If Legislature Won't Act....

Space Age Industry leaders made it clear to a committee of the State Senate this week that Florida must proceed as quickly as possible with providing the Cape Canaveral area with a university for scientists assoclated with the industries.

If it is not forthcoming, some of these space efforts will have to be "farmed out" to the more educationally progressive state of California, they said.

The U.S. is in the space age to stay. Therefore this state must work with the agencies and industries which are responsible for our success in that age. We have no choice but to provide the educational institution where space scientists can keep abreast of ever developing new know-ledge that goes along with this new science of space exploration.

Florida has been as slow as any state in the nation in advancing educationally following the first space triumph by the Russlans. We have permitted our energy in higher education to be wasted by bouts with such as the Johns Committee - a method of tearing down confidence in the state of top educators - and with pecuniary expenditures by the Legislature and a one time economy minded Governor who refused to back education as recently as 1961.

And now we are faced with a remagnett to wake up and build a graduate school for space science " Iffime-

diately." The problem, of course, is not associated with Florida alone. The nation itself has been backward in moving ahead in all phases of education - in fact, has let education fall by the wayside as other nations grasp eagerly for a beginning or the stars. In a shocking report by Labor Secy. Willard Wirtz last week, it was revealed that 38 percent of the youths called for the draft last year were illiterate - and yet 113 percent of them exhibited high school diplo-

mas.

He made his revelation before a new force for education - the National Committee for Support of the Public Schools. It is made up of 500 private citizens who have banded towether to urge Congress to pass the President's education bill.

Illiteracy on the part of both Whites and Negroes showed an alarming rise in the past year. Turned down by the military services, these uneducated are then thrust on the labor market. And that market, becoming ever more auomated, can't absorb them. Employers who have turned to automation can't even trust these illiterates to watch dials and buttons because they do not consider the uneducated reliable. The upshot of the growth of illit-

eracy is that the nation must put money into welfare or into retraining programs instead of into the higher education it needs for those who are educated basically.

Both areas must have national attention. Primary and secondary schools must be aided in making the reforms necessary for keeping all young people in school until they have gained at least a reasonable degree of education - knowledge that will fit them into some phase of the

changing job picture. Higher education, while making room for scientists and technicians the new age must have, must retain its well rounded flavor of trying to turn out "whole" people, We want the scientists who will flood the Central Florida area in the next few years to be not mere automatons. but people understanding the human phases of life and able to help build this community.

If the Florida Legislature can't provide them with continuing education, this area should look to Congress for passage of the President's aid to education bill as a means of attaining the necessary.



TALLAHASSEE (UPI) - Bills almed at giving the state a bigger tax take from dog tracks and jai alai frontons were introduced in the Legislature Monday by Rep. William O'Neill of Marion.

One of the measures would repeal the special daily operational cost allowance given dog tracks before the state takes its taxeut. It would also

provide a special daily fee for small tracks with a pari-mutuel pool of \$35,-000 a day or less.

Tax

Currently tracks with a pool of \$25,000 or less pay taxes on a flat fee schedule starting at \$150 a day for pools up to \$20,000, to \$400 per day for pools between \$24,000 and \$25,000.

The flat fee schedule would provide additional fees, under O'Neill's bill, ranging to a top of \$1,750 for pools between \$34,000 and \$35,000. Tracks with pools in excess of \$35,000 would

be taxed at seven per cent from each pool. Result of the proposal would be to

raise in excess of \$1.3 million in taxes for the state. Another bill tossed in by O'Neill would put the tax for jai alai frontons

on the same scale as those for dogtracks.


