

## New Utilities Hike Seen For Sanford

It now appears that an increase of from \$1 to \$1.25 per month for water and sewage disposal customers of the City of Sanford is in the offing and a still further utilities rate increase of an undetermined amount is also indicated as the result of the recent legislative passage over the governor's veto of the utility bill, that restricts the amount municipality may charge out-of-town utility

customers to 20 per cent of the inside-the-city This was confirmed this morning by Sanford City Manager W. E. Knowles, who, in discussing the recently passed act, stated that his office had received a copy in the mail today and had written to the Florida Municipal League to find out the effective date for the utility rate cut back.

Knowies stated that from \$1 to \$1.25 increase in sewage treatment stage after city sells estimated \$1.2 million in bonds to pay for the project. The increase would go toward repaying the indebtedness on

Knowles said the city is also working on getting the U. S. Economic Development Administration to declare Sanford a depressed area so application could be made to EDA for up-to-half matching funds for the sewage treatment facility's cost. This increase in rates would have come about

anyway, Knowles said, since city was forced to install the second treatment of sewage effluent after being city for pollution of Lake Monroe by the state. No exact figure on additional utility rate increases to take up the slack caused by the loss of money from out-of-town water and sewer customers has been established and cannot be until the effective date of the

But, since the city has set its budget and included money derived from the utility sales, an increase of some kind will have to come or the city might conceivably be pushed to the point of operating at a loss.

### Perfect Cheesecake Recipe

We cherish a small cookbook called "PICASSO & PIE" (Price, Stern, Sloan) because it remains along with other superb recipes, one for a remarkably good cheesecake.

This cookbook has a story behind it. It's the work of Lynne
Thompson, a septuagenerian
and proud of it, and the recipes
are those that were used at the
Blue Hill Buffet and Art Gallery

in Blue Hill, Maine.

After the Buffet was closed,
Mrs. Thompson received hundreds of letters asking for its
recipes and so she decided to
put them in cookbook form and
add her own informal comments. She named the cookbook
—without objection from Pi-

casso "PICASO & PIE" because it is her firm belief that
good cooking should be counted
as one of the arts.

Lynne Thompson's Cheesecake
Adapted from "Picasso & Pie"
Vanilla Wafer Crust, see recipe

1 container (8 oz) heavy cream
1 cup sugar
2 tablespons cornstarch
1½ pounds (3 eight-oz packages) cream cheese, roomtemperature soft

2 large eggs
1% tablespoons vanilla
% teaspoon grated lemon rind
2 tablespoons vanilla water

2 tablespoons vanilla water crumbs, reserved from Vanilla Wafer Crust recipe Prepare and bake Vanilla Wafer Crust; set aside at room

In a small mixing bowl whip cream until stiff; refrigerate.

In a large mixing bowl, with a wooden spoon, stir together the sugar and cornstarch; stir in cream cheese until blended-Without washing beater, beat in eggs, one at a time, until smooth. Add vanille and lemon rind. Fold in whipped cream.

Turn into baked Vanilla Wafer
