Program To Protect FBI Files Proposed

Prompt Action Sought

LONDON # - A special com nittee of the American Bar Assn today assalled recent Supreme Court decision pertaining to comunism and called for prompt ongressional action "to overcome their effect."

The committee, headed by ex-Sen. Herbert R. O'Conor of Maryland, proposed a legislative program to protect the confidential files of the FBI and tighten up the Smith anti-subversive act. "It is traditional and right that our courts are realous in protect ing individual rights," the O'Conor report said.

"It is equally necessary that the executive and legislative branches take effective action to gird our country in defense against commeinist infiltration and aggression. "If the courts lean too far back-

New Radio Tower At County Jail **Nears Completion**

The radio tower under construction at the Seminole County Jail is nearing completion with only ten more feet to add to the steel structure.

The tower, 150 feet tall, will al. so have an antenna measuring about 10 feet.

Already new radio equipment is arriving daily to be installed in offices at the Seminole County jail, Sheriff J L. Hobby stated.

"We expect that the new radia system will be in full operation rithin about 10 days," the Sheriff said this morning.

Yesterday, Sheriffs Department deputies were familiarizing themseives with the new "Packmaster pormbie transmissies and receivers which will be used for deputy-to-car and deputy to stalion contact.

The transmitter is expected to arrive immediately along with 10 mobile units to be placed in deputies cars and in patrol cars of outlying communities as well as that of the constable.

Portable units, costing \$432 each. will be paid for by the constable and the communities us. ing them.



In some ways municipal traffic congestion Is like cancer-if you catch it early enough, It can be cured. But if and when it reaches the malignant stage, abuot the best yuo can do is wage a losing battle, fighting first in one spot, then in another, with whatever tools are available.

In many parts of the nation, traffic malignancy is an accepted fact. It cats away at the community, bringing death, in ery and property loss to countless citizens, and causing the slow strangulation of downtown commercial interests.

In Florida today, the traffic situation is entering a critical phase. Those who are amateurs at traffic problems believe they know what is best and try to lead communi_ ties in a topsy_turvey sort of program, try_ ing one thing and then another, to aleviate the situation. «

If we so choose, we can simply sit back and watch our city streets become chaotic snarls of parked cars, stalled traffic and harassed pedestrians. We can watch while our thoroughfares become mazes of frugtration, and, as often as not, death traps.

However, if we have a single ounce of common sense, we won't simply sit back and watch. We'll get out of our easy chairs, give the traffic problem our most serious consideration, and, finally, we'll do something about it.
