Navy donates Vigilante jet

Congressman John Mica announced this week that the U.S. Navy will provide an RA-5C Vigilante for display at the Orlando/Sanford International Airport.

The vintage aircraft will be the centerpiece of a memorial park that is being established in commemoration of the for-mer Naval Air Station (NAS) in Senford.

"I am extremely pleased that the Navy has agreed to help honor the proud history and rich heritage of our community," Mica said. "The Sanford Memorial Park appropriately honors those who served and sacrificed for our nation and will be a timely demonstration of our country's commitment to peace and freedom."

NAS Sanford was operational from 1942 to 1968 and was located at the site now occupied by the airport. Aviators and ground maintenance technicians trained at the airbase, and scores of military aircraft participated in flight operations as part of war efforts during World War IL Korea and Vietnam. The Vigilante is a unique fighter plane that was based only at NAS Sanford.

A Shoulder to Cry On

Counselors from Seminole helped families grieve for those who died in New York tragedy

SANFORD — After a week-long histus Audrey Skidmore, Isa Kennedy and Mollie McLaughlin are back at their desks as victim-witness counselors in the state attorney's office in downtown Sanford.

They didn't visit warm beaches or cruise to the Caribbean during their week away; they worked 14-hour days as counselors to the many families who lost loved ones in the terrorist attack on the World Trade Center.

A group of 10 Florida counselors was put on standby Sept. 15 by the National Organization for Victim Assistance (NOVA). The Seminole counselors said they became anxious hearing the news and had an urge to help, like millions of other Americans.

Requested by New Jersey officials, the Florida team left Monday, Sept. 17, to assist in victim counseling and crisis intervention. Led by Beth Rossman, director of Victim


Students stich message of hope for USA

Officials suspect arson at 5th Street fire

SANFORD — Seminole

County and Sanford firefighters "made a nice stop" on a house fire just before midnight Friday, said Battalion Chief Max Buffkin.

No one was hurt in the blaze, but ongoing investigations are determining if the fire at 412 E. 5th St. was the result of arson. Tenants, who reportedly hadn't paid rent in 10 months, were instructed to be out Sunday as the bank had foreclosed on the property, said Sanford fire inves-

tigator Tim Robles.

The home, like many in the area, is older and fairly close to its neighbors. According to Buffkin, when they arrived flames were blowing out the back of the residence while heavy smoke was coming out of the second floor. Buffkin said an out-of-control fire could have been a major threat to nearby

Several hours after the fire was contained, firefighters continued to work tearing down portions of the ceiling and using a thermal imaging camera to find thermal

extensions, or hot spots that could not be seen by the naked eye. Florida Power and Light was also called to turn off the power to prevent any more fires at the home.

"There was a suspicious nature to the fire," Robles said as he speculated one of two causes for the fire. An incendiary device such as a lighter, cigarette or candle may have caught the couch in the back portion of the home on fire or a "flammable liquid was thrown through the window."





"When we got there and saw it — and you smell it because the pollution is so bad — your eyes feel like sandpa-per," McLaughlin said. "I could feel dust in my ears, down in my throat, congesting my chest. It's just everything. Every sense you have is engaged with what has happened across the

They slept for a couple hours then prepared for a 2 p.m. meeting that was just the beginning of a long trying

The Center is Born

The Florida group was just "one small part" in setting up the New Jersey family assistance center at the old train depot in Liberty Park.

While many people who were feared missing in the World Trade Center collapse resided in New York, more than a thousand called New Jersey home. Jersey families and survivors used the center on the Hudson River to file missing person reports with the FBI and have access to numerous other ser-

"They came in and overnight transformed this place," Skidmore said. "They planted flowers — they made it beautiful. They made it pleasant. They made it a nice place for families to come to. A quiet place for families to

The center included the services of the Red Cross and the Salvation Army and nearby, portable trailers housed other possible needs such as grief counseling, bank insurance, victim compensation and employment compensation.

Directly across the Hudson is lower Manhattan — this smoking void where the towers were," McLaughlin said about the view. "If you look to the side of the Hudson you could see Lady Liberty in the harbor and Ellis Island. It was really a powerful sight."

Families parked their cars at a loca-

tion and were bussed to the park as part of the heavy security at the center, said Skidmore. At times, families with as many 20 people would come to the center. They would often spend time looking across the river — throwing flowers into the water.

