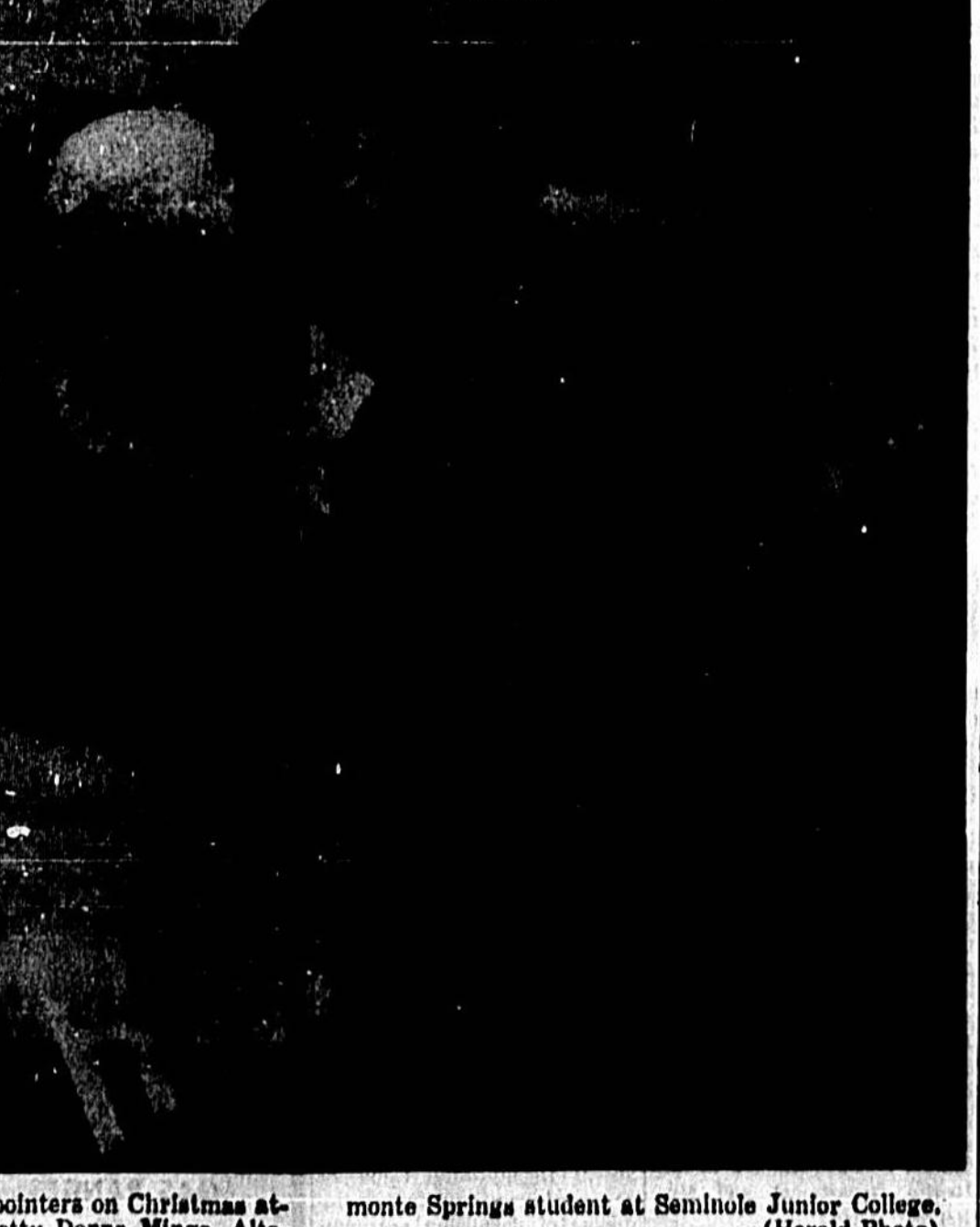

WASHINGTON — The President tonight as well as heeding down a veto barrel as pleading in his present way with business and labor to help back on the inflation of prices and wages.

Major steel producers and some leading union leaders are turning deaf ears to his call on them for more "economic responsibility."

Four more large steel manufacturers raised prices on December 15—making a total of ten companies who have increased the cost of steel products to consumers in recent months.

