

**Board Of Regents Foresees:  
12,500 Students At Fla. Tech In '75**

TAMPA (UPI)—The Board of Regents, meeting by candlelight in the wake of a tornado Monday, predicted the attendance at the state's seven universities would be 101,500 in 1975.

The board met at the University of South Florida here and one of several tornadoes which hit the area knocked out power on the campus.

The board set student load projections for 1975 of 25,000 students each for the University of Florida and Florida State, 6,000 for the University of South Florida, 18,000 for the University of Florida at Tallahassee, 12,500 at Florida Technological University (at Oviedo) and 12,500 at the University of West Florida.

The new estimates compared to a total of 82,000 students previously forecast for the schools in 1973.

Turning to a controversial \$1.1-billion center for the Chester Ferguson school, the board was not going to subordinate the school to the law school at Florida A & M University would be closed.

"Homer to the contrary," he said, "there has been no change in the Board of Regents' attitude toward the school at Florida A & M."

It has been reported that since there is going to be a new law school at Florida State University, the law school at the predominantly Negro school would be phased out to make room for the new one.

**19 Rookies Bid For Moon Shot**

SPACE CENTER, Houston (UPI)—The United States, beefing up its bid to beat Russia to manned conquest of the moon, today has 19 new astronaut candidates and a streamlined launch schedule for vital space rocket.

The rookie astronauts, actually named Monday, will begin training in May for voyages that will take some 20 miles into space aboard Apollo spacecraft.

Haise Jr., 31, a Marine Corps officer, seven Air Force officers and six Navy officers. They are: Vance D. Air Force Capt. Joe H. Engle, 33, X15 rocket plane pilot stationed at Edwards Air Force Base.

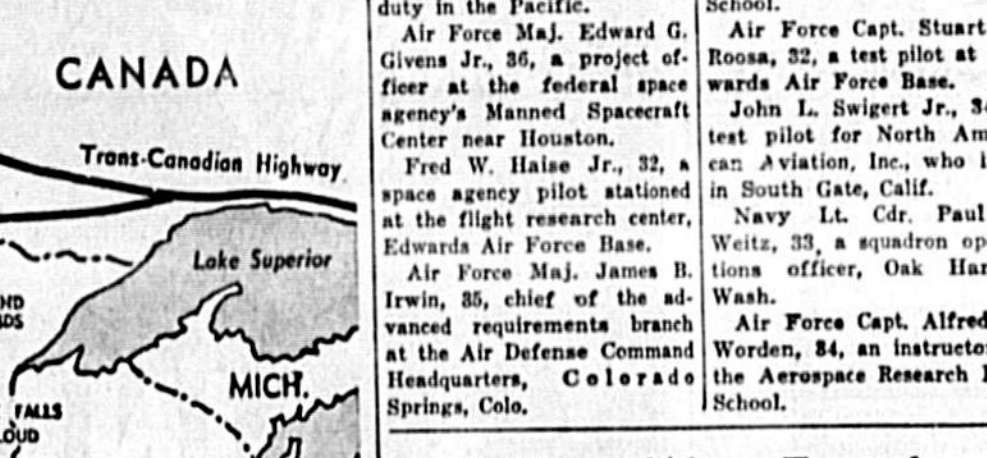

# Yanks Evacuate Rebellious City; Ky's Government Totters

SAIGON (UPI)—American only a few civilians in the consulate and a handful of soldiers in the Military Assistance Command headquarters. Military leaders said they could not insure their safety nor guarantee the security of American installations.

A spokesman at the U. S. mission said about 100 Americans were flown to a nearby Marine base, leaving behind their families and possessions.

The actions came as Premier Nguyen Cao Ky struggled desperately to save his tottering regime in the face of anti-government agitation in virtually every major city of the country.

He battled with other members of the ruling military junta in Saigon today on ways to cope with the wild outbreaks and rebellious army units.

Buddhist leaders struck another blow by withdrawing their moderating influence over students who have turned wire barricades, at the American official remarked: "He didn't move all those marines in there for a training exercise."

The Americans at Hue were flown by army C-119 planes to the Phu Bai Marine base just eight miles away to insure their safety.

They were rounded up by trucks and jeeps early today and taken to a small air strip in the compound of the old Imperial Palace at Hue.

When they waited for several hours while U. S. officials took another look at the situation. The officials decided to proceed with the move and three C-119 planes capable of short-distance takeoffs flew them out. Many were women and children.

Hue, northernmost major city in South Vietnam, is a time hotbed of anti-government activities.

The situation became more complicated Tuesday when Gen. Phan Xuan Nuon, commander of the 1st Division, denounced the Ky government, announced in Hue, he was ready to fight alongside rebel forces and vowed to give military leaders an expanded role in the war for many months. They have believed they would, in time, see President Johnson's ascent if there was no move toward the peace table.

