

# Gasoline Recognized As A Money Raiser

The immediacy of the supply may have nothing to do with it,

but Texas does have one of the nation's lowest state gas taxes -5 cents on the gallon. The same rate prevails in Kansas, Missouri, and most of Hawaii. The tax - conscious driver might well steer clear of the state of Washington, which recently raised its motor fuel tax to 9 cents—the highest in the nation. The federal 4-cent gas excise ups the total Washington tax to 13 cents on every gallon -over one-third of the average U. S. gas price, 33 cents. In addition there are local gasoline taxes, but only 254 towns and cities charge them. Of these, 237 are located in Alabama, where federal, state and local authorities share revegues of 14 cents on every gallon. State gasoline taxes originated

in 1919 when Oregon initiated a good-old-days charge of one cent a gallon. Recognizing a moneyraiser when they saw it, other states soon slapped their own taxes on motor fuel; within 10 years, all 48 states then in the union had gas taxes. In 1965, 14 states cleared over \$100 million each in motor fuel taxes, according to the Federal Bureau of Public Roads. Drivers in California, who used almost
