## Canal Report Won't Be Made Until Roosevelt Orders It

Coll Says St. Petersburg, Favoring Project, Is Willing To Rely On Engineers' Survey

Editorial Note: This is the second in a series of four articles on the proposed Central American canal from the *Sanford Herald*. The third article is to be published soon with details on the canal's route particularly.

ST. PETERSBURG, July 13.—Sharp issues have developed in the program of water supply for the proposed Florida cross-state canal. One point of the project have had protest meetings, arguing that the canal may lower water levels and interfere with the underground water supply which feeds the many fresh lakes and streams. Many also argue that there may be danger that the new artificial water system will allow of tidal waters from the Atlantic Ocean and the Gulf of Mexico, these brackish waters in turn flowing into the underground streams and crevices flows which are at present free springs of the lakes and wells.

This water supply problem was a heretofore unheralded item in the reference surveys, research work and reports on the cross-state canal according to the record. The project has been initiated as a national issue in the rivers and harbors bills passed by Congress, approved by the President July 9, 1933, reading "The Secretary of War

to make preliminary examinations and surveys to be made at the following locations: 1. Waterway across northern Florida to connect

the Atlantic inter-coastal waterway with the proposed gulf intra-coastal waterway by the most practicable route.
