Leo Salvall, 82, still refers to drinking fountains as scuttlebutts.

"Funny, you would think I would have gotten something like that out of me long ago," he said. "But there are things you don't forget. Things that happened years and years ago but they're with you as if it were just yesterday."

A Chief Aviation Pilot , Salvail was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross, Air Medal and two Bronze Stars for his Naval service. He was one of the few seaplane patrol bomber crew survivors from the initial Japanese raids on the Philippines after the Dec. 7, 1941 attack at Pearl Harbor.

Nearly 57 years after his introduction to the fury of war, Salvail recalls certain moments as if they happened moments ago. His PBY-4 was one of a

Mayfair dispute closer to settlement

SANFORD - The city is one step closer to settling a dispute with Seminole Chib Inc. which owns and manages the Mayfair golf course.

City Commissioners on Monday said they favored settling the matter with owner John "Jack Dantels." The disagreement stemmed over money the city said Daniels owed in rental payments. A letter sent to Daniels by the city attorney in February said he owed \$255,346 in back rent. Daniels was seeking credit for improvements made to the golf course. The city also disputed whether the "improvements" could be considered capital improvements. Seminole Club has offered \$66,451 plus a carryover credit beginning in lease year 1996-

97 as a stipulation settlement to the city.

Mayor Larry Dale said he wanted to clarify that there would be no cary forward credits from this point. He advised settling on an agreed upon dollar amount to avoid taking the case to court.

"If we get fied up in a lawsuit, this could take a couple of years," Dale said. "I would lean towards settlement.

Dale and commissionsers Kerry Lyons and Whitey Eckstein suggested the city settle for no less than \$100,000.

The first such search didn't last long - five Japanese Zeroes suddenly were diving and firing away at his plane, and Salvail was trying to avoid a fatal hit. His twin-engine plane was riddled with enemy fire.

"Both our engines had been shot up badly," Salvatl said. "They were backfiring and continued to lose power. Our airspeed was reduced to 118 knots. The radio antenna had been shot off and dragging behind the aircraft. The gasoline was pouring out."

Salvail said that another of the Zero pilots was in the process of making a firing run but he was able to fly under some high tension power lines. "We missed that steel tower by a scant wing span," he said.

In a few more minutes, Salvail was able to land his sea plane on Lake Taal. The crewhad been instructed not to inflate its lifejackets and upon hitting the water, each man dove below the surface and swam. away from the craft before emerging to the surface.

"Later, I swam back to the plane and saw the damage," Salvail said. "I saw lines of bullet holes, 89 in all, in the form of an "X" which began at the trailing edge of each wing above the waist hatch and extended across to each engine on the opposite side."

In another case, at least 98 Disney workers were lured to bogus medical clinics in an insurance fraud ring that stretched from Orlando to Miami. Using the workers' medical insurance information, the ringleaders submitted at least \$850,000 of fake insurance claims.

Judge reprimanded

SANFORD - The Florida Supreme Court publicly reprimanded Circuit Judge Leonard Wood on Monday in Tallahassee. Citing six examples, the high court reprimanded Wood, 61, for rude comments he made to lawyers and residents involved in civil cases before him.

Wood had not expected to be required to appear in person for the reprimand. He had agreed to the disciplinary action this summer in an agreement with the Judicial Qualifications Commission, the state board that regulates judges.

The court considered Wood's behavior to be serious and cumulative. It is reported Wood regrets his conduct in the cases cited by the court and has already begun

Philippines aboard the Marichal Joffre, a French passenger liner. The ship arrived at the Netherlands East Indies on New Year's Eve, 1941.

World War II in the Pacific had only begun, however, and it would be four more years before Leo Salvail would return to the States and marry his school sweetheart, Jeanne d'Arc. They have been married 52 years and have lived in Sanford since 1951. Salvall's a wiry 5-foot-7 1/2 and weighs 145 pounds, just as he did when he joined the Navy in 1934. He's active in veteran's affairs and disappointed that political leaders seem to have forgotten those who served in World War II. Early this year, Salvait submitted a pilot's report on his war missions to a veterans publication.

The paper is called, "The Scuttlebutt," Salvail said. "Good name, don't you think?"



Aglonema belongs to the Araceae plant family which includes philodendron, caladium, anthurium, and spathiphyllum. The inflorescence of these plants is a densely flowered simple spadix surrounded by a bract (the spathe) which is often showy and is considered to be the flower.

Aglaonema species originate in the humid, heavily shaded tropical forests of southern Asia, mainly Indonesia, Malaysta, Thailand, the Philippines and Sri Lanka. Most of the varicties used in cultivation are the results of plant explorations but a few man-made hybrids are now available for production. Recent discoveries of Aglaonema with unique foliar variegation patterns and petiole coloration are being used to produce new and exciting varieties.

Plant offers unique foliage patterns

The plant: Aglaonema is an evergreen. erect, compact plant, about 1 to 3 fect high. with short stems that bear beautiful variegated leaves. The strikingly marked leaves are held by petioles shorter than the blades and arranged in groups at the end of the stems. The "flower" is formed by a group of small flowers borne on a spadix surrounded by a bract which are small in proportion to the size of the foliage. Flowers of the Aglaonemas are white like small Calla or Spathiphyllum flowers but rarely form under normal conditions. Some species develop colored fruits which look like berries

Culture: Plants will tolerate low light conditions and should not be exposed to direct sunlight. Temperatures between 60 to 70 degrees F. are adequate for this plant, but it will grow more vigorously at higher temperatures. Any slight chill may cause leaf discoloration. A mixture of peat and perlite are recommended to grow this plant, the pots should not be too large, as these plants grow best when their roots are confined in small containers. Watering should be done regularly to maintain the polling mixture motst. Only the surface should be allowed to dry out between watering periods. In the winter months the plants will require less water. If the roots stay too wet, the leaves will begin to wilt due to lack of oxygen around the roots. Use a weak solution of fertilizer when applying fertilizer with the watering. A yellowing of the lower leaves often indicates low levels of nitrogen.

Propagation: New plants can be produced at any time by splitting large clumps into smaller sections and potting them individually. Tip cuttings of 6 to 8 inches long with 3 or more leaves or stem segments 3 to 4 inches long, are used to propagate this plant. Repotting: March and April

are the best months of the year to repot your plants. Carefully remove the old compost from the fleshy roots and put a layer of pebbles in the bottom of the pot. Use a commercial potting mix with sphagnum moss, peal moss, and sand or perlite.

Evergreen is one of the species. of this plant that have leaves. without any markings or patterns. Another specie of



like Barry Bonds or Albert Belle? Of course not. And there are just as many Belles as McGwires.


The New York Yankees had a great year, one of the best in the history of the game.




