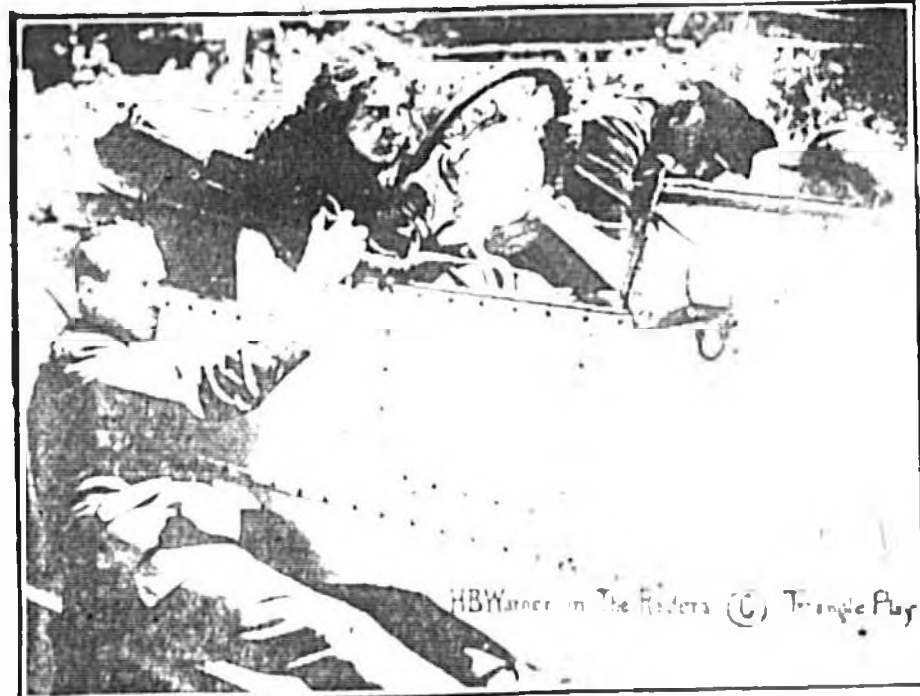

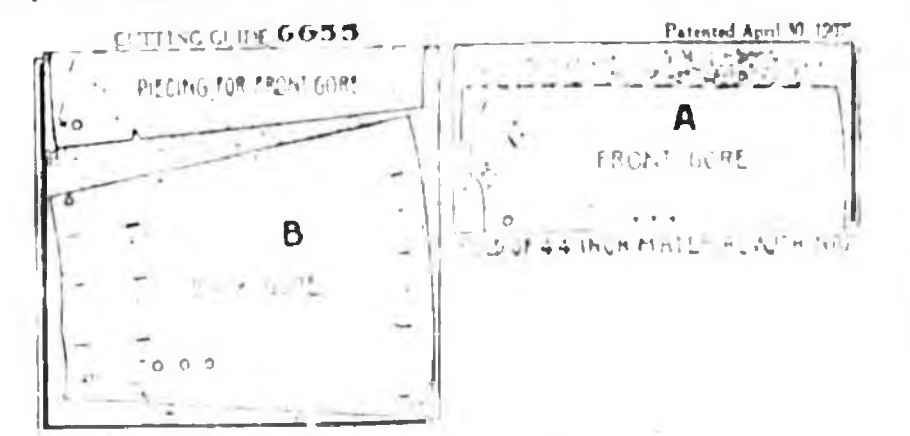
Today's dressmaking lesson deals with the cutting of the skirt. Study the cutting guide carefully to avoid mistakes, and be careful to see that the parts of the pattern are laid on the fold or on a lengthwise thread of the material, as directed.

The back gore and pleating for the front gore are laid on an open width of material, each section being placed over a lengthwise thread. The satin is doubled, of course.

Take the remainder of the goods and fold it in half. Place the front gore directly on the lengthwise fold, as illustrated in the cutting guide and all will be ready for work.

If the skirt is desired shorter than the length provided, cut off the lower edges of gores or turn a hem the desired amount.

The draped sides are trimmed with buttons of self-material, the two buttons appearing again on the deep cuffs of the lace sleeves and on the points of the flare collar.

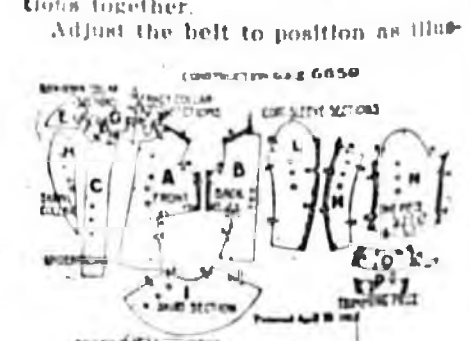

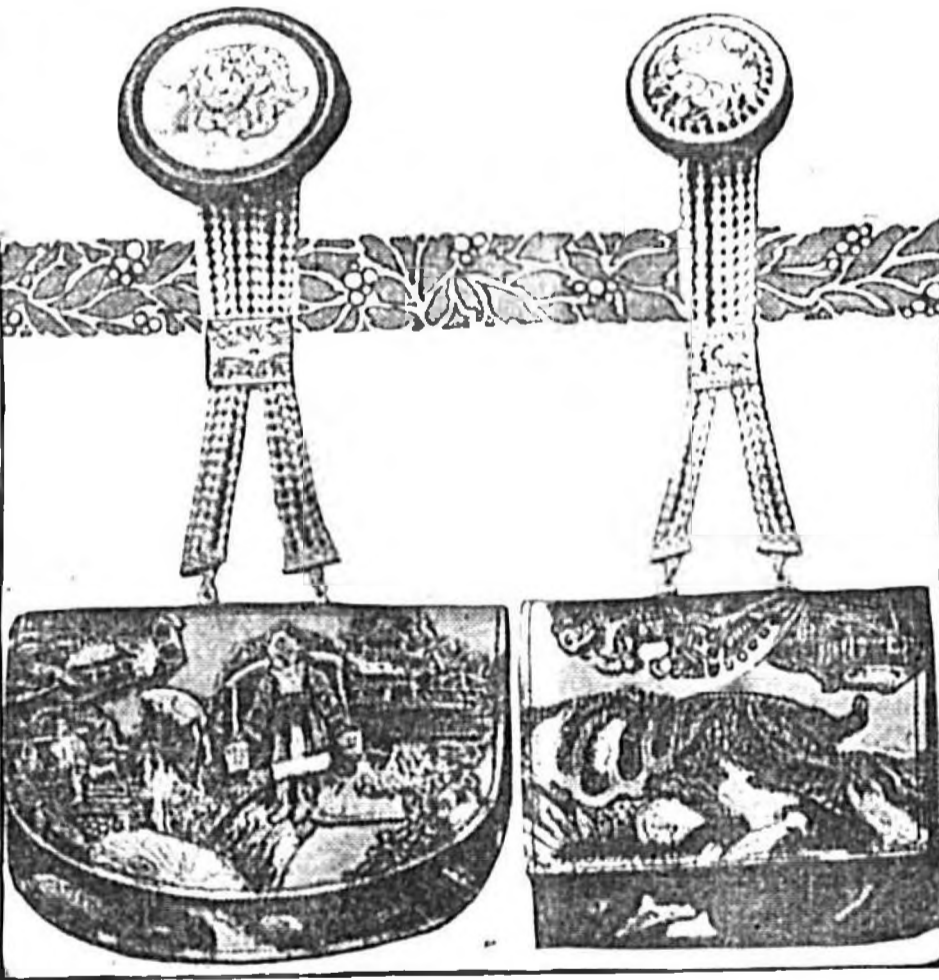
