COUNTY TAX BOOKS CLOSE MARCH 31st.

Under the new law enacted by the legislature the following interest and penalties begin on April 1, 1945 on all unpaid taxes assessed for the year 1911.

On Real Estate:

A penalty of 3% on April 1st with interest at 18% per annum from April 1st plus cost of advertising and tax sale, where not paid before tax sale.

On Personal Property:

Interest at 12% per annum from April 1st plus cost of advertising and tax war-

On Intangible Personal Property:

10% penalty added on April lat plus 24% per annum, cost of advertising and Sheriff's costs on executions.

Under this new law all unpaid taxes for the year 1944 become delinquent on April 1, 1945 and the penalties and interest become a part of the taxes which are a first lien on the property assessed, except that Intangible Personal Property taxes are a lien on all property owned by the tax-payer,

Property owners who have not done so are urged to pay their, taxes on or before March 31, 1945 and avoid penalties and costs.

European Confederation

"Why don't they get together?" Americans often usk this question when they think of European quarrels and wars. Now a plan for getting together is proposed by Richard N. Coudenhove-Kalergi, an Austrian count and writer on public affairs who is teaching at New York University

A confederation of all European states except Germany is the plan. Germany is to be admitted later when sne gives evidence of having reformed. Special emphasis is taid on a bill of rights to protect all Europeans against discrimination on account of race, class or religion, and to guarantee freedom of speech. An additional bill of social rights aims at basic social and economic reforms through the gradual elimination of trade barriers, and the establishment of a common currency and transportation system.

This is to be a conferedation, not a merger. Within the foregoing limits member states can govern themselves as they please. It is easy to call it an impracticable dream, and perhaps it is. But the Continental system of separate states has worked so badly that far-sighted Europeans ought to give serious thought to the Coudenhove-Kalergi
