# State Fish Commission Seeks Law For River

JACKSONVILLE, Fla. (UPI) - The Game and Fresh Water Fish Commission said Friday it wants a bigger voice in decisions affecting freshwater fisheries after last summer's massive fish kills on

the St. Johns River. The commission's fisheries division published a pessimistic report on the state and future of freshwater fisheries, noting that between June 12 and July 14 some 15 million fish died in the mid reaches of the St. Johns River:

The commission blamed the fish kills on poor development of the river marshes, which control floodwaters and help purify polluted water, treated sewage, chemical wastes and aquatic weeds. "We are risking 75,000 freshwater, fishing-related jobs involving over \$300 million in annual wages and \$278 million a year generated by angling tourists,"

the commission report warned. The report called for passage of Florida Fish and Wildlife Coordination Act, which would give the commission input in the decisions of federal and state agencies regarding such things as water quality, environmental protection and

# Maxiel Is Closed; You All Must Go

KEY WEST, Fla. (UPI) - "Good morning." shouted the Cuban soldier over a bullhorn to the small boats rocking in Mariel harbor. "Mariel is closed-you all must go." Thus ended Friday the five-month-long sealift that brought more than 125,000 Cuban refugees - many of them direct from Cuban prisons - to the United States. "Everybody in the harbor was crying," said Robert Lopez.

He was a crew member on one of the boats sent chugging back to the United States without the relatives his three shipmates had sought to bring to American shores. "It was very sad," said Lopez, a former Tampa City Council candidate and manager in the city's parks and recreation department - who said he was taken to the Cuban port of

Mariel unwillingly by three friends who told him they were going fishing. Some captains said Cuban soldiers threatened them to clear the harbor.

President Carter, in a speech Friday night, said he was "thankful" the sealift was over. Carter said Cuban officials had promised to take the names of Cubans left behind who have families in America so their

departure could later be arranged in "a legal way." There was no mention of the event on Cuban Radio newscasts or in the official government newspaper Granma Friday. Coast Guard and immigration officials said between 50 and 65 boats from Mariel had arrived in Key West by late Friday and more were en route in the Florida Straits. All the boats, Coast Guard officials said, had apparently reached Cuba by running the blockade imposed May 15 by Carter in an attempt to halt the influx of Cubans.



**Embargo Opponents Jubilant** WASHINGTON (UPI) - Opponents of the U.S. grain embargo against the Soviet Union are jubilant, but it will take a few more battles before their victory in the Senate becomes law. After three close roll-call votes, the Senate Friday adopted by voice vote an amendment to the Commerce Department funding bill barring the use of money to enforce the 9-month-old grain embargo. Several previous attempts in the House to end the embargo failed by large margins.

Iran Asset Cases To Begin NEW YORK (UPI) - The Carter administration has lost a plea in federal court to delay the 96 cases involving multi-billion dollar claims by American banks and corporation on Iranian assets until the hostage crisis is over. District Judge Kevin Duffy also confirmed the orders of attachment obtained by the banks and companies against Iranian assets to prevent their removal. Iran argued it was immune from such attachments by international agreement.







# State Taps Investment Head

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (UPI) - Gov. Bob Graham and the two Cabinet members running the \$6 billion state investment fund have lured a New York financial expert out of retirement to be their executive director. The state Board of Administration, consisting of Graham, Treasurer Bill Gunter (and Comptroller Gerald Lewis, decided this past week to hire Leo C. Bailey, currently living in Palm Harbor, as state investments director at a salary of \$75,000 a year.

Bailey, 56, becomes the highest paid official in state government, exceeding Graham by \$20,000, although he won't get the benefits, including free housing, food and transportation.

### **Growers Protest Petitions**

GAINESVILLE, Fla. (UPI) - If granted, petitions by Israel and Honduras to lift import duties on green peppers, watermelons and celery could cost Florida growers \$20 million a year, according to the Florida Farm Bureau Federation.

A FFBF spokesman said the petitions could not come at a worse time for Florida growers, who already have been hit by double-digit inflation, production cost in-creases, falling prices for their crops and erratic weather, including freezes and droughts.

"It's inconceivable that our federal government


# Mortgage Rule May Free Bank Funds

Loan Bank Board has issued a new rule aimed at freeing up some bank funds. It allows lenders to issue "Renegotiable

Rate Mortgages" (RRM's). The rule permits federal savings and loan associations to raise the interest periodically on an RRM as market conditions dictate. At the end of each three-to-five-year period, the bank could ask the mortgage-holder to pay higher interest rates for the next three-to-five years of the loan. The holder could agree, or find another bank willing to issue a loan for the remainder of

the mortgage at a better rate. "It's an idea that may well encourage lenders to make more mortgage money available," says Ellen Broadman, a lawyer for Consumers Union, publisher of Consumer Reports magazine. "But weaknesses in the rule may eventually place some consumers in a tight, perhaps impossible, squeeze." The RRM rule places a ceiling on the total rate increase allowable over the life of a mortgage — 5 percent. And it does limit annual increases to ½ percent. But it doesn't require

banks to tell consumers how to translate the percentages into





The new Bank Board rule doesn't require the lender to offer ne borrower a fixed-rate mortgage alternative. A fixed-rate oan, while it may initially be sold at higher interest than an RRM, will nevertheless stay at the same level for the life of the nortgage: That might be of tremendous importance to many

My normal way of addressing you is not to shock you, or even lecture you. I am a gentle soul who, under most circumstances, would rather switch than fight. A black eye is not my trademark. I prefer speaking softly to shouting and

wielding a big stick. But there is a time to be winsome and a time to shock. And even nice guys have a right - even perhaps a duty - to step out of character once in awhile. I am stepping out of character

I remember reading a book once about an alcoholic priest called. "Shepherds in the Mist." In looking back on the people attack." who helped him most in his recovery from alcoholism, the priest recalls on person in particular. "He did not counsel or nuclear war. A woman of my acquaintance said to me criticize me." says the priest. "He just stood by me - a silent, recently, "I am not afraid of a nuclear war. My children are all affectionate reminder of better things."

More good in the world is done, I think, by being a "silent, affectionate reminder of better things" than by counseling or criticizing. Or by shocking people with the possible consequences of their actions.
