

G. Ball, Prominent Citizen Of Sanford, Passes Away Today

Mr. G. Ball, veteran hardy merchant and one of the prominent and popular men of Sanford, died at home after a short illness from an attack of diabetes.

Mr. Ball, who had been in failing health for the past year, was taken ill on Feb. 9 and removed to his home, where he was confined for several days. Apparently recovering from an attack of diabetes, Mr. Ball had begun to show signs of improvement after several days. He was permitted to get up but not allowed to leave the house because of his weakened condition. Subsequent attacks of diabetes caused his condition to grow worse. He was confined to his bed for several days prior to Thursday when he suffered a severe attack of diabetes. Physicians had pronounced his condition grave and the end near.

Mr. Ball's widow, Mrs. Ball, is survived by two daughters, Mrs. E. L. Kinsinger and Mrs. D. B. Kinsinger, and a son, Henry C. of Miami and William of Sanford. He also leaves five sisters, Misses Mattie, Ruby and Mary of Quincy, Mrs. Howard of Tallahassee, and Mrs. W. L. and T. J. of Jacksonville, Ga. and San Francisco, Cal.

Funeral services will be held at 2 o'clock tomorrow afternoon at the Holy Cross Episcopal Church. The Rev. Mortimer will have charge of the service. Burial will be in the cemetery where interment will take place.
