Good News For Food Shoppers

(EDITOR NOTE: The following guide to the nation's food shopping buys for this coming weekend was prepared by the U. S. Department of Agriculture and Interior for U.P.I.)

WASHINGTON (UPI) — As September gives way to October, good news for food shoppers is that pork is becoming more plentiful and will continue to be throughout the coming months.

Vegetables which should be in good weekend buys are: Beets, cabbage, carrots, celery, cucumbers, lettuce, onions, peppers, potatoes, squash and tomatoes.

Weekend shopping for fruits should include: Apples, grapes and pears.

Nationally, the best weekend buys in fish are fresh sticks and portions, and canned tuna.

Broiler-fryers and turkeys, along with dry beans, are other mainstays in the protein-buy sections.

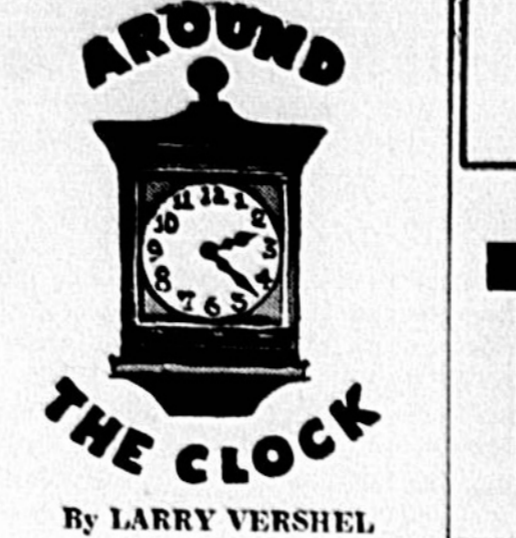

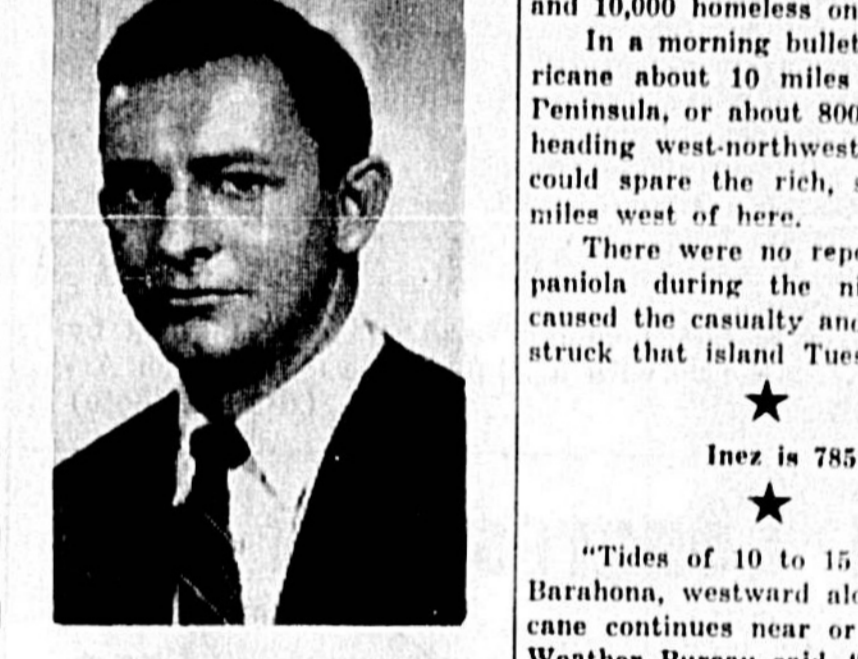

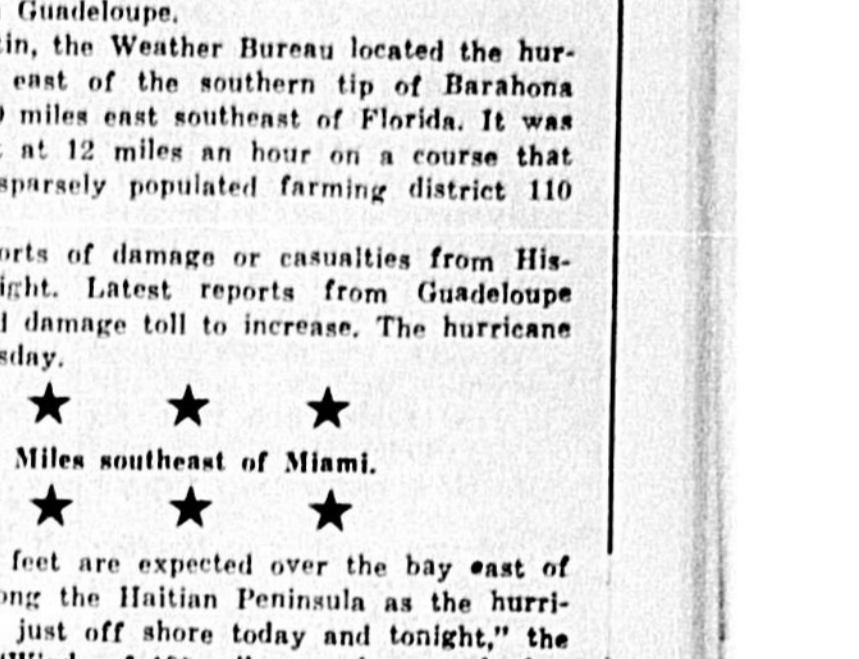

Storm Heads Toward Florida

SANTO DOMINGO, Dominican Republic (AP) — Hurricane Inez battered the southern tip of the Dominican Republic's Barahona Peninsula today with 100-mile-an-hour winds, whipping up high tides over coastal areas from Santo Domingo to the island of Beata.

The Weather Bureau warned of severe flooding in valley areas over the entire island as heavy rains spread over all of Hispaniola. Inez already has left 23 persons dead, 500 injured and 10,000 homeless on Guadalupe.

