The railroads of the country have saked the Inter-

state Commerce Commission for another increase in freight rates which will cost the nation's shippers many millions of dollars in addition to their already heavy transportation costs.

While not discounting the need of the railroads for relief from a condition which is forcing many of them into bankruptcy and so reducing the net revenues of most of the rest that they can no longer secure sufficient capital for necessary replacements and improvements, we are moved to wonder if it is good national policy to aid one group at the distinct sacrifice of another which also needs relief.

It is a well known fact that the shippers for the most part have been suffering from the depression as severely as any other group, and in the case of farmers, their troubles began long before the so-called depression became recognized as such. To throw on to their already aching backs the burden of salvaging the railroads is likely to prove more than they can bear.

There is the alternative of course of using competing lines of transportation. And to this extent an increase in railroad freight and passenger rates will prove a boon to the bus and truck transportation companies, as well as the barge and boat lines.
