City trims general fund budget

SANFORD — City commissioners signed off on across the board budget cuts Tuesday — including their meals that are served on commission meeting days.

Only two city departments will see substantial increases. The fire and police departments will receive a combined \$1.3 million increase, but a large portion of that funding will be used to cover shortfalls in those departments' pension funds. City Commission will continue to

hash out next year's budget during a work session slated for this morning. During Tuesday's session, Commission decided to move forward with the proposed general fund budget without any changes to the allocations presented by the city's finance director, Kevin L. Smith, and the interim city manager, Andrew Van Gaale.

The general fund — the chief oper-

ating fund of the city — will make up approximately \$28.75 million of the city's \$51.41 million budget.

"It's pretty sparse," said Van Gaale. "There isn't a whole lot of increase. In fact, most departments have seen a decrease in funds."

During recent weeks, Smith, along with Van Gaale, evaluated each of the city's cost items in order to overcome a \$1.65 million deficit in the

2003-2004 city budget. Last week, the two presented Commission with the \$51.41 million balanced-budget, an increase of nearly \$1.35 million from the 2002-2003 budget.

"We're not alone in facing tough budget times," said Smith. "It's important to note this is a state and nationwide problem."

One measure taken to balance the general fund was the recent employee lay offs that resulted in 14 city employees and three vacant positions being eliminated. The elimination of the 17 jobs from the city pay-

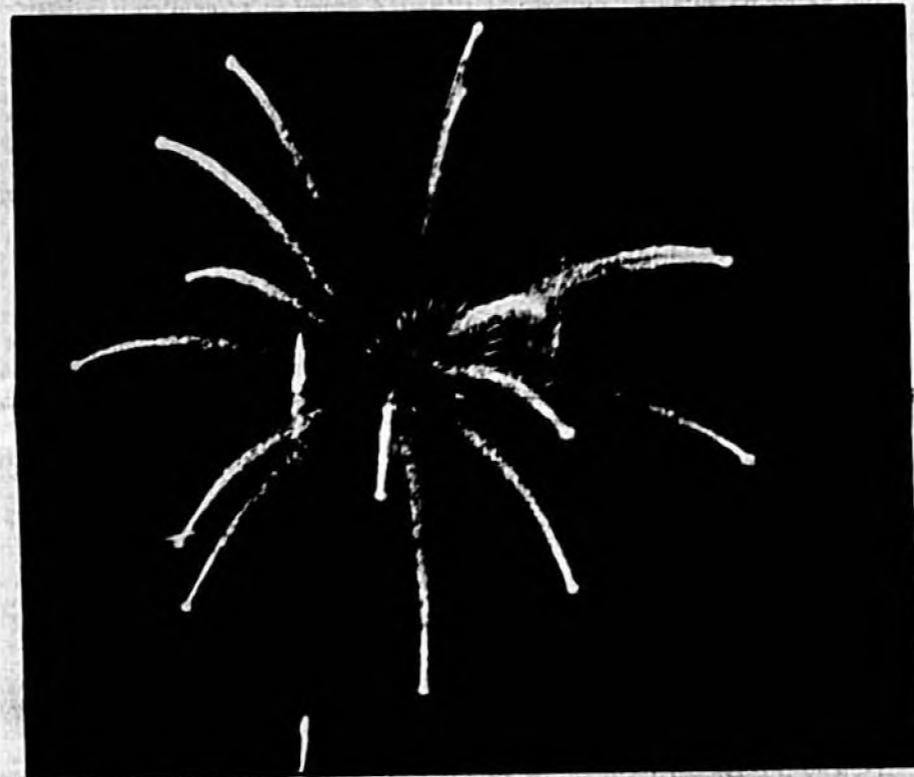

State Law allows non-smokers to breathe easier

But some businesses say they will choke without tobacco users

Seminole County residents can now breathe a little easier.

After three years in the works, the American Cancer Society is celebrating a victory with the enforcement of the smoking ban inside public restaurants, which began last week.

"This is a huge public health victory," said Patti Seeber, regional advocacy specialist for the American Cancer Society. "This will eliminate secondhand smoke in the workplace and all the diseases that come along with it."

According to Seeber, topping the list of ailments caused by secondhand smoke are several forms of cancer. Following in a close second are breathing difficulties, caused by allergies and asthma.

"Most of the feedback has been very positive," Seeber

explained. "Most people can't wait to go out and eat."

In November, in a landslide victory, 71 percent of Floridians voted to amend the state's constitution to prohibit smoking in all enclosed restaurants. Smoking is still permitted, however, on patios and balconies, and in stand-alone bars where less than 10 percent of its income is food.