In a morning bulletin, the Weather Bureau located the hurricane about 100 miles east of the southern tip of Barahona Peninsula, or about 800 miles east-southeast of Florida. It was heading west-northwest at 12 miles an hour on a course that could spare the rich, sparsely populated farming district 110 miles west of here.

There were no reports of damage or casualties from Hispaniola during the night. Latest reports from Guadalupe caused the casualty and damage toll to increase. The hurricane struck that island Tuesday.

Tides of 10 to 15 feet are expected over the bay east of Barahona, westward along the Haitian Peninsula as the hurricane continues near or just off shore today and tonight. The Weather Bureau said, "Winds of 100 miles per hour or higher will occur over much of the area. All interests are urged to take precautions against these severe conditions."

Commercial communications with Barahona were cut off but the navy and army had contact through shortwave radio. Thunderous waves smashed against Santo Domingo's seawalls early today as the hurricane swirled across the water 75 miles to the south.

Winds of the hurricane force extended 70 miles out from the center, far enough to hit the top of Barahona 50 miles northeast of the peninsula's tip. The city of 20,000 is snuggled in a jungle valley with steep mountains on each side forming a natural funnel for flooding.

About 200,000 persons live on the peninsula, an area of coffee, sugar, cotton and banana farms.

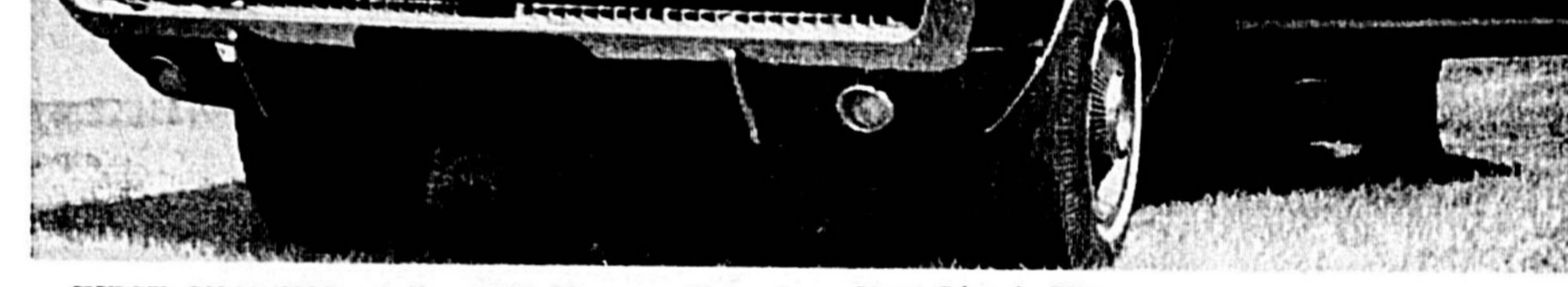

Manpower Use In Military Jobs Delayed By U.S.

