



attraction of industry to Sanford creating jobs. When this is considered it should also be recalled that the commission can now look at every area in Sanford for location of industries which will bring in payrolls with employment for Sanford residents and consequent tax receipts as they become happy and secure in Sanford-based employment.

Another situation which, we are sure, SIC is not only well aware of is the matter of the operation and improvement of the Sanford Airport.

It is extremely fortunate that we have such a knowledgeable and competent airport manager as J. S. "Red" Cleveland whose intimate knowledge of the airport facilities dates back to the days when he was executive for the Navy and is the only one who has endured the difficult conversion to civilian needs

Thus any step which would introduce the possibility of a confusion or an over-lapping of authority between the functions of Messrs, Kelley and Cleveland should be avoided.

Sanford Favored ·In Water Decision

Decision in favor of the City of Sanford has been returned by the Florida Fourth Court of Appeal in a suit brought by the Leffler Company seeking to restrain the city from laying water mains across its property on Celery Avenue. City Attorney William C. Hutchison Jr. said the decision was returned yesterday afternoon by the Appellate Court at Vero Beach.

The State of Florida and the City of Sanford had entered into an agreement whereby the State would deed 6.47 acres of land on Celery Avenue to the City for water service at the Central Florida Experiment Station far-

ther out on Celery Avenue, near Cameron Avenue, Leffler Company filed suit in 18th Circuit Court property adjacent to Celery Avenue with water mains. Circuit Judge William Akridge returned a verdict in favor of the City. The Leffier Company carried the case on appeal to the higher court, which now has confirmed Akridge's decision.
