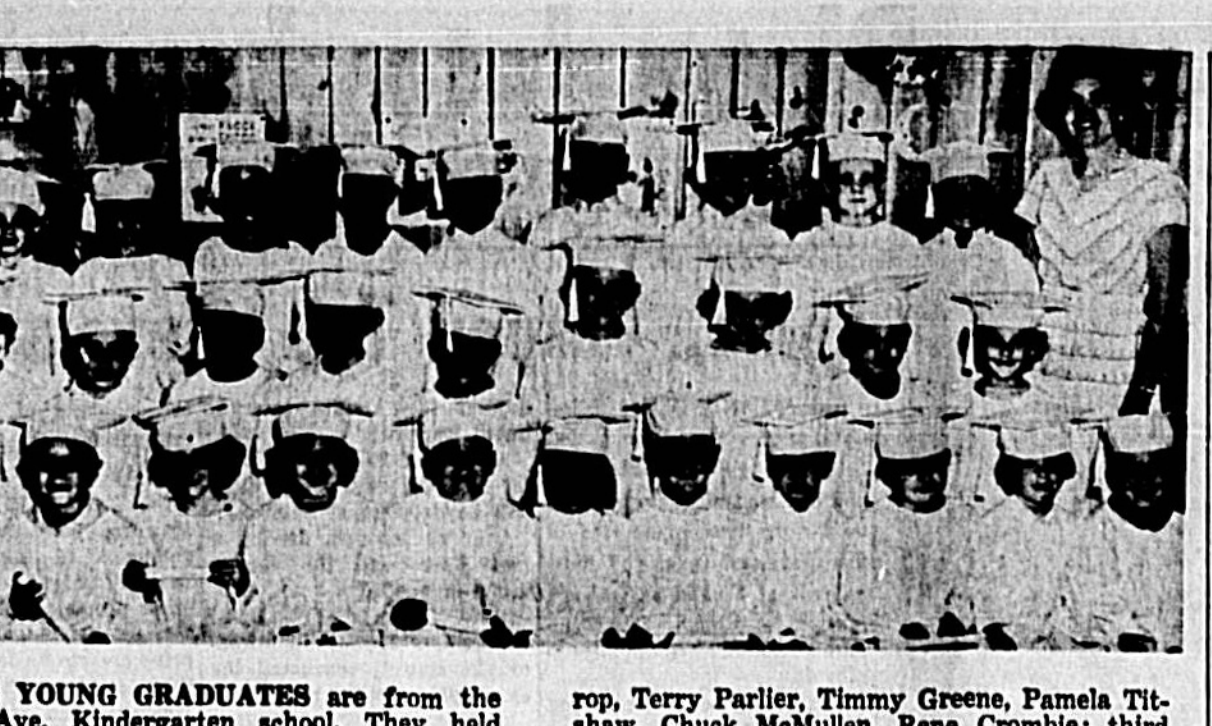

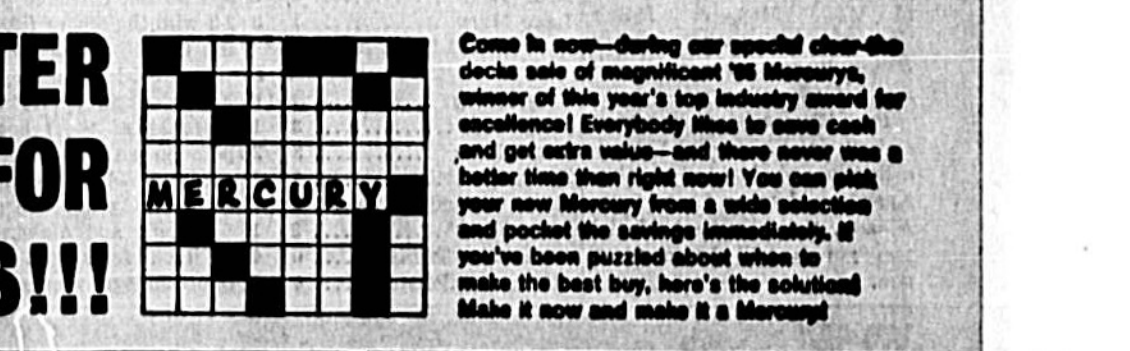

In Coats Mack Stadium, the Philadelphia Phillies have turned home plate into a launching pad for Allen "The Whip" Allen.