WASHINGTON (AP) — The Defense Department says it is delaying until after the beginning of fiscal 1968 the remainder of its program of hiring civilians to replace military men in noncombat jobs.

In Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara's manpower utilization program, the Defense Department is attempting to replace 75,000 military men with 60,000 civilians by the end of this year.

Although officials said Tuesday only 49 per cent of the high-level jobs—those involving scientists, engineers and data processors—had been filled by Aug. 1, they expected to meet the 1968 goal.

But they said the second phase of the program would be delayed.

Historical Hop Set For 2 Frogs

WASHINGTON (AP) — Two frogs don't know it but they are going to roam space in a device built to measure how they react to weightlessness.

The 80-pound, cylindrical chamber is being shipped to Cape Kennedy, next year, with its solemn-looking passengers anesthetized, the cylinder will be orbited in an Apollo spacecraft like one in which astronauts eventually are to orbit the earth for one or two weeks.

The reason the frogs are going to make the most prodigious hop in the history of their race is that they have an inner ear quite similar to that in humans. Scientists want to learn the effects of changes in gravity conditions on the inner ear, where balance centers are located.

Instruments in the cylinder are to measure these effects on the frogs before the human space travelers are subjected to them.

Rhodesia Talks Prove Fruitless

SALISBURY, Rhodesia (AP) — British Commonwealth Secretary Herbert Bowden ended a nine-day visit to Rhodesia today and said he was not optimistic that an agreement would emerge from his talks with Prime Minister Ian Smith. But he said the discussions had helped clear the air.

Prime Minister Harold Wilson sent Bowden to Rhodesia in what he termed "a last attempt" to seek a reconciliation with the colony's rebellious white minority government before resorting to stronger action.

Smith declared the colony's independence last Nov. 11 in an effort to preserve white rule. So far, British diplomatic and economic pressure has failed to bring the colony back under British rule.

Armless Girl Spurns Studies, Cash For Love

KUALA LUMPUR, Malaysia (AP) — An armless Malaysian girl sent to the United States to study may be deprived of her allowance because the Malaysian board of trustees handling the funds is unhappy over her scholastic conduct.

The girl, Lai Yoke Hoang, now 22, had both arms amputated after a school bus crash in Kuala Lumpur eight years ago. Donations totaling nearly \$100,000 were raised for surgery, a set of artificial arms and training.

A board of trustees was set up to manage the funds.

Last year Lai was sent to the United States at her request to study at Arizona State College at Flagstaff. She said she wanted to major in sociology as she could help others in her native land who suffered similar handicaps months after her arrival in Arizona. Lai married her childhood sweetheart, James Lau. Recently she wrote the chairman of the board of trustees that she was expecting a baby, had left school and had gone to Los Angeles to improve her husband's prospects of employment.

The board chairman, K. Parakkal, expressed disappointment at Lai's "lack of application to her studies" and sent a telegram asking her to return immediately. If she fails to reply, he said, he might consider stopping her allowance.

Choy Wing Hing, a spokesman for the Chinese community that started the fund campaign, also said he was displeased with Lai's behavior. He suggested the fund be used to build an institution for handicapped children.

New System Gets Chair For Man

HOUSTON, Tex. (AP) — Jerry Michael Ward, 22, was sentenced Tuesday to die in the electric chair after a jury that heard precedent-setting testimony convicted him of murdering a high school girl.

The death penalty, returned by a Criminal District Court jury, means an automatic appeal.

Ward was found guilty of the Oct. 18, 1963, rape-slaying of Joyce Oates, 15.

Miss Oates, a junior at Westbury High School, disappeared from a shopping center parking lot after driving her mother to work. Her body was found a day later in a pasture.

She had been raped and shot four times in the back of the head, police said.

Judge Dan Walton admitted into evidence, for the first known time in Texas, testimony involving a process called nuclear activation analysis.

The system was developed at Texas A.M. University.

