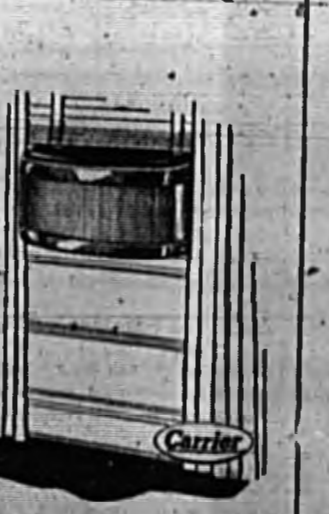

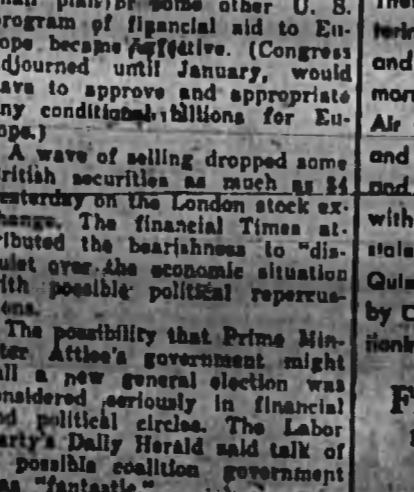

Glades Park May Become New Home Of Rare Flamingos

MIAMI, July 29, (FNS)—The Everglades National Park area may again be the home of the flamingo, the exotic pink bird native to the southeast coast before white men came to Florida.

Repopulating of the new national park with flamingos will call for all the breeding knowledge Morrow has acquired through 17 years of trial and error.

Morrow set about improving the nesting place of the flamingos. The clay nests— which look like miniature craters of extinct volcanoes— are usually found in shallow water and are flooded by heavy rains or dried up by drought.

What finally comes out of the egg does not look much like a flamingo. It has a straight bill and feet longer than its legs.