Development of the bombing pattern this week shows that the air campaign is moving closer to the Hanoi-Haiphong area and also is bearing down on transportation lines north of the Red capital.

Tuesday fighter bombers pressed within 25 miles of Hanoi to hit a railroad and a highway bridge to the northeast of the city.

They also cut rail lines both northwest and northeast of Hanoi.

This is generally in line with expectations when bombing resumed Tuesday after a 37-day pause during Johnson's efforts to get peace negotiations started.

An early decision is now to be expected on whether to strike the important petroleum deposits in the Haiphong port area and possibly the Quang Yen refineries north of Haiphong.

It can be presumed that tactical planning has been done. Target lists for various areas usually are drawn up some weeks in advance and commanders are instructed to deal with them within specified time periods.

Since the resumption, bombing has been conducted at two to three times the intensity of the pre-pause effort.

The targets have been generally the same, however — the supply lines, storage and staging areas that support the movement of men and arms into South Vietnam.

The pattern was substantially the same from February 1965 to Christmas Eve when the pause began.

In both cases, targets in the southern part of North Vietnam were struck first and the campaign spread gradually to the northern areas.

There were both military and political reasons for this scheme, apparently, though the Joint Chiefs of Staff would have preferred harder, more concentrated blows.

After the pause, as when the bombing first started, initial strikes were launched against supplies and transport near ports of entry to Laos and South Vietnam. Then the bombing expanded northward.

Politically, it apparently was assumed that this pattern would give Hanoi inducement to negotiate and would avoid provoking Hanoi to greater support of the war.

When your children search for colored eggs this Easter, they'll be renewing a custom far older than Christianity. Eggs represent the new life that returns to earth every spring — around the time of Easter. The custom of exchanging eggs as part of the celebration began in ancient times. The ancient Egyptians often dyed eggs in the colors of spring and gave them to their friends as gifts. Some early people believed that the earth had hatched from a giant egg.

**Bum Check Artists Just 'Too Smart'**

NEW YORK (UPI) — Passers of phony checks are just too smart for their own good.

Check flagging is a multi-million dollar a year operation in this country, but the more skillful the operator becomes, the less chance he has of working at it.

That, according to John J. Janssen, head of the criminal division of Burns Detective Agency, is because the passer of worthless checks is probably the world's most carefully watched and publicized criminal.

The sale of a swifter getting caught increases with each check he passes, even if he adapts four or five aliases and as many kinds of handwriting, Janssen says.

Burns' criminal division processes about 10,000 worthless checks a year for clients — mainly banks, hotels and motels, credit associations and department stores.

The agency's handwriting sleuths may work with various magnifying lenses, stereoscopic microscopes, ultraviolet light and the net lights.

One check may come from Chicago, and the description of the passer is in New York. Some send another check along with the photo of a person cashing the check under a false identity.

When the jigaw pieces finally are fitted together, all pertinent information and the picture of the suspect are published by Burns in a special magazine. The culprit finally is identified by some police department which then supplies his identity, fingerprints and previous record. In most instances, this leads to arrest and conviction.

