Jacksonville, August 21 .- Governor atts announced that he would ask the Supreme Court o the State for an opinion as to the necessity of callng a special session of the Legislature to change the election laws before women are permitted to vote. 





POLES ARE VICTORIOUS.

The allied and associated powers lavored preservation of the integrity of Russia, it said, and the United States suggested also that a declaration should be accompanied by the announcement that no trangression by Poland troops would be permitted. Great Britain has joined with the United States, officials said, in an endeavor to prevent a second violation by Poland of Russian territory and the position of the two powers is expected to curb any headlong impulses which present bolsheviki defeat may have inspired in Poland.
