If it had not promised to protect its news source in this way, it would not have known of the abuse.

"Still another evil might result. "There is this difference between the newspaperman and the doctor, lawyer, or clergyman. He publishes the confidential information he receives, and the public benefits accordingly. Only the name is held back, whereas in other professions confidential information usually remains as much a secret as the mame of the informant. Hence The newspaperman is not asking for as much protection a clock in a hurry to reach as received by those other professions. He wants only as much as his special status entitles him to.

"Experienced members of the Florida Legislature should understand this situation and vote for the bill. There are few of them who have not told a newspaper-man something in confidence, which they did not want revealed. Indeed, it is through such confidential information that the popular political columns, from both Talla-hassee and Washington, are able to give the readers inside information.

"Perhaps we should explain here that of course the newspaperman does not violate the sort of confidences we have been speaking of. If necessary he goes to jan, and when he does, there is usually some pretty mephitic politics behind it. This bill, therefore, is simply a measure to keep him from having to go to jail when he offends an influential politician or racketeer by telling the unpleasant truth."




