#### Your Income Tax

If you are single and support in your home one or more persons closely related to you and over whom you exercise family control, you are the under the revenue net of 1926 to the same personal exemption allowed a married person, \$3,560. In addition, a taxpayer is entitled to a credit of \$100 for each person dependent-upon him for chief support, if such person is either under 16 years of age or inenpuble of

self-support because mentally or physically defective. Such dependent need not be a meniher of the taxpayer's house-For example, an unmarried son who supports in his home an aged mother is entitled to an exemption of 83,bou plus the \$400 credit for a dependent, 'a total of \$3,900. If from choice the mother lived in another city, the son, althought her chief support would be entitled only to the \$1,500 exemption, plus the \$100 credit. The mother not living with him, he is not considered the head of a family. An exemption as the head of a family can be claimed by

### New Yorker Tells Los Angeles About Florida Situation

JACKSONVILLE, Mar. 4.— William G. Marvin, of New York, Chairman of the Legal Advisory Committee of the Chamber of Commerce of the United States, in a recent address before the Los Angeles Chamber of Commerce told his hearers that the Florida "boom" had brought to this state nearly \$2,000,000,000 for invest-ment in the last nine months "or more than has been brought to California in the last ten years," according to an account of his address published by a Los Angeles newspaper and received by the Florida State Chamber of Com-


