### Shots Campaign Planned?

WASHINGTON (AP) - Two dozen of the nation's top scientists are meeting with President Food amid reports that government health experts are recommending a massive campaign to innoculate every American against a rare and deadly flu strain.

Any such mimunization program would be the largest in the nation's history and would be aimed at the swine flu virus, a strain that has been dormant for nearly a half

The swine flu strain was blamed for 20 million deaths world-wide during a 1918 epidemic that claimed more American lives than World War I combat. In all, 500,000 Americans died of the flu strain during the epidemic.

### Measure Prospects Good

WASHINGTON (AP) - In a rare display of electionyear harmony, key Democrats are predicting Congress will approve an administration bill to require government agencies to obtain court orders before using electronic surveillance devices in cases involving national security. The Democrats joined the administration in introducing the bill Tuesday in what Sen. Edward M. Kennedy, D-Mass., called "an extraordinary spirit of constructive

cooperation with the Congress." Although predicting the bill will be approved t Congress, Kennedy and other Democrats said they had reservations about the measure and indicated it would not pass without changes.

### Talks On Bases Begin

WASHINGTON (AP) - Secretary of State Henry A. Kissinger and Turkish Foreign Minister Ihsan S. Caglayangil are opening two days of talks here, hoping to reach agreement on restoring U.S. access to military and intelligence facilities in Turkey.

Turkey suspended U.S. privileges at the installations last summer after Congress terminated military aid to Turkey because U.S. arms were used in the Turkish invasion of Cyprus in 1974.

U.S. officials said negotiations for allowing the United States to resume its activities at the 26 facilities, including several intelligence installations, are more than 90 per cent complete.

### Measure Blames Israel

UNITED NATIONS, N.Y. (AP) - With the United States joining in criticism of Israeli occupation practices. nonaligned members of the Security Council today prepared a resolution blaming Israel for the wave of Arab unrest on the West Bank of the Jordan river.

A working paper circulated by nonaligned members declared that the demonstrations were the result of "Israel's violation of the rights of the inhabitants" of the occupied territories and the "measures of repression" taken against them.

The paper also condemned Israel for changing the character and status of Jerusalem and for building Jewish settlements in occupied Arab territories.

### Missing Boy Found

TOWSON, Md. (AP) -- Billy Arthes, the 10-year-old Towson, Md., newsboy missing since March 15, was found alive and well this morning in Northern Virginia, according to Baltimore County police.

The child was the subject of an intensive week-long search in Baltimore County. Police Tuesday issued a kidnaping warrant for the arrest of a 21-year-old former mental patient from Hyattsville, Md., who was wanted for questioning in Cape Coral, Fla.

There were no details immediately available as to how the youngster was found.

## Daytona Police Report

## Judge Referendums Okayed

TALLAHASSEE (AP) - A merit-retention plan to allow Floridians to vote yes or no on keeping Florida Supreme Court justices and district court of appeal judges in office has been approved by the House Judiciary

The panel approved the proposed constitutional amendment on 7-6 vote Tuesday. It rejected, 8-5, another plan that would have provided for local option referendums on yes-no retention of circuit and county judges. The modified "Missouri Plan" sponsored by Rep. Lee Moffitt, D-Tampa, would eliminate contested elections for the 27 appellate judges, seven of whom are on the high

## Transfer Plan Rebuffed

TALLAHASSEE (AP) - Gov. Reubin Askew's plan to transfer a \$1-million job training program from the Department of Education to the Department of Commerce has been rebuffed by a House subcommittee. The appropriations subcommittee refused Tuesday to change its position that the program, which trains industrial workers, should remain under the supervision of

Askew, who has set a high priority on economic development programs in his \$5-billion budget, maintains that putting the training program under the Department of Commerce would better suit it to industry needs.

### Airline Efficiency Declines

MIAMI (AP) - Eastern Airlines has reported a profit of \$5 million for February but says its yield per passenger mile continues to decline.

The Miami-based carrier reported profit for the first two months of 1976 totaled \$8.4 million, compared to a \$7.8 million loss for the same period last year.

However, executive vice president Charles J. Simons said company efficiency, as measured in yield per passenger mile, has declined "year-over-year for six out of the last eight months." Simons said February's two per cent decrease reflected the impact of discount fares. prison plus three years










## Crisis Grows In Rhodesia

In a symbolic attempt at compromise last August, the black and white leaders of Rhodesia held a dramatic meeting in a railway car on the Victoria Falls Bridge, exactly on the border between black-ruled Zambia and white-ruled Rhodesia. It was the fourth such attempt since Rhodesia declared its independence from Britain 10 years ago to write a constitution that would be based on black majority rule in Rhodesia

The Victoria Falls Bridge meeting was strongly supported by the leaders of South Africa Hampering which also is facing great pressure from the tide of black nationalism sweeping Africa. South African Premier John Vorster believes that the alternative to compromise between blacks and whites in Africa could be an all-out racial conflict.

