KENNEDY SPACE CENTER, Fla. -- The Apollo 13 space vehicle was moved the 3.5 miles from Vehicle Assembly Building to Pad A at Launch Complex 39 this morning in preparation for launch on the nation's third lunar landing mission March 12 at 3:28 p.m. On hand as the transporter moved down the crawlerway with the space vehicle and mobile launcher were the members of the Apollo 13 prime crew.