Police chemist Floyd McDonald testified that hair found on the victim's body and Ward's hair were identical. He based his findings on the nuclear analysis of the hair.

NEW YORK (AP) — The focus is on interest rates again, and the confusion among small borrowers is in direct proportion to their concern about the matter. Just how is interest figured? Anyone who has been through high school has heard the theory of simple interest. The payment of \$6 on a \$100 loan at the end of one year would be 6 per cent. The confusion factor is high, though. Relatively few loans are ever made on simple interest terms.

You may have noticed that — Few loans are made for exactly one year; often they are made for several years for a few months or even weeks or days.

Repayments on practically any consumer loan are made not by the year but by the month or even by the week; consumer loans often are in installment loans.

Few lenders wish to wait until after the borrower has used the money before charging; instead, they take their profits in advance.

All this makes it difficult to translate repayment charges into simple interest. Nevertheless, pressure for such translations is persistent. The problem has occupied Congress for years now. And in Massachusetts, installment payments beginning in November must be translated by the lender into terms of simple interest.

Many people in Massachusetts will find they are not paying the rates they commonly see quoted for large loans.

These are the most common methods of determining loan charges:

1. Discounting. Banks favor this method. The interest is charged in advance and deducted from the principal of the loan. A \$1,000 loan at 6 per cent gives you \$940. The \$100 is interest paid in advance.
2. Actuarial. This method is often used by small loan companies and on charge accounts. Interest is calculated not in advance but every month on the unpaid balance. It often figures out to 12 to 18 per cent.

Pork chops are down 18 cents a pound to \$1.08 in the New York area. Loins are down 2 to 3 cents on the West Coast this week. In California, hams were up slightly in the Pacific Northwest.

Many markets are featuring chicken and turkey.

Fryers dropped 1 to 2 cents a pound on the West Coast this week. At a New York area supermarket chain they are 6 cents less than they were two weeks ago.

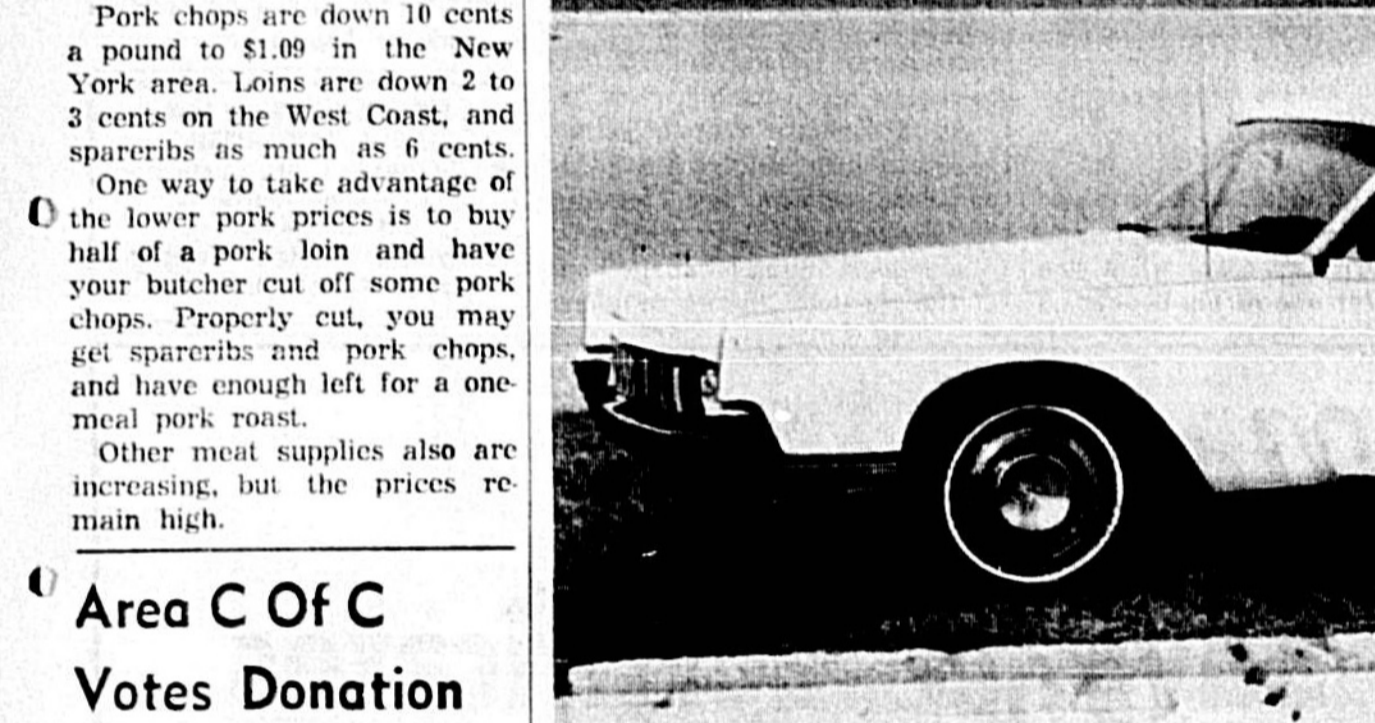
The Chamber took the action at the September meeting of the organization held at the Civic League Building on Church Street.