That also was the fear of the United States of America and Britain which more recently applied pressure on Rhodesian Prime Minister Ian Smith to begin serious negotiations with the black leaders in his country who want to share constitutional

The Communist takeover of Angola prompted the United States and Britain to bring matters to a head with Rhodesia. Militarily, Rhodesia's whites are a fragile reed before the thousands of black Marxist guerrillas surrounding the landlocked nation - guerrillas trained and armed by the Soviet Union and Communist China. And the 12,000 or so Cuban mercenaries who conquered Angola for the Communists still are poised there, ready to strike into Southwest Africa, or Namibia, South Africa and Rhodesia.

If that isn't enough trouble, Rhodesia faces an equally grave problem on the east with the declaration by Mozambique that it is cutting of Mr. Smith's economic lifeline to the sea and all but openly declaring war on Rhodesia.

The fuse is being lighted for a bitter and bloody war and the sad fact is that there are no pan-African or international moral or political sanctions strong enough to put it out.

By failing to support self determination Angola, the Organization of African Unity has exhibited that almost anything done by the socalled native liberation forces is all right. The United Nations has been weak and ineffectual in African affairs. And the rush of other nations in the world to recognize the illicit Angolan government has legitimized the revolutionary activities.

The Western world can only hope that Mr. Smith will bend enough to avert wholesale bloodshed, and pray that the hour is not already too late for him to do so.

BUENOS AIRES, Argentina (AP) - One of the most anticipated coups in history occurred early today when the commanders of Argentina's three armed forces finally ousted President Isabel Peron and flew her under

arrest to the interior of the country. The military takeover, which had been expected for months, ended 21 chaotic months in office for the Western Hemisphere's first woman head of government

A communique broadcast over the national radio network said the army commander, Gen. Jorge R. Videla, 50, was heading a three-man junta which was in "operational control" of Argentina. The other members are the navy commander, Adm. Emilio Massera, and the air force commander, Gen. Orlando R. Agosti. The junta accused Mrs. Peron's government of immorality and incompetence. It said Argentina was faced with "a tremendous power vacuum threatening to sink it in disintegration and anarchy."

## Leftists Shell Palace

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) - Moslem leftist forces shelled the presidential palace during the night and raided mountain Christian strongholds as Syria stepped up efforts to arrange a new cease-fire in Lebanon's civil

Moslem and Christian militiamen bettling : Beirut's hotel district kept up heavy mortar, rocket and gun fire today, but there was no further shift in position after a 400yard Moslem advance Tuesday toward the Christian-heid

The Moslems also made several hit-and-run raids on Christian summer resorts in the Mt. Lebanon hinterland behind Beirut, the police reported.

WASHINGTON (AP) — After agreeing with Japanese officials to share information about Lockheed Aircraft Corp. payoffs, U.S. officials say they hope to negotiate agreements with several other countries to trade information in the widening probe of Lockheed. Assistant Atty. Gen. Richard L. Thornburgh reported that development Tuesday night as he signed an agreement obligating U.S. and Japanese law enforcement agencies to share information gathered in their separate investigations of Lockheed payoffs in Japan. "I anticipate there will be a number of other countries

Johnston, 58, was named in 1969 to the top executive position in the territory managed by the U.S. Department of the Interior. His resignation, effective July 1, comes in the wake of a

Many believe that pasta originated in China some 6,000 years ago and was first introduced to the Italians by Marco Polo in 1295. The Italians feel so strongly about pasta that they even have a pasta museum near the Italian Riviera, which was started by the family who made

pasta into an industry in the year 1824. According to the museum records, and despite the Marco Polo theory, ravioli and noodles (two forms of pasta) were being eaten in Rome in 1284, some years before Marco Polo returned to Italy. Ancient documents Fig. Con pasta was a revered and ancient tood eaten as early as 5,000 B.C. Poets and writers have actually sung its praises in their work.

It is thought that Thomas Jefferson first introduced pasta into America in about 1786 when he returned from a tour of duty as American Ambassador to France. He is supposed to have brought back a spaghetti die from Italy and used it to make small amounts of spaghetti for

his personal use. The immigration in the 19th century of many people from Fried Chicken Russia, Poland and Germany who brought with them a taste for noodles, started an interest appeared commercially in this country about 1848, but only established itself as an industry during the First World War when all imports from Italy

were cut off. The variety of pasta ranges from the familiar long spaghetti to tiny alphabet letters for soup and every conceivable shape in between. Pasta can be served in the same considerable variety that we find in it s shape. You can serve it plain, with butter, dressed up with oil, garlic and Parmesan cheese, with your favorite tomato sauce, and with melted cheese for macaroni and cheese. It can be served as a salad, side dish, or main course. It is still relatively