"Reality really started to set in after we got there," Kennedy said. "As soon as you start working with the people, the families and the survivors, you see the looks on their faces and all of sudden your focus is on them. You almost lose consciousness of what was around you because it was like what can we do to help."

The Difficult Task

NOVA counseling teams from across the nation converged at the New Jersey site to tackle a situation that was larger than ever imaginable.

Teams from Oregon, Illinois Pennsylvania, Indiana, Iowa, Florida and many other states helped form a diverse team of professionals. Individual studies ranged from mental health counselors to art therapy for children.

One similarity among the counselors was the 40-hour training they had received through a NOVA seminar, which specifically teaches them how to counsel in disaster relief. Rossman, who recently was elected to vice president of NOVA, also served as a counselor at the Oklahoma City bombing.

Models for disaster counseling are often done with a large group of victims, said Skidmore.

"This was a little bit different," she admitted, noting that counselors counseled more one-on-one with a family or

"Some people would come one day and do all they could and come back the next day," she said. Some coun-selors would stay in contact with the victims at home using free cell phones provided by Verizon, she said.

From the time they would come to the center, counselors would act as "companions" helping them vent and grieve. Counselors also helped in finding out their needs. By addressing their needs, counselors could direct them to an area of the center that could assist in a solution. The whole process was lengthy; on average three hours per

"At the same time we're giving support to the families that were coming. every night — or sometimes even dur-ing the day — we would grab one another and take one another aside and give support to each other because these were long days," McLaughlin

A Survivor's Fear

One of the toughest challenges for the counselors was the survivor: the one who witnessed the unthinkable.

The fear many of the survivors were dealing with was overwhelming and some refused to come out of their homes, still in a state of shock. According to Skidmore, the feeling of security is one of the primary needs and without it, everything else is sec-

"There is not a word to describe the fear they had," said Kennedy"."When they would talk about what would happen to them when trying to get out of a building, what they went through and what they saw. What they saw was so traumatizing.

The fear they have is something that has altered who they are. Not only has it altered their lives but who they are as a person. They don't like who they are. One of the things that I heard someone say was they felt like they were crazy, and we had to reassure them that they weren't crazy they were just scared — just afraid like we all are. But, they felt things and experienced things we didn't. Dealing and living with that fear is something that is going to take some time to do."

Counselors prayed when reports were issued that another building might collapse because of damage sustained, McLaughlin said. She said the familiar sound of another collapse could "trigger" more fear in the survivors. Some survivors were so frightened they would absolutely freeze when they would hear an everyday noise such as helicopter passing overhead, said Kennedy.

Sense of Hope

More than a week after the tragedy, many family members were still posting missing person signs, and helping them through the state of denial was an especially tough task for counselors. According to McLaughlin, rescue

workers had pulled more than 200 bodies from the rubble, but were only able to identify a few. Often closure for a family is at the burial site and, unfortunately, many families may never get that, she said.

"The thing that was personally difficult for me was that they weren't pulling anybody alive from that six-story high rubble," Skidmore said. "The victims were still in such a state of shock that they were still thinking and speaking as if their loved ones were missing, but very few people were ready to move on to that next,

stage and accept they weren't coming

"It was heart breaking to see that hope they had and you wanted to have hope with them, too, but every passing day you were like, 'Gosh, how do they do it? If there is anything I got from that is the strength these people had is unbelievable. To me, they're what humans can be. How they can be so strong and go from each day and still have that hope and faith that there loved one is going to come home."

The three speculated the next wave of NOVA counselors would face a darker task as the operation at the World Trade Center officially moved from rescue to recovery.

Time for Reflection

Sunday morning, a memorial service with Ray Charles singing "America the Beautiful" and a few inspirational words from Christopher Reeves served as a healing time for families and even the departing Florida team.

The weary team had stayed their duration — a maximum of seven days by NOVA guidelines. Complete with a "soul moving" version of "Amazing Grace" from a marching band of police officers armed with bagpipes, the memorial service was a special time for all to say their peace.

"Once we got going, it was pretty much a non-stop thing for quite a few days," Kennedy said. "I think you keep going on your adrenaline. When I went up there, I absolutely had no expectations because all I really wanted to do was touch one person. If I could help one person, the trip was worth it to me. That was all I expected."

