An estimated 70 to 90 per cent of Seminale's black students boycotted Seminole County schools today in protest of a school board decision to phase out Rosenwald Elementary School in



## Senate Groups Nearing Okay Of Energy Plans

WASHINGTON (AP) - While attention is focused on President Ford's battle with Congress over oil tariffs, two Senate committees are nearing approval of their own substitutes for the President's energy program. As Congress awaits Ford's promised veto of a bill suspending the President's \$3-a barrel oil tariff, the Senate Interior Committee plans to approve early this week a gasoline rationing bill. Meanwhile, the Senate Commerce Committee is considering two other bills that are expected to be a part of the energy program being drawn up by a Senate House Democratic task force.

### Recruit Setback 'Small

WASHINGTON (AP) - The Pentagon's manpower chief says there is "very small risk" that recruiting for the all-volunteer force will be set back by a new order increasing minimum service enlistments from two to three years, "We're confident we can continue to make our strength and keep our quality up." Asst. Secretary of Defense William K. Brehm said. Pentagon sources said Defense Secretary James R. Schlesinger overrode service objections and ordered the enlistment changes into effect by the new fiscal year in July.

### **Giant Plant Forecast**

BROOKSVILLE, Fla. (AP) - While a Florida Power & Light Co. official jokingly refers to the project as "tentatively under future consideration," he concedes that a 19,600-acre DeSoto County, site owned by FP&L could become the state's largest nuclear power plant. For the record, FP&L says it is too early to discuss

specific plans under consideration. But a St. Petersburg Times report, quoting unnamed sources, said the company has planned a facility that would dwarf all existing power plants and divert 130 million gallons of fresh water from the Peace River every

"We have no firm, definite commitments," FP&L spokesman Anthony Bothwell said about the Times report. "We announced last August that we purchased the land and said it could sometime in the future be used as a

member of the Cuban Justice Movement, a group Nieves, 43, an outspoken proponent of exile coexistence with the government of Fidel Castro, was shot to death Friday outside Variety Children's Hospital by two gun-

men who escaped. Nieves, a former captain in the Castro army, wanted to return to Cuba and lead a political opposition he said Castro was prepared to accept. But Nieves' ideas were not popular and brought him much criticism from Miami's large Cuban refugee colony.

## U.S. Must

Stand Fast

Secretary of State Henry Kissinger may need seven league boots to negotiate another "step" toward peace in the Middle East.

Israel and Egypt both have much to gain by coming to terms on a further withdrawal of Israeli troops in the Sinai, but Mr. Kissinger will have difficulty keeping the issue narrowed to that degree. The recent swing through the Arab world by Soviet Foreign Minister Andrei Gromyko has tended to revive in both the Israelis and the Egyptians the fear that there is more wishful thinking than practicality in Mr. Kissinger's effort to work for a Mid-east settlement a bite at a time.

Kissinger approach reached a crescendo with the Secretary's arrival in Jerusalem. An opinion poll indicated that only a fourth of the Israeli population has faith in the idea that giving up more occupied ranch or oil well and having tons of money to territory in the Sinai - especially the strategic throw around. Yet in Britain, far down the road to socialism, Healey emphasized the need to provide incentives for increased private investment in nationalized industries to encourage greater productivity, new jobs and answers to energy shortages. "I believe we must get down to practical measures," he said. There seems to be a lesson berein.

## DON OAKLEY Lincoln Had Good Dentures A tardy but interesting afterthought on Lin-

coln's Birthday: Unlike George Washington, that other president whose birth we celebrate this month or did until Congress got into the act - Abraham Lincoln seems to have enjoyed good oral health and experienced a minimum of dental problems during his lifetime.

The fact that he grew up in regions where well and spring water contained an optimum amount of flourides may have had something to do with his sporting a healthy set of choppers.

Or so surmises Dr. Maynard K. Hine, a former president of the American Dental Assn. and former chancellor of Indiana-Purdue University. Everybody knows about the problems Washington had with his teeth, and his subsequent dentures. But little that is toothsome is mentioned in the extensive literature on Lincoln. Even though Lincoln lived when dentistry was developing into a profession, comments about the President and dentistry are nearly nonexistent. In fact, more is known about his beard than about his teeth.

In a report appearing in the February edition of Dental Abstracts (not extracts) published by the ADA, Dr. Hine writes that he could find only four documented visits by Lincoln to a dentist. Of the 199 photographs of Lincoln (30 beardless and 80 with a beard), none shows his teeth. Of course, time exposures were required for photographs back then and it was customary to pose in a formal manner.

### Syria Offers Peace Plan

BEIRUT, Lebanon (AP) - The president of Syria, in his strongest statement yet on the possibility of an agreement with Israel, says his government will sign a peace treaty if the Jewish state gives up all the territory it captured in the 1967 war and agrees to a Palestinian state made up of the West Bank of the Jordan River and the Gaza Strip. "This is not propaganda. We mean it - seriously and explicitly," President Hafez Assad told Newsweek magazine. Israel, however, has repeatedly rejected

ADDIS ABABA, Ethiopia (AP) - Reliable sources say the United States plans to close its military communications station outside besieged Asmara in June, and they also expect the U.S. Consulate in the city to be closed. There was no official comment on the consulate.



The Randleman, N. C., Dodge driver was referring to his sixlap victory in Sunday's National Association for Stock Car Auto Pacing's Richmond 500 Grand National, an event that rapidly is becoming a "Richard Petty Invitational." It was the ninth time Petty has won in his last 10 races over the

.542-mile Fairgrounds Raceway track and the 13th triumph here of his career, in which he now has won 165 events. Petty had started from the pole position after a record speed of 93.340 miles per hour in Friday's qualifying, and he held the lead until the 154th lap, when Daytona 500 winner Benny Parsons of Ellerbe, N. 
His first had been a nearmiss with Dick Brooks in which Brooks spun but Petty didn't. The second, said Petty, "wasn't