Cleveland whipped Minnesota 4-1, Baltimore topped Washington 5-1 and the Chicago White Sox triumphed Boston 4-3 in the only American League game scheduled.

The White Sox win and the Minnesota loss meant the Twins had to win four of five games over the Chicago Cubs.

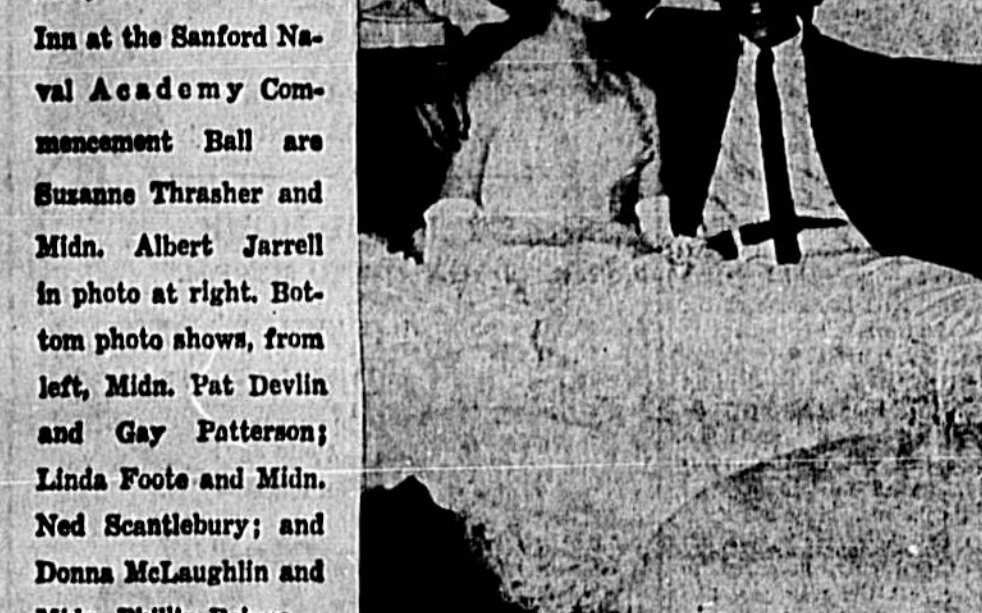

Sizeable Solution

"Nancy faces the same problem that confronts millions of other kids in high school and college. For men are poor at conversation. So you girls must learn the art of parting the dialogue and then speeding it up, or you will never rise high as 'date bait.'" Study this carefully; then read for the basket.

CASE W-417: Nancy P. aged 16, is a quiet high school junior.

"Dr. Crane," she began, "I'd like to be friends with some of the boys in my classes, but they don't talk much."

"Since I am shy myself, we may sit beside each other for the full class hour without saying a word."

"There is one boy that I like more than the others. He and I have seats next to each other in geometry class. For a while we've been talking, but we rarely say a word, so how can I ever expect him to ask me for a date?"

Glad, the average boy is not glib at small talk. So you could must realize at the outset that girls need to be adept at launching a conversation.

Now-Or-Never Situation

United Press International The Conservative party in the city of New York will be faced with a now-or-never situation this year in the election of a mayor. Democratic Mayor Robert F. Wagner will be opposed by Rep. John V. Lindsay, a liberal Republican now serving his fourth term in the House of Representatives. The Republican leaders of New York persuaded Lindsay to run. The formalities of his nomination are a mere routine. That puts it up to the New York Conservatives. The Conservative party in New York was organized to compel the Republican party in city and state to reverse the drift to the left in an effort to out-promise the Democrats in bids for votes. It is the Conservative purpose to resist the nomination of left wing Republicans to political office. When they are unable to prevent such a nomination, the Conservatives put up their own candidate to dilute the Republican vote that otherwise probably would be cast for the party's left nominee.

The upcoming nomination of Lindsay for mayor is precisely the kind of political maneuver that the Conservatives are pledged to prevent. Since they cannot prevent this nomination, it will be up to the Conservatives to enter their own candidate and thus obtain Lindsay's defeat. If the election should work out that way, the Conservatives would emerge in a very strong balance of power position in New York. They would demand and expect to get some authority in the selection of future Republican nominees for city and state police. And, of course, they would blackball Gov. Nelson A. Rockefeller. Should Lindsay be elected mayor despite Conservative opposition, the splinter organization might begin to disintegrate. As a Republican expert of New York City, Lindsay reasonably could expect to be promoted to governor. The governor's mansion in Albany is an ideal launching pad toward a presidential nomination. Lindsay will be 50 years old in 1972.