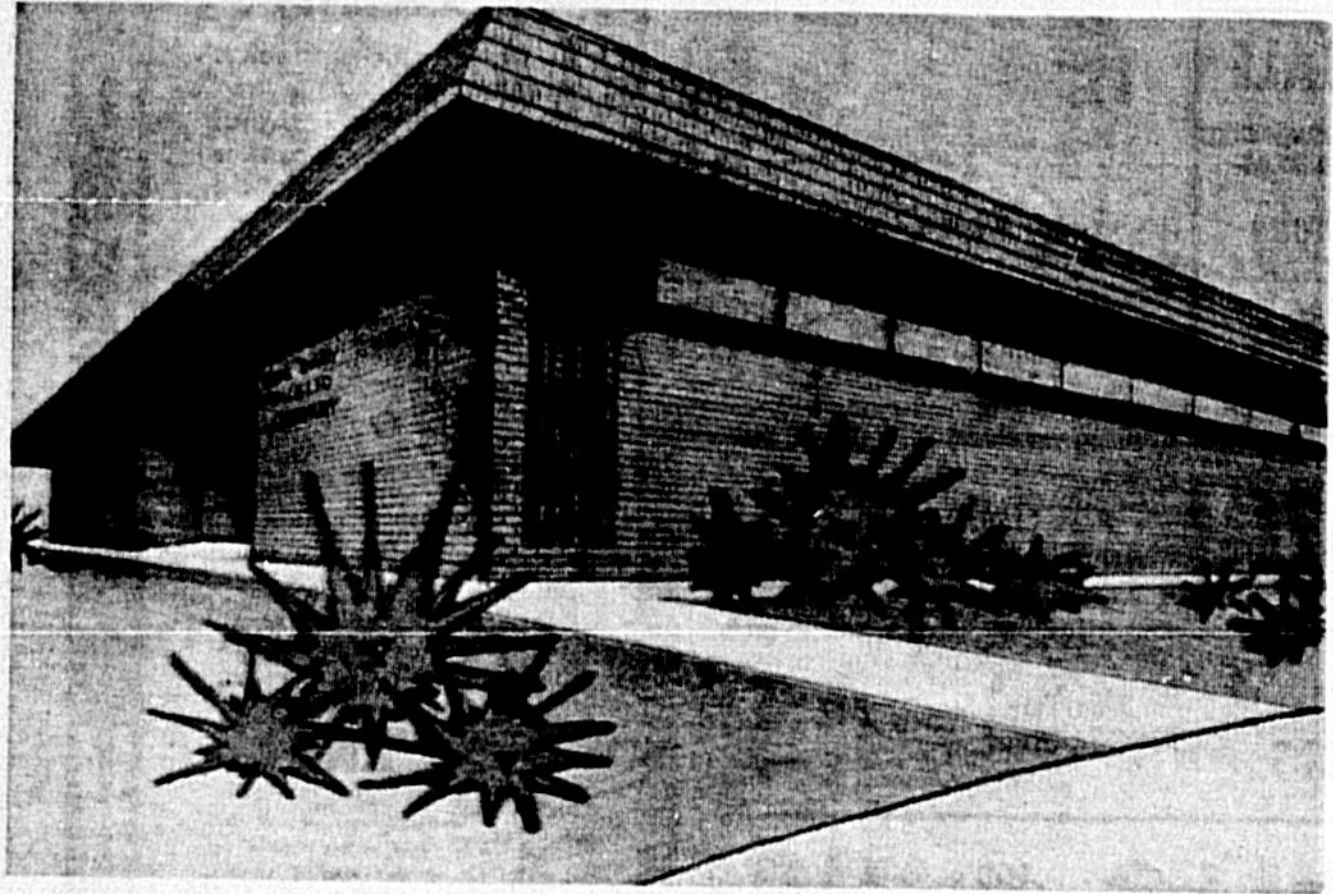