More than half a dozen power utilities will press for increases in next year's wage contracts equal to the approximately 7 percent rise in wages and fringe benefits last year.

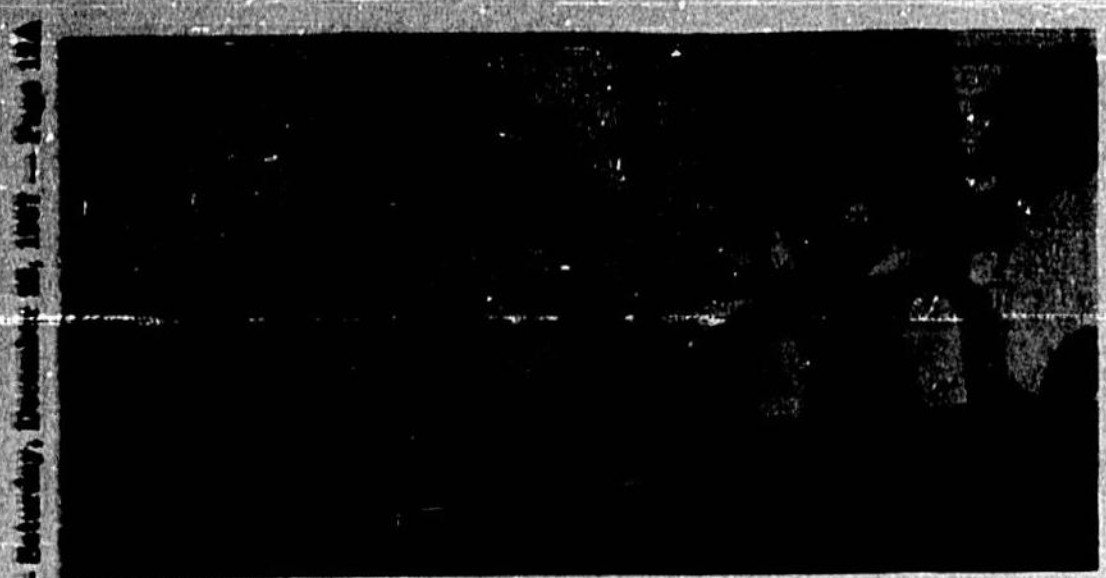

Three Magi 'Wise Men From East'

In New Testament history according to Matthew, the narrative of the three Magi who followed a star to Bethlehem in search of the infant Jesus dominates them simply as three "wise men from the east". It was not until the 2nd century, according to the Book of Knowledge, that they were known as "Kings" in a charming legend that traces its origin to that time. The Magi originally represented the priestly caste of the ancient Persian Zoroastrian religion. As this religion moved westward, it came into contact with Babylonian beliefs and practices and thus derived a strong interest in astrology, demonology and magic.

By the time it reached the Greco-Roman world, Zoroastrianism was almost identical with astrology and magic in the popular view. This explains the use of the term "wise men" in the New Testament account. The "Magus" is credited with having brought the infant Jesus to the house of the Wise Men in Constantinople. From there they were removed to Milan and afterwards to Cologne. This explains why the Wise Men were often referred to as the Three Kings of Cologne. Their crowns are exhibited in the Chapel of the Three Kings in Cologne Cathedral, which is supposed to contain their relics.

Underground Hotel Space

SYDNEY (AP) — A 15-bed room hotel, 20 feet underground, is planned for Cedar Pedy, the coal-mining center in Central Australia.

The hotel will have a reception desk, dining room and bar, and will be air-conditioned. The walls are planned in their natural state—white and red sandstone.

Cedar Pedy, with an average summer temperature between 85 and 110 degrees, is so hot that most of the people live underground. The Roman Catholic Church of St. Peter and St. Paul is built into a hillside.

Still Practicing Untouchability

JULINDER, India (AP) — A government committee reported untouchability is still widely practiced, although banned by law.

The committee said a nationwide tour showed that untouchables were not allowed to ride bicycles in Madras, to walk with shoes on in Mysore or to take water from municipal taps in New Delhi.

In Bhatam, a city in Madhya Pradesh State, the committee said untouchables are not even allowed to turn up the tips of their mustaches.

Trappists

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — The first Trappist monastery in the United States was the Abbey of Gethsemani, founded near Bardonia, Ky., in 1861.
