
Referring to your letter of the 13th regarding a clause in our contract that will enumerate last season's rates upon which the packing charge is based, with the understanding that if we are forced by a combination or union to pay more, that this advance or increase be passed along to the grower.

We do not know whether or not it is possible to do anything of this kind; we are now looking into it and will advise you again.

Our contract provides that there shall be a readjustment or refund on account of strikes, walkouts or other labor troubles in connection with the operation of the packing house.

We are now looking up the rates of wages we paid for the various jobs the last four or five seasons and will see where we are getting off. You might also look through your records and let us know the increase in cost. You might be able to find this out from the Isleworth payrolls.
