German rearmament is directly to blame for bringing war to the threabhold of Europe, according to Winston Churchill, former British Chancellor of the Exchequer, who was for many years a leader in his country's political Has Not Hurt Him and diplomatic affairs.

The Danger In Europe

"The concentration of the whole life and strength of he German people, with all their intelligence and valor, upon military preparations, dominates the mind of Europe and fills the whole continent with lively alarm and dark suspicions," he writes in the current issue of Collier's Magazine. More than that, it produces reactions in the shape of counterarmament and political and military combinations among all the states who are neighbors of Germany.

"While the great wheels revolve in the German Fatherland, while her redoubtable manhood tramps the parade grounds, while every conceivable instrument of war and preparations for war are being made to the last ounce of the strength of the people, all the neighbors of Germany are plunged in increasing anxiety and counterpreparation." Pointing out that Hitler utilized rearmament activity to cure employment, Churchill points to still further dan-

ger: "The position of the German dictator and his associ-ates is indeed grim. Rearmament in its industrial aspect will soon reach its culminating point. To stop or slow down the great wheels is not only to enable alarmed rivals to catch up but to deprive of employment millions of hard-pressed men, hitherto placated only by state work and al-ready restive under grievous physical privations.