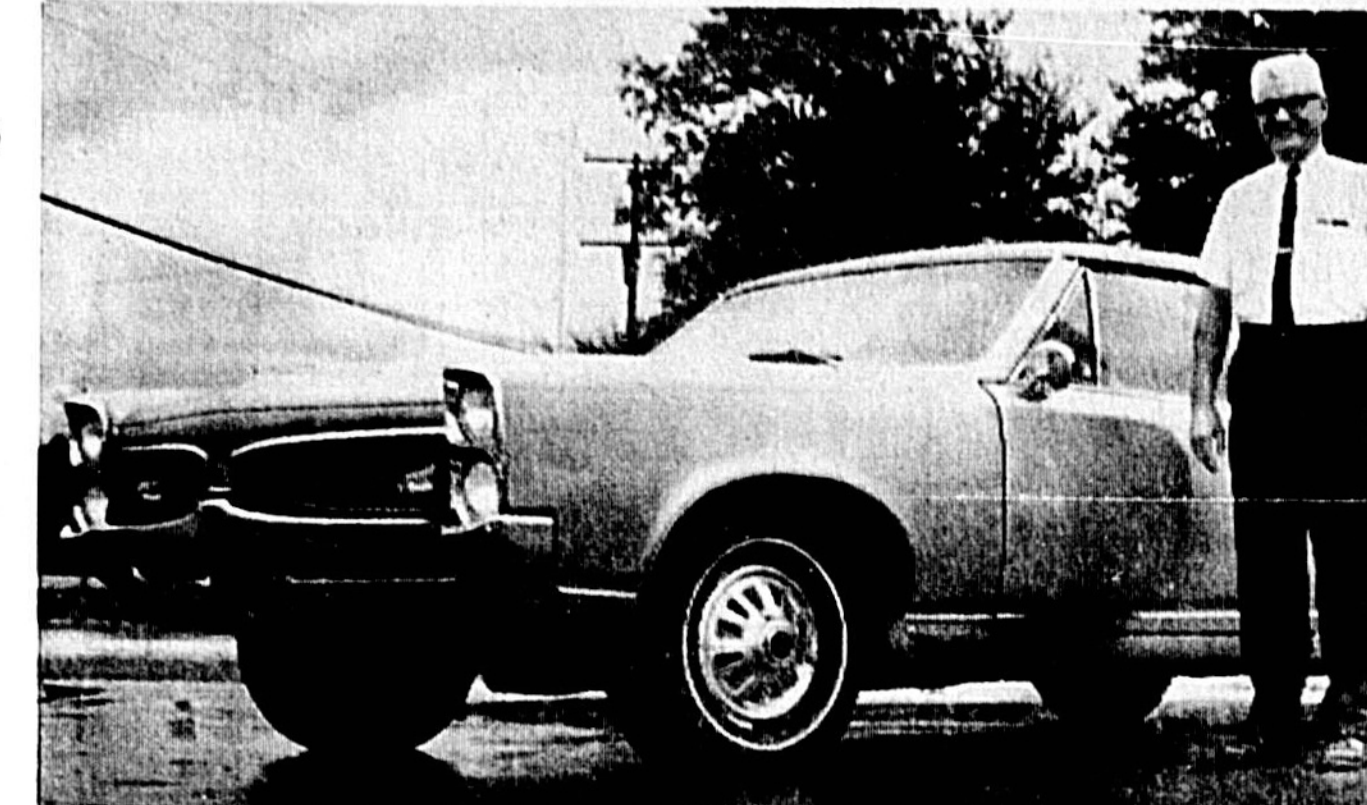
