Britain Cracks Down On Terror In Jerusalem

JERUSALEM, Oct. 1.—(AP)—Britain struck with an iron fist today to crush a new wave of terrorism in the Holy Land, in a sweeping offensive mandate, authorities outlawed the Arab higher committee and started rounding up its influential members.

With telephone communication from the city suspended and roads heavily guarded, police carried out their large scale operations before dawn. Silently they surrounded the houses of Arab leaders and searched them one after the other.

Dr. Hussein Khalidi, mayor of Jerusalem, and Faud Saba, secretary of the higher committee, were reported to have been seized and taken aboard the British cruiser Sussex at Haifa.

Terrorism reached a climax when the British commissioner of Galilee and his bodyguard were assassinated last Sunday.

Seminole Quota For CCC It Set At 30

Seminole County has been allotted 18 white boys and 12 colored boys as its quota for the next enrollment in the Civilian Conservation Corps. Mrs. Esther Ridge, senior case worker of the Seminole County Welfare Board, announced today.

The enrollment of the County's quota will be held in Sanford Oct. 20, 21. Mrs. Ridge stated, adding that the Board has on hand at the present time numerous applications and that no additional applications for the enrollment could be made.

Mrs. Ridge added that all of the present applicants will be investigated and that only the boys from families where the greatest benefits can be secured will be considered.

The State's enrollment is 3226 and is said by officials to be the second largest enrollment since the corps was founded. A group of army officers and representatives of the State Welfare Board will pass on the applicants.

U.S. Admiral Hits Japan's Bombing Raids

Admiral Yamamoto Particularly Condemned Air Attack On Hankow And Railroad Asks Safe Way To Get To Sea More Than One Thousand American Sailors in Valley

HANGHAI, Oct. 1.—(AP)—A sharp condemnation of the Japanese bombing of Hankow and the Hankow-Canton railway on Oct. 1 came today from Rear Admiral Harry Yarnell, commander of the United States Asiatic fleet.

A Japanese spokesman had said the Japanese navy was informed by United States Ambassador Nelson T. Johnson that all Americans and other foreigners had been evacuated from Hankow and the surrounding territory by noon of Oct. 1. This Admiral Yarnell, however, said, saying Ambassador Johnson issued no such statement but instead told the admiral that foreigners would be evacuated from Hankow and the surrounding territory after Oct. 30.

Yarnell said there are 1,000 American sailors in the Yangtze valley. Several thousand Americans, of whom 1,000 are in the Yangtze valley, are in the Yangtze valley.

It is imperative that a safe route be found for the evacuation of the sailors from the Yangtze valley, he agreed.

Meanwhile the Chinese officers of Shanghai reported they were holding their own against the line and in some cases were sharply counter-attacking in the vicinity of Kiangsu.

The United States and Japan have reached a diplomatic deadlock over the question of responsibility for injury to American property in China.

The Tokyo Government supported an exchange of notes by insisting to acknowledge liability. The United States previously had warned Japan repeatedly that it would be held accountable for damage resulting from its military operations.

The expression concerning liability was only one phase of Japan's reply to a sharp American protest against the bombing of Chinese non-combatants.

In addition to serving notice that the Japanese military intended to pursue its aerial attacks on Hankow, the Chinese captain, the Tokyo note invited the Government to "co-operate" with the Japanese Government to insure the safety of American nationals and vessels at Hankow.

Observers generally interpreted the invitation in "co-operate" as a renewed request that the United States order its diplomatic representatives and naval vessels in the Chinese capital to seek safety elsewhere.

International Law

Time was when many a bright young man turned to international law for a living. Now, however, this profession is rapidly being closed to him and in its place is developing nothing better than international anarchy.

Slots Vanish In Seminole With End Of Legality

Court held that the State would be guilty of "bad faith" if the machines were seized immediately after they became illegal.

The ruling of the Court came only six hours before the deadline, and without it sheriffs and others could have seized the slots and fined the owners even though they were in storage.