"Every restaurant has to be smoke free, so everyone is on the same level," said Seeber.

According to the American Cancer Society, trends in other states with similar laws show that restaurants may realize a slight dip in revenues initially, but business will pick back up.

"Some places don't even see decreases," she said. "In our area, there are so many tourists, people are going to go out to eat whether they can smoke or not. They're not going to stay home and cook for the rest of their lives."

Kathy Griggs, unit manager of Denny's on State Road 46 in Sanford, disagrees.

"We've lost some of our regular customers who would come in twice a day,"

Consumers can 'hang up' on telemarketers

In response to an increasing flow of consumer complaints about telemarketers, the Federal Communications Commission (FCC) has joined with the Federal Trade Commission (FTC) to create a national do-not-call registry that promises to give consumers the power to reduce the number of unsolicited telemarketer calls they receive.

"It was time to re-examine our rules to ensure that they created a proper balance between the consumer's right to privacy and the valid efforts of businesses to market their products," according to K. Dane Snowden, Chief of the Consumer & Governmental Affairs Bureau at the FCC. Snowden's office had the responsibility for crafting the new rules limiting telemarketer calls, rules which include the new do-not-call registry that will become effective October 1, 2003.

Telemarketing has long

been a part of the American business scene, providing consumers with the opportunity to consider a wide range of products and services without leaving their homes. "I recently logged a number of calls at home ranging from an offer to refinance my mortgage to a chance to purchase premium steaks, all within one hour," Snowden said. "For me, it's a little like eating at a smorgasbord—all the choices are laid out before you."

Along with legitimate telemarketing activity there has been some abuse of calls and faxes to consumers' homes, and in 1992 the FCC adopted comprehensive national rules governing telemarketing under authority granted by Congress in the 1991 Telephone Consumer Protection Act (TCPA). The FCC's rules included the requirement that individual telemarketers maintain company-specific do-not-call lists,

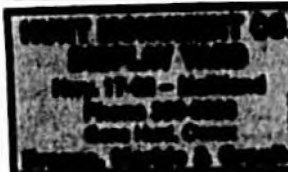

At first, guys seem to like me, too. But then they quickly become uninterested and end up never asking me out — or even talking to me again! This has happened so many times.

