

Cards Ready To Receive Winners In American League

By JUDSON BAILEY Associated Press Staff Writer ST. LOUIS, Sept. 29, (AP)—A series atmosphere settled over Sportsman's park Monday as the St. Louis Cardinals made ready to receive the New York Yankees in the first game of the classic Wednesday.

The world champions were not due here until late tomorrow, but the red-hot Cards worked out on their home field while carpenters hammered up additional seats and Commissioner Kennesaw M. Landis made a checkup of arrangements for playing the games and handling the crowds of about 35,000 for the two installments that will be played here this week.

Without committing himself definitely Manager Billy Southworth of the Cards indicated that he had his pitching schedule already mapped out with Mort Cooper, Johnny Beasley, Max Lanier and Ernie White working in that order.

Starting Cooper in the opening game, of course, has been a forecast conclusion. His record of 25 victories and 10 shutouts has stamped him the year's outstanding hurler in the majors and in spite of the furious National League pennant fight that lasted till the final day of the season, Cooper has been rested since last Thursday.

The choice of Beasley for the second game was based partly on the reasoning that a rookie would have a better chance performing in his own park before friendly fans than he would in pitching before some 70,000 persons in Yankee stadium.

Beasley achieved his 21st triumph of the season yesterday in the second game of a double-header with the Chicago Cubs and the assignment to face the Yankees Thursday would bring him back into action right on his regular pitching schedule.

The two southpaws who then pitched were not the champions in their own arena as sufficiently seasoned that Southworth figures they can withstand the strain that all National League clubs, coming out of small parks, feel when they invade the huge concrete tripledecker stadium in New York.

The Cardinals frolicked through their practice today and will hold another session tomorrow. They were to appear at a rally sponsored by a local furniture store.

The return of the world series to St. Louis for their part evidenced no particular interest in whom the Yankees pitched, although they were somewhat surprised to learn that the Bombers were not going to arrive until the eve of the opening game.

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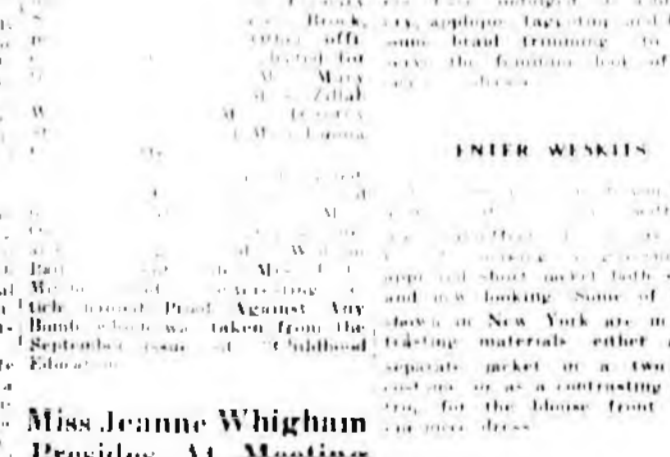
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Transportation Difficulties Postpone Celery-Feds' Game With Lake City

Dillon Graham Picks All-Star Baseball Team

NEW YORK, Sept. 30, (AP)—The lanky Boston Red Sox outfielder, who has won the batting triple in either major league in eight years, comes close to being the standout player of the year and is definitely the first nomination for baseball's 1942 All-Star team.

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Without much question, another unanimous choice is Joe Gordon, the Yankees second sacker. Always rated among the best as a fielder and valuable as a home run blaster and far a player who has been in far more than his share of runs, Gordon has come to the front this year as a contender for the batting crown. He has been in the first five most of the season.

As for first base, Johnny Mize appears the logical choice. The bulky Giant sacker is among the National League's leaders in homers, runs batted in and also hitting above .300.

There seems no argument against the naming of Mort Cooper of Brooklyn, another right-hander. This trio has the edge over any of the lefties.

From here on out debates are possible. Our completed line-up includes Phil Rizzuto of the Yankees at shortstop, Stan Hack of the Cubs at third, Enos Slaughter of the Cardinals and Mel Ott of the Giants in the outfield and Mickey Owen of the Dodgers behind the dish. Rizzuto doesn't have much of

Moore Said To Be Best Defensive Outfielder

ST. LOUIS, Sept. 30, (AP)—The greatest defensive outfielder in baseball? It's Terry Moore. That's what Cardinal fans say and few are inclined to disagree. Terry, at 30, is the "old man" of this new gas house gang of Cardinals. He became a Cardinal regular in 1938, the year after the Red Birds had won the world championship and when most of his current teammates were grammar school kids.

He's captain this year, the spark of the club. If he hadn't been booted late last season, just when the Cards needed his ability and driving force most, St. Louis might have posed out Brooklyn for the 1941 championship.

If Terry could only hit hard and often he would be a serious rival of the Yankees' Joe DiMaggio as the greatest all-around outfielder in the majors. His lifetime average is a creditable .284 but he has cleared the 300 mark only once, in 1940 when he also hit 17 homers.

On edge over the manager-shortstop of the Indians, Lou Boudreau, is among the leaders of the Browns or Hal Reese of the Dodgers. Some might choose Bill Judge of the Giants or Eddie Miller of the Braves.

Slaughter has been the big punch of the Cards in their drive to the pennant while Mel Ott's fine play and leadership has brought the Giants, tabbed as a second division outfit, into third place. Ott is among the leaders in homers and runs batted in.

Slaughter, Ott and Williams rate higher in our book than DiMaggio any. Kenesaw Mountain Davis and Medwick of the Dodgers and Terry Moore of the Cards.