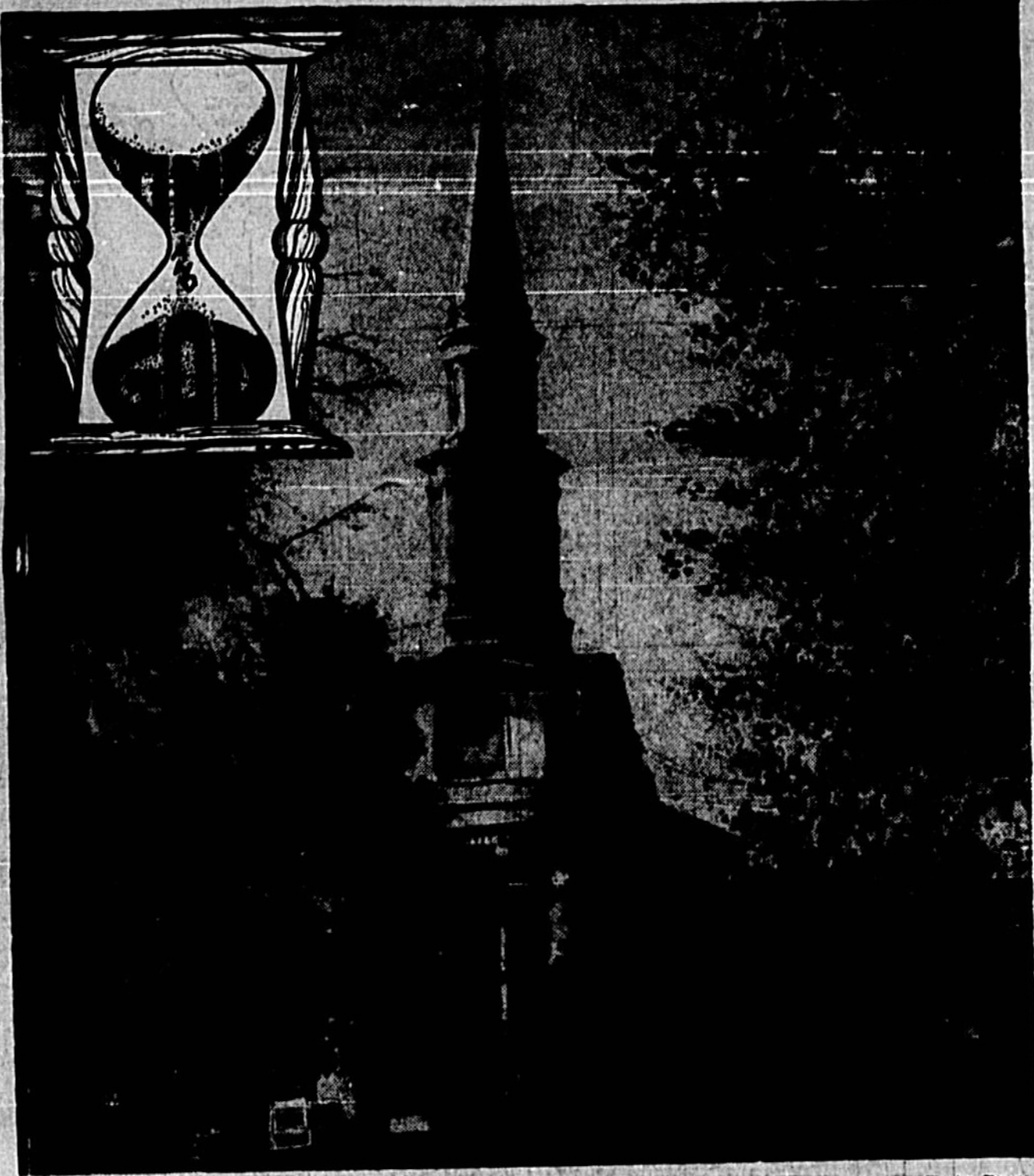