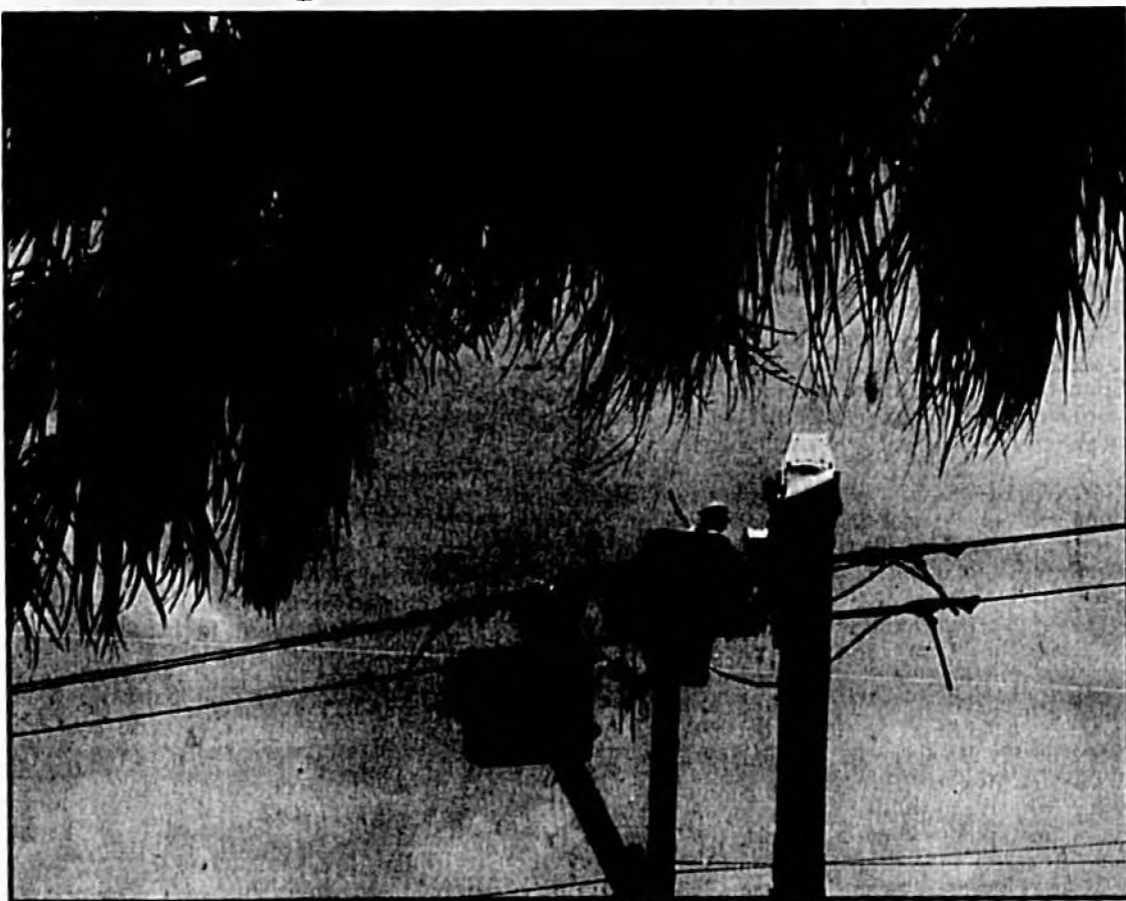

roll freed up \$800,000 in general funds.

Other cuts to the general fund include the deletion of funds allocated to pay for city commission meals during meeting days, worth approximately \$3,000. A \$2,419 decrease in city clerk election-related expenditures was also seen.

However, increases to the general fund include a \$725,459 increase for the police department for vehi-

cle replacements and wage increases. The fire department also saw an increase worth \$546,774 for the replacement of a rescue unit and the purchase of a water rescue boat. These funds also represent the money the city will pay to both departments as a result of pension investment shortfalls, which have struggled because of the sluggish stock market.

Commission will hold a public hearing to adopt the tentative budget and a

6.4750 millage on Sept. 8, followed by a final budget and millage hearing on Sept. 22.

According to Smith, one of the largest contributing factors to the recent \$1.65 million budget overage is the economy and lack of revenues based on lower interest rates.

With the economic downturn, the city's revenues are not increasing at the same rate it had in previous years. In the past, \$800,000 in interest earning was seen. That

number has sunk to approximately \$200,000.

Also contributing to the budget woes is personnel-related costs, including significant increases in health insurance, raises and additions to staff. Public safety departments led the way in new hires, fulfilling the need for heightened security due to the war on terrorism.

Other factors that have attributed to the budget include the effects of 9-11 on

general liability and property insurance, which increased by 42.6 percent

this year. It is unknown what rates for the 2003-2004 fiscal year will be.

While telemarketers contacted 18 million Americans each day in 1990, today they may make as many as 104 million calls. The increase in calls has led to a corresponding increase in consumer frustration.

"The Commission heard the American consumer and responded," Snowden said. "The new FCC rules will give the consumers the tools they need in deciding whether or not they want to receive marketing calls and from what sources."

The FCC's broad authority extends to all commercial telemarketers, including those making in-state or state-to-state calls. Wireless telephone numbers may also be placed on the national do-not-call registry, and there is no fee for consumers to register their numbers in the registry, which will be maintained by fees charged to telemarketers. A consumer can elect to receive calls from certain companies even if his or her residential phone number is in the national do-not-call registry. "It's all about consumer choice," Snowden said. "The FCC's action has given consumers back their telephones, their privacy, and their choice."

There are exceptions to the prohibition of the national do-not-call registry,

she said. "They've told me they won't go out to eat anywhere now."

According to Seeber, unlike Denny's employees, most restaurant personnel are happy to comply with the new regulations.

In fact, Darden Restaurants, the largest casual dining chain in the world, which owns restaurants such as Red Lobster, Olive Garden, Smokey Bones BBQ and Bahama Breeze, began the ban on Jan. 7 when the law was signed.

"We are abiding by the letter and spirit of the amendment," said Mike Bernstein, director of media and communications for Darden Restaurants. "Our concern has always been that there is a level playing field. The way the legislature is being enforced, we are satisfied that it is equal."

The dangers of secondhand smoke

- Secondhand smoke is a human carcinogen.

ing from \$250 to \$2,000 for proprietors and \$100 to \$500 for individuals and patrons will be enforced.

however. If a seller has an established business relationship with a consumer, through a former purchase or financial transaction, for example, the seller can contact the consumer for a period of 18 months after the transaction. During this period, a consumer can ask to be added to the company's do-not-call list when the seller calls, and the calls must stop. Tax-exempt nonprofit organizations, which may include charitable, religious, and political organizations, are also exempt.

Violators of the new rules can face stiff penalties. "The effectiveness of the national do-not-call registry will

depend in some measure on enforcement, and we already have an excellent record of enforcing our 1992 rules," Snowden pointed out.