Dodgers followers claim Mickey Owen was the team's most valuable player. He had the best of his six years in the majors and gets the nod over Walker Cooper and Enos Slaughter. These played important roles in their teams' successes too. Lou Gehrig was the league batting champion.

Experts Prophecy Yankees As World Series Winners

ST. LOUIS, Sept. 30, (AP)—Experts congregated here for the world series climbed aboard the bandwagon of the New York Yankees in great clusters tonight, although most of them thought the St. Louis Cardinals would make matters interesting.

Ken Smith, the New York Daily Mirror's observer who picked the exact order of the finish in both major leagues in the Associated Press poll of baseball writers last spring, led the swing for the world champions.

A personal roter for the New York Giants and a veteran National League traveling correspondent, Smith declared "I'm fired being wrong because of sentiment. I'm picking the Yankees this time."

Al Horvitz, president of the Baseball Writers Association, was one of the few who came out with a prediction that the Yankees would sweep the series, however.

Here are some of the views: Gayle Talbot, Associated Press—Yankees with the series going the limit. Gordon Cobbledick, Cleveland Plain-Dealer—Yankees, believe it or not, in six. Shirley Fovich, Washington Star—The champs in five. John Drebringer, New York Times—Like Smith. I'm through picking against the Yankees. I think they'll win. Stan Baumgartner, Philadelphia Inquirer—I'm going out on the limb for the Cardinals—based on one man, Mort Cooper. John Carmichael, Chicago Daily News—Looks like the Yankees again in six. Judson Bailey, Associated Press—Yankees are in for a battle, but they ought to win. Roy Stockton, St. Louis Post-Dispatch—I'd have to pick the Cards anyway, I suppose, but I really think they will win. John Cronley, Oklahoma City Daily Oklahoman—Four out of six for the Yankees. Joe Williams, New York World Telegram—I'm too old to be put on the spot. I pick the Yankees in seven, but if Cooper wins tomorrow then I believe the Cards

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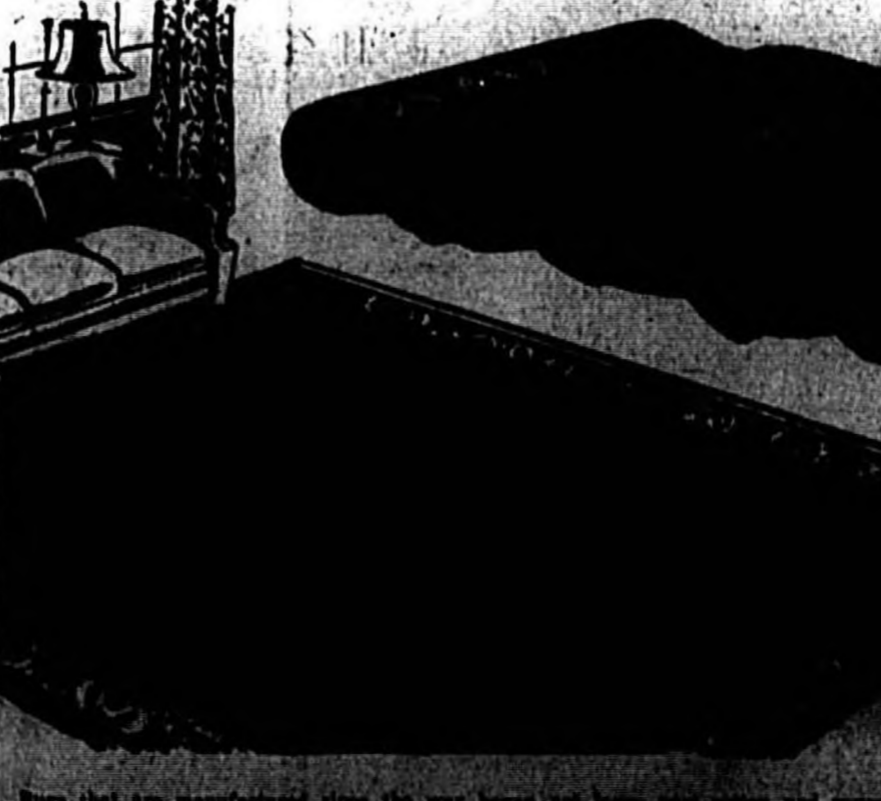

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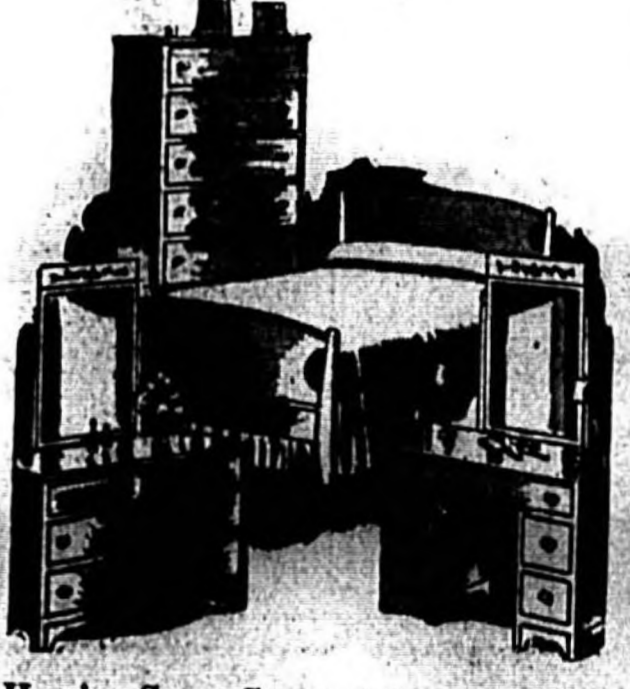