"I think all of us felt like we're going up to tackle this monumental task and

how are we going to be able to affect any positive change on something that was such a huge scope," McLaughlin added. "We kept a really good perspective in that you can only do what is in front of you. You can only help one person at a time — you can only do what you can do. In doing that way I

think we did a lot." "The tough thing I didn't know if I had the strength to get through was the memorial wall," Skidmore said about the wall that sits at Inspiration Point of Liberty Park. "The families were able to put pictures of their loved ones up there. It was a physical thing they could to do — it was so therapeutic. They didn't have anything eise, but they put their picture of a loved one up there or they'd write their names.

"All the families and the friends would come and write their good-byes to these people. I've never seen so many grown men cry than at that memorial wall. I just remember I couldn't read it. I could not read it because I knew what it would do to me, so I had to look past the wall. The sun was setting and it was the most beautiful, peaceful time of day."

A Great Boss

Perhaps the one person from the state attorney's office who wanted to go help the most was the state attorney

Unfortunately, no NOVA training meant no trip for Wolfinger, but according to the group he was more than supportive from the very start. "Allowing us to go is a big thing,"
Skidmore said. "Norman Wolfinger is

the kindest hearted person. He was going to drive us up there.
"This community is blessed," she added. "I don't know how many peo-

ple realize in Seminole all the great things we have here, the people we have here. The state attorney truly cares. The sheriff is the same way." "It makes me feel proud and blessed

to know that we have the expertise on our staff that can help these people in some way," Wolfinger said of his staff. "It is comforting because they are in good hands with this team and the others from across the nation."





the franchise fees," Drago said. Thirty years ago, many Central Florida cities entered franchise agreements with Florida Power. For regulation of the right-of-ways, Florida Power collected franchise fees, usually 6 percent of the electricity provider's revenues, and handed the collected money over to the cities.

More than 35 Florida cities have had their franchise agreements expire since 1995. In the old franchise agreements, cities were given the option for a buy-out of the electrical system in the city. Florida Power is removing that option in the franchise agreement and many cities don't want to lose that option. Monday night Florida Power spokesperson called it "a good business decision on our part" not to include the buyout option in the wake of possible deregulation.

According to Drago, the city will have lost \$225,000 from June 10 to Sept. 30 in franchise fees from Florida Power. A city averages about \$770,000 in collected franchise fees a year. Florida Power cannot collect fees without an agreement. In their most recent attempt to negotiate, Florida Power offered to pay the back fees with customers picking up the costs — if the city agreed to the new franchise agreement.

We feel the impact would be minimal to customers," said Simpson who also said the fees could be spread out over several months to defray the cust to the customers.

'It's always at the customer's expense," said Mayor Paul Lovestrand, who is in favor of signing the franchise agreement because he believes the city has no intention to purchase the system from Florida Power.

Lovestrand stood alone as every other commissioner balked at Florida Power's newest deal.

"They're not making us whole, chairman," said Commissioner Butch Bundy. "You haven't offered us any-

thing. You offered to go back and collect money from cus-

tomers. You are not negotiating with us." According attorney Tom Cloud of Orlando law Gray, firm

Robinson, Florida Power's is guilty of "outrageous conduct." In the court order, the judge stated if the franchise fees were to be back logged the shortfall of money

Power's pockets. "They're not going to agree with anything legal until a court tells them," said city attorney Robert Taylor.

After the meeting, Bundy said he found several of Simpson's comments threatening in nature trying to bully the city in signing the franchise agreement.

Until we are allowed that option they're not going to roll over," Bundy said. "We're in good (financial) shape. Really it couldn't of happened at a better time."

As for the customers paying the back franchise fees, Bundy said it's not an option as far as he can see.

Several cities who have expiring franchise agreements with Florida Power in the next couple years include Seminole cities Lake Mary and Oviedo.

"They're paying close attention to what we do," Bundy said. "A lot of the initial research has already been done. They don't have to reinvent the wheel.

"If all goes well we might not have to buy the system to get what we want," Bundy said. "We're something of value they don't want to give up, but they're not offering up anything in value. Obviously they think it's worth millions of dollars because they wouldn't be spending millions of dollars trying to defend it."