In January of this year, the FCC's Enforcement Bureau issued thirteen citations for violations of the TCPA and corresponding FCC rules. While these citations are warnings that involve no monetary damages, a company that continues to violate the rules after receiving a citation can receive a fine in the form of a Notice of Apparent Liability, which can be up to \$11,000 per violation. "Nearly \$7 million in forfeitures were proposed or

issued since December 1999," Snowden said. "And we expect to continue to be aggressive in enforcing the new rules."

American Heart Association introduces new course

The American Heart Association has introduced Heartsaver First Aid, a new course designed to train lay rescuers in the workplace to recognize and treat medical emergencies and injuries until emergency medical services (EMS) personnel arrive.

The course offers modules in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) and the use of automated external defibrillators (AEDs), in addition to traditional first aid procedures. AEDs are medical devices that use an electric shock to stop the life-threatening abnormal heart rhythm that causes most cardiac arrests.

Heartsaver First Aid targets workplace training, particularly in loca-

tions required to meet government-mandated training. Course materials were designed to satisfy Occupational Safety and Health Administration (OSHA) guidelines for first aid training targeting general industry. The course also satisfies basic first aid training requirements for specific industries, such as construction, shipyards and diving.

Heartsaver First Aid is also available to people who are not required to take a course, but who want to learn how to help people suffering injuries or other medical emergencies.

