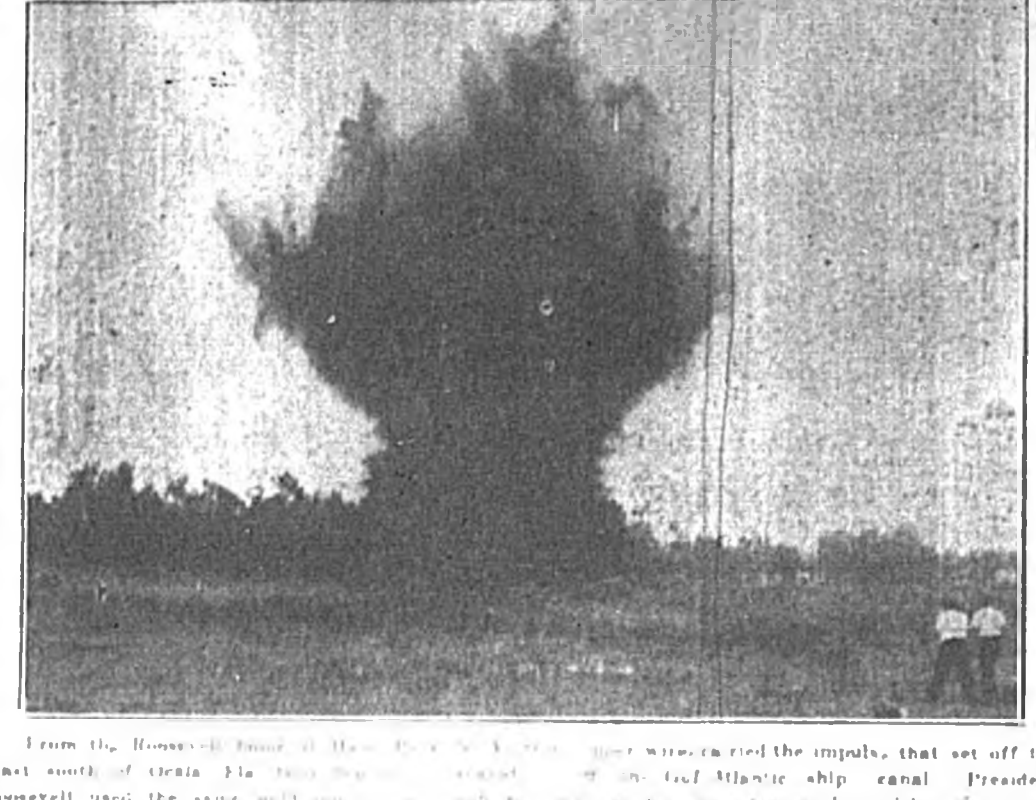
Baker Blanks Reds By 1 To 0 Giving Indians Game Lead

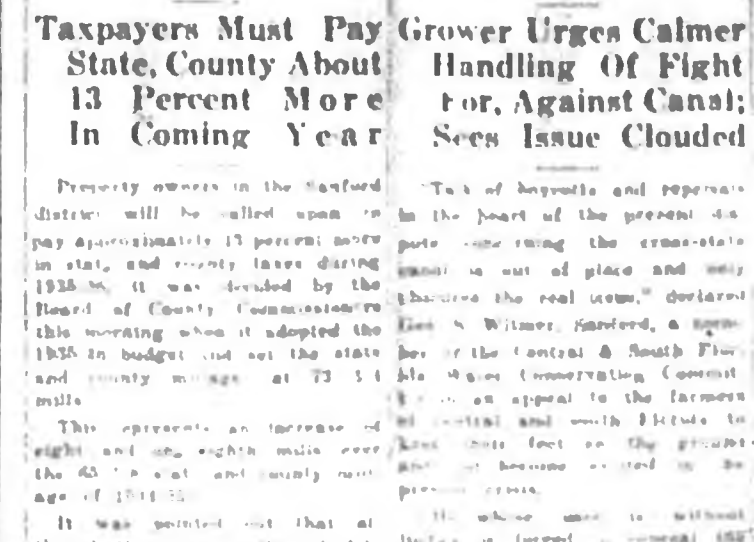
