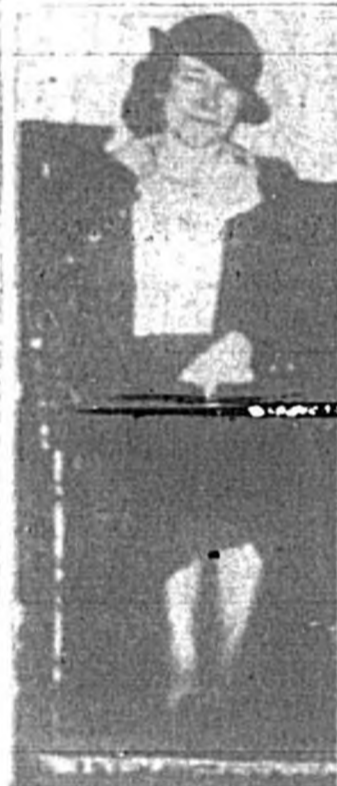

Parrish Wants State Teachers To Swear To Be Put On Sale

TALLAHASSEE, Apr. 10.—(AP)—School teachers would be required to take an oath of allegiance to the Legislature, Florida United States under a bill introduced in the Legislature yesterday by Senator Parrish of Tallahassee.

It is provided in the measure that any explicit requirement of public instruction or the members of any state institution of learning who permit instruction by a teacher or professor who has not taken the oath is subject to a fine of \$100 or imprisonment for six months, or both. The same punishment is provided for the violating teacher or professor.

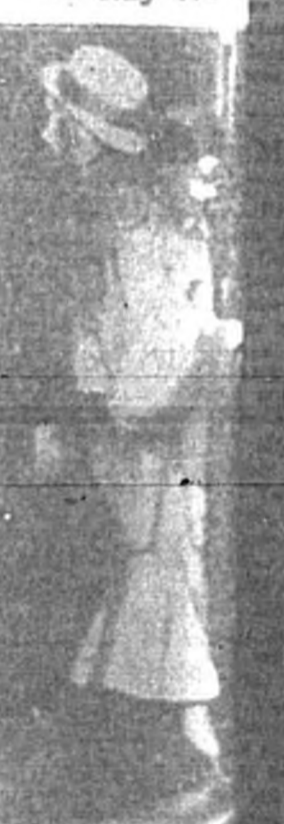

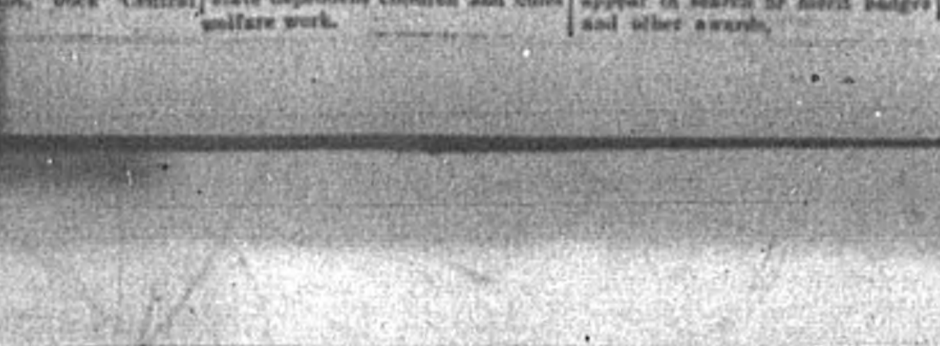