Hamill, McConnell to train in Colorado

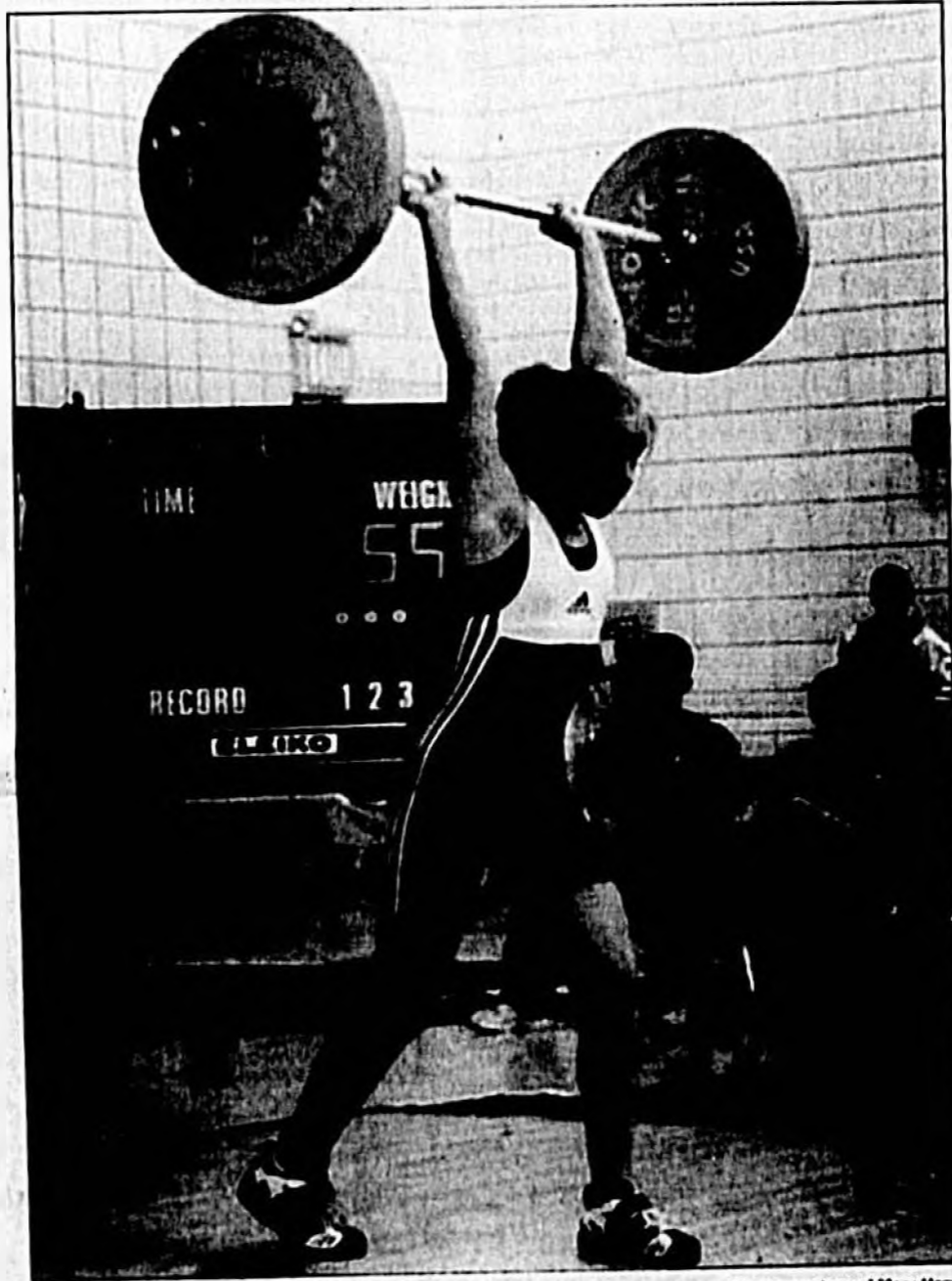

- Atlantic Sun all-tournament team

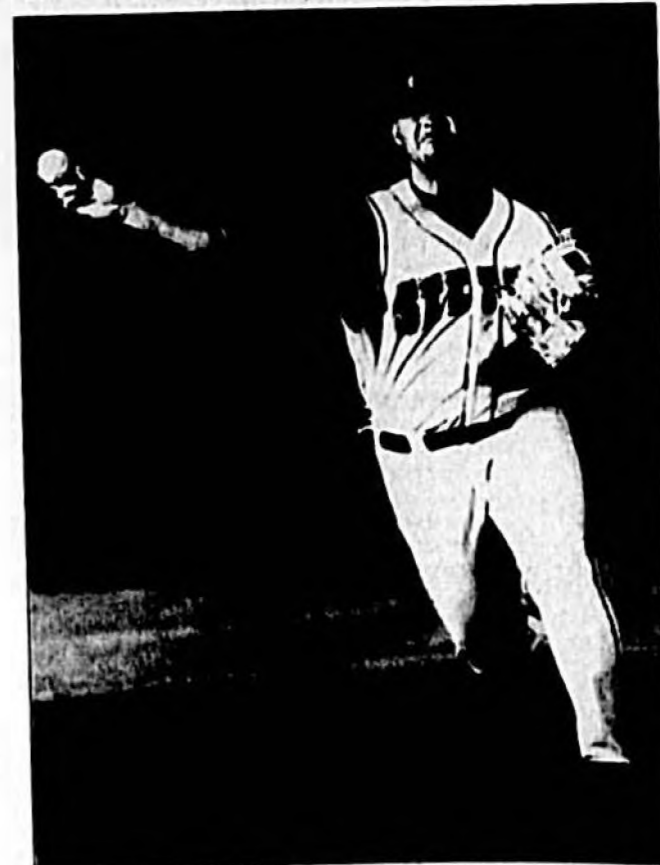

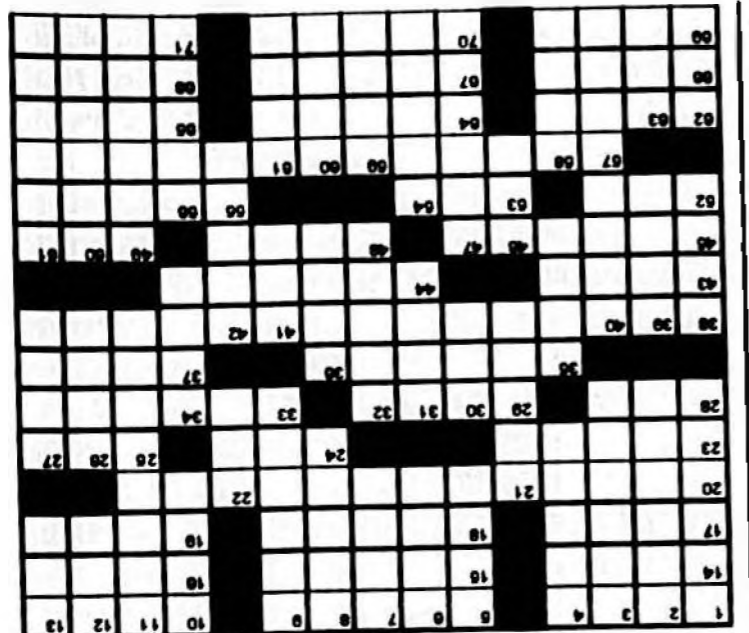

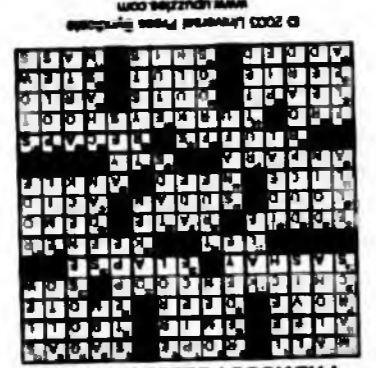
