

Soviet correspondents reported today that the Red armies surging down upon the German left flank, had defeated two Nazi divisions in the flaming 40-mile corridor between the Don and Volga Rivers, while inside Stalingrad the crisis remained acute.

German prisoners were quoted as saying that one Nazi tank division and a motorized infantry division have been routed in that three-day battle and that some companies (normally containing about 100 men) only had 15 or 20 survivors.


