

sites-Lake Ada and Econ in Seminole County plus Bluestone and Deseret in Orange County - in addition to numerous new sites which the board, during its recent Tallahassee meeting, invited the two counties to submit.

During the Jan. 10 meeting in Tallahassee, the board - minus one member because of an earlier resignation — was unable to reach a de-cision. Three of the six members voted for Lake Ada and three others favored Bluestone. The Econ site received only two favorable votes.

Prior to the close of the meeting in Tallahassee, the attorney for the Orange County Commission asked Chairman Baya Harrison where he thought the Board of Control would prefer to locate the proposed school. Harrison, with nodding agreement from a majority of the other five members, said he believed the board would like to place the university on a site east of Orlando and north of SR 50, but not quite as far north as Econ.

Harrison made substantially the same statement when he appeared on a television program on Jan. 11, in Orlando.

If a majority of the Board of Control members agree with Harrison it is obvious that both the Bluestone and Deseret sites in Orange County were eliminated since neither of them are north of SR 50. This development placed on Orange County the task of presenting one or more completely new sites for consideration by the board. Meanwhile, Seminole County's lo-

cal site committee has agreed to con-sider any additional sites brought to its attention. At this time some nine new sites have been proposed but it is doubtful if more than one or two will be approved by the committee and officially submitted to the Board of Control for consideration. It is the consensus of opinion among Seminole's civic leaders that the county's two primary sites still under considall the criteria destablished by the board. The Herald lends its support to both Seminole locations as ideal for the university site. The Econ site would undoubtedly be the finest choice if the Board of Control de-sires to locate the school in an area with no present development. However, if the board desires a location with all the advantages of so-called built-in facilities then Lake Ada should be the board's choice. The Lake Ada site is ideally loca-



We trust that the Seminole County Board of Public Instruction will give consideration to this at an early date and make plans to eleminate these undesirable conditions.

Ovledo High, with only a very limited number of high school boys - less than a hundred, we understandhas produced some excellent cage teams during the past several years. On several occasions they have been Seminole County champions. But if they are going to continue to play basketball at Oviedo, regardless if they win or lose, the youngsters deserve any consideration to be given toward improving the facility.
