Ross in the second.

By the time we reached the third grade we had an enrollment of eighteen. Those on roll were Lex Abell, James Henry Cooper, James Davis, Billy Gammage, Robert Lee, Daniel Lukas, Andrew Mertan, Arthur Richards, John Henry Wilson, Thomas Darling, Kathryh Aulin, Charlotte Beasley, Martha Carraway, Betty Mikler, Sharon Murphy, Harrie Ross, Grace Ann Maloy, and Jammie Maloy. Miss Khadra Culpepper was our home room teacher.

In the fourth grade we lost Lex, Robert, Grace Ann, and Jammie. In their place we increased by five more--Marjorie Wilkerson, Bessie Mae Carver, Sally Tippen, Ruth Burns, and Charlotte Sjoblon.

By the time we reached the sixth grade we had a new teacher, Miss Harper. We had a few new members by this time and lost some also. The class roll at this time was, Daniel Lukas, Andrew Mertan, John Henry Wilson, Robert Adams,

Lowell Tripp, Kathryn Aulin, Charlotte Beasley, Betty Mikler, Marjorie Wilkerson, Alice Adams, and Doris Smith.

We thought we were grown-up now as we were in the seventh grade. The class was the same except Mildred Dinda was with us, and Billy Gammage came back after spending the previous year in Sanford.

We lost Andrew Mertan in the seventh grade. Robert and Alice Adems. Filly Gammage, and John Henry Wilson all left by the end of our first sixth weeks in the eighth grade. Lowell Tripp and Charlotte Beasley did not graduate with us though. During this year Leon Olliff, Betty Bradley, and Inez Smith helped increase our enrollment.

Just think we were in high school even if there were only nine of us. Two new girls came from Chuluota this year--Margie McClellan and Nellie Tindall. Nellie stayed only six weeks.

Mattie Pearl Jordan took Margie's place in the tenth grade. Canby Kimble came for aix weeks.

As Juniors we had only two boys and six girls. Betty Bradley moved to Orlando after nine days, and Margie left after eighteen days.

During our last year Jack King became a senior, but Leon Olliff left for the navy the last of October, Daniel Lukas did the same about a month later, and Mattie Pearl Jordan married Herbert Davis the first of November and left. Betty Mikler did not start this year. Marjorie Wilkerson went to Boo Jones Jollege to finish her last year. This left Kathryn Aulin, Inez Smith, and Jack King.
