

The Mismi Herald remarks that drunken driving has indeed become so common that newspapers everywhere could with profit copy the Pensacola Journal in its new found creed. "It is the policy of all real newspapers—with respect not only to the particular offense but all criminal offenses-and not primarily to discourage the offense but because it is the duty of a newspaper to print the news."

Whether a newspaper should publish the name of a person convicted of driving while drunk is always the source of a good argument particularly among those who little appreciate the duty of a newspaper or who are unin-bank. formed as to the force of public opinion in diminishing offenses of this character against the people.