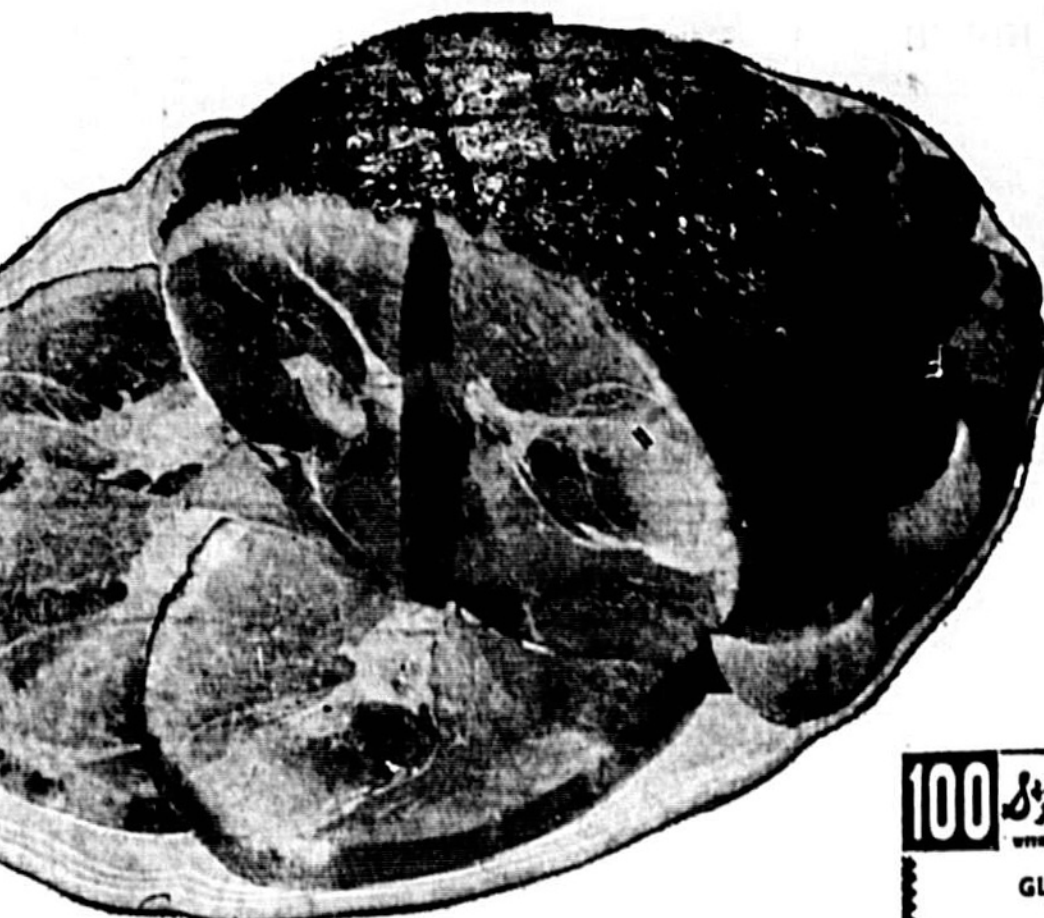

**Weather Blamed For Increase In Food Prices**

WASHINGTON (UPI)—You say the cost of groceries in sky-high, lady? Well, blame it on the weather.  
That, in a nutshell, was the Agriculture Department's answer to the question of why the nation's food prices rocketed last month.  
The government confirmed what housewives already knew—that bigger grocery bills pushed the cost of living to another record high in February.  
The consumer price index rose one-half of one per cent last month, but retail food prices jumped 1 1/2 per cent.  
Said New York housewife Mrs. Mary Connelly, "I feel sorry for the people with children. In my home, there's only myself and my husband and the higher prices don't bother us too much. I know the meat prices are way up. Even the price of chickens, which have been very low, have been climbing steadily."  
The severe winter storms of January took their toll of fruit and vegetable crops and slowed down distribution across the nation in January, according to Agriculture Department economists.  
In addition, the relatively low number of hogs on farms and ranches last fall and in the early winter played a key part in pushing most prices up by about two per cent from mid-January to mid-February, the period covered by the cost-of-living report.  
As for milk, that's another matter. The Agriculture Department is to persuade some of the nation's dairy farmers to increase milk production by suspending for a while scheduled seasonal price declines in minimum farm prices for bottling milk in 45 federally regulated milked areas.  
Dairy farmers feel they're not getting good prices for their milk and they're warning the government of possible widespread shortages. Thus milk prices will probably stay up. And it's one reason for the Pentagon's decision to substitute margarine for butter on occasion in its mess halls and galleys.  
According to the Agriculture Department, it is not a bad idea to already be finding lower prices at the supermarket. There is a time lag of about a month and a half between the date of the prices on which the consumer price index report is based and the time the report is actually issued.

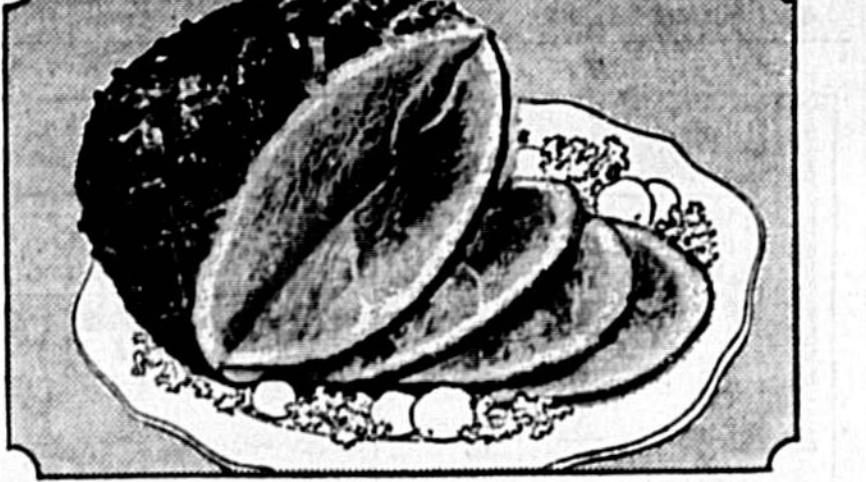
