branded as evil, narrow-minded book burners, it might be well to examine the role of the parent as censor. Some of the citizens of that small community believed that fifteen-year old students shouldn't be required to read "Slaughterhouse Five" by Kurt Vonnegut and "Deliverance" by James Dickey because of profanity and sexual references in both books. The assigned copies of the Vonnegut book

were subsequently burned in the school furnace.

Just about everybody, including now the folks in Drake, understands that burning the books was a mistake. Burning books have the stench of the Inquisition and Hitler, and I know of no one who wants that kind of smell in the air again. Left unresolved in Drake, and in the rest of the country, is the basic question of parental authority versus academic

Cigarette smell lingers on and on

Polly's Problem DEAR POLLY - My problem is removing stale odors left in the house from cigarette smoking. Even the draperies smell of it. I certainly would appreciate some help with ideas for its removal. -D.K.

DEAR POLLY - My Pet Peeve concerns telephone operators and I am one. Why do people call information for a number and never have a pencil at hand to write it down?

DEAR POLLY - This is to help Sandy sew on thin materials and synthetics. Lower the pressure dial, decrease the needle-thread tension and be sure to buy the correct type thread. Put a strip of tissue paper under the material being stitched, sew through it along with the material and then tear away. Test after making each adjustment using a scrap of the same fabric as you will be sewing with. -MARIAN.

DEAR POLLY - Sandy can keep the seams on synthetic fabrics from gathering and drawing if she will use a longer stitch. Test on a scrap of the same fabric until the desired length is found. When sewing on thin materials be sure the machine needle has a very sharp point. A blunt one will snag the material. To prevent the material from crawling put a piece of tissue paper over the fabric, stitch over the paper and when finished rip it off.—VIRGINIA.

(POLLY'S NOTE — I think this should have read to put the tissue paper under the fabric. I do not see how one sewing could see the seam if the tissue was on top.)



Nixon Gains In Poll

PRINCETON, N.J. (AP) - The latest Gallup Poll indicates the percentage of Americans who believe President Nixon should be forced out of office has dropped slightly after rising steadily since June. Thirtyfive per cent of those questioned in a Nov. 30-Dec. 3 survey said the President should be impeached and compelled to leave office. That poll showed a drop of two per cent from a Nov. 2-5 survey. In both surveys a majority of Americans said they opposed impeaching Nixon. Both polls also showed the majority disapproving of the way Nixon is handling the presidency.
