High up in the Pyrenees, Andorra has kept its independence since 1278. Only 191 square miles in area and with but 5,000 inspared the little country when they were sweeping greater states into their empires.

Spain and France furnished the tiny republic's two governors. From Spain comes the Bishop of Urgel. The French representative is the President of the Republic, who just now is Vincent Auriol. There is also a legislative body, the General Council of the Valleys.

Like other people, Andorrans like to rule themselves. The Council has of late keep Communism in check. been extending its authority at the expense of that of the two governors. Its latest act is permitting a private radio station to turn out programs objectionable to the French. President Auriol would like to replace the station by one regularly licensed, which would not broadcast anti-French sentiments. As a hint that they mean business, the French have been tightening passport restrictions and economie concessions.

This may be a tempest in a teapot, but little storms have been known to grow into bly ones. France might be thought to have enough troubles now without getting into unnecessary complications, even with as small a neighbor as Andorra.
