

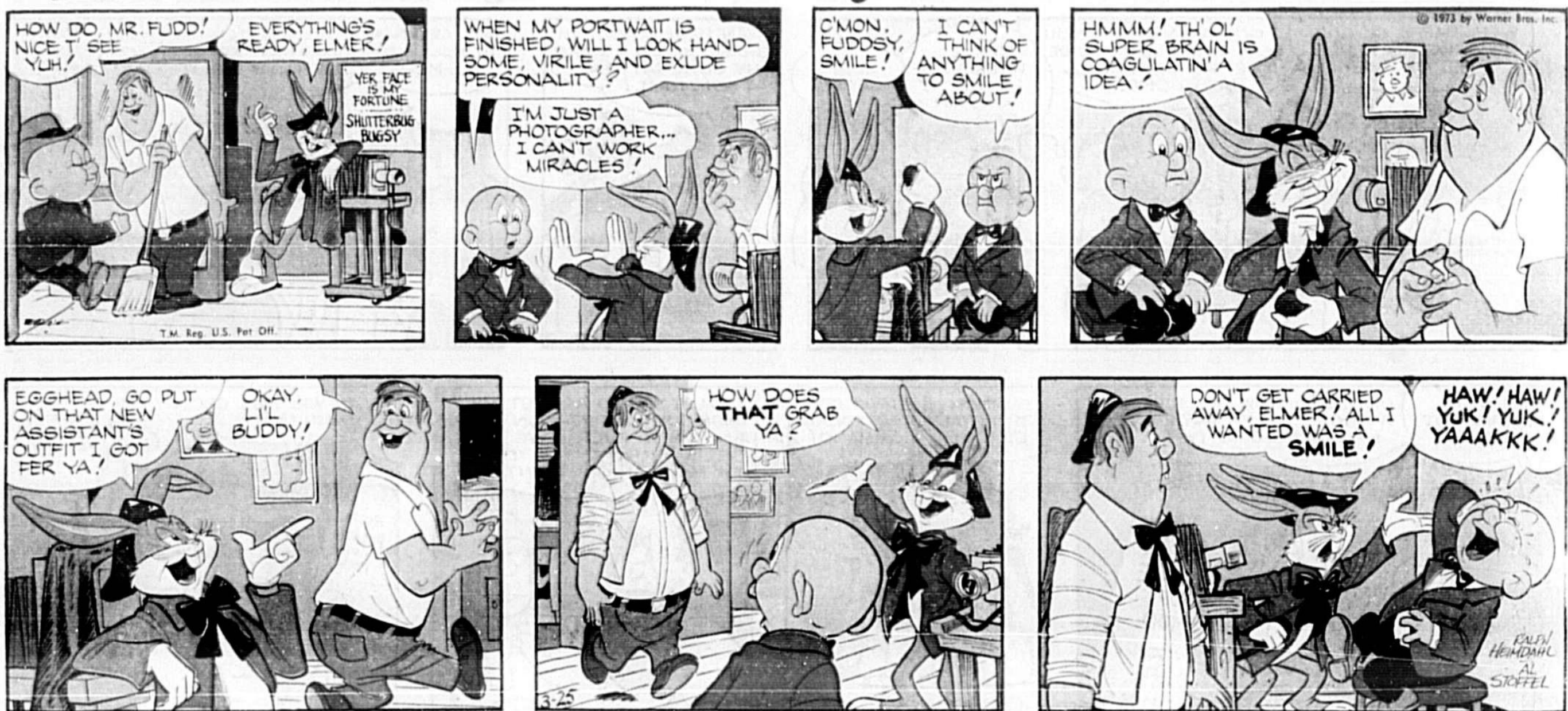

'Watergate' Names Heard

By JOHN CHADWICK Associated Press Writer WASHINGTON (AP) — Watergate defendant James W. McCord Jr., who says the public hasn't been told all about the bugging of Democratic national headquarters, has begun telling his story to Senate investigators.

Samuel Dash, chief counsel of the special Senate Watergate investigating committee, told a news conference Sunday that McCord had given him the names of others involved in the burglary and wiretapping and is to supply still more names later.

Dash declined to say if any of those named by McCord were "higher up" than the seven who pleaded guilty or were convicted at the trial here last January before U.S. Dist. Court Judge John J. Sirica.

The Los Angeles Times said it learned that McCord told Dash John W. Dean III, counsel to the President, and Jeb Stuart Magruder, a former presidential aide and campaign official, had prior knowledge of the burglary.

Sirica disclosed last Friday, when he was to impose sentences, that McCord had sent him a letter saying not only that perjury had been committed during the trial and that political pressures had been applied to the defendants to plead guilty and remain silent, Sirica urged McCord and the other six defendants to cooperate with Senate investigators.

McCord, an ex-FBI and CIA agent who was security director for the Committee for the Re-election of the President at the time of the break-in, met in the office of one of his lawyers with Dash Friday afternoon and again Saturday afternoon.

No details of what McCord said were disclosed, but Dash said McCord is willing to testify fully and under oath at committee hearings to be held as soon as possible.

Just when that will be is uncertain. Dash said that before hearings are held the committee will have to check out McCord's statements and leads he supplied "to make certain we have the complete story."

A committee meeting has been called for later today, but its purpose primarily is to get up the protest of some members against being denied access to FBI files in the Watergate case.

Under an agreement reached with Atty. Gen. Richard Kleindienst, only Chairman Sam J. Ervin Jr., D-N.C., Vice Chairman Howard H. Baker Jr., R-Tenn., and the committee's chief counsel and minority counsel will be permitted access to the FBI files.

Dash said McCord got in touch with him last Friday, shortly after the court proceedings, and said he wanted to meet with him.

Lobbyists Linked To Campaign Cash

MIAMI (AP)—At least one fourth of all campaign money received by candidates for the Florida House and Senate last fall was raised or given by lobbyists, the Miami Herald said Monday. Some \$600,000 in contributions to the state legislative campaigns could be traced straight to lobbyists or to fund-raising drives coordinated by lobbies the Herald reported.

Doctors and the state medical association pumped \$110,000 into the campaign treasuries, according to the Herald's sources, while members of the Florida Retail Association gave about \$50,000.

Beer Industries of Florida stumped \$27,000 in contributions from beer distributors, and small loan companies belonging to the Florida Consumer Finance Association added \$26,720, the newspaper said.

Four dairy lobbies and their officials gave \$18,460, while the Florida Academy of Trial Lawyers funneled \$12,500 through the Florida Lawyers Action Group Trust into 1972 state legislative races, the Herald reported.

There is some sentiment in Tallahassee in favor of seeking improvements in the campaign finance system, the Herald article by William Mansfield and Bruce Giles said.

"If a guy has made a substantial contribution, you're not going to dismiss his opinion without good reason," House Speaker Terrell Sessums commented regarding lobbyists' potential influence.

"There has got to be a better way of doing it than the path we've taken," Sessums said.

Government Attempts To Halt Lumber Cost

WASHINGTON (AP)—The Nixon administration announced today it is moving to check skyrocketing housing costs by increasing the nation's lumber supply and seeking voluntary restraints on Japanese log purchases.

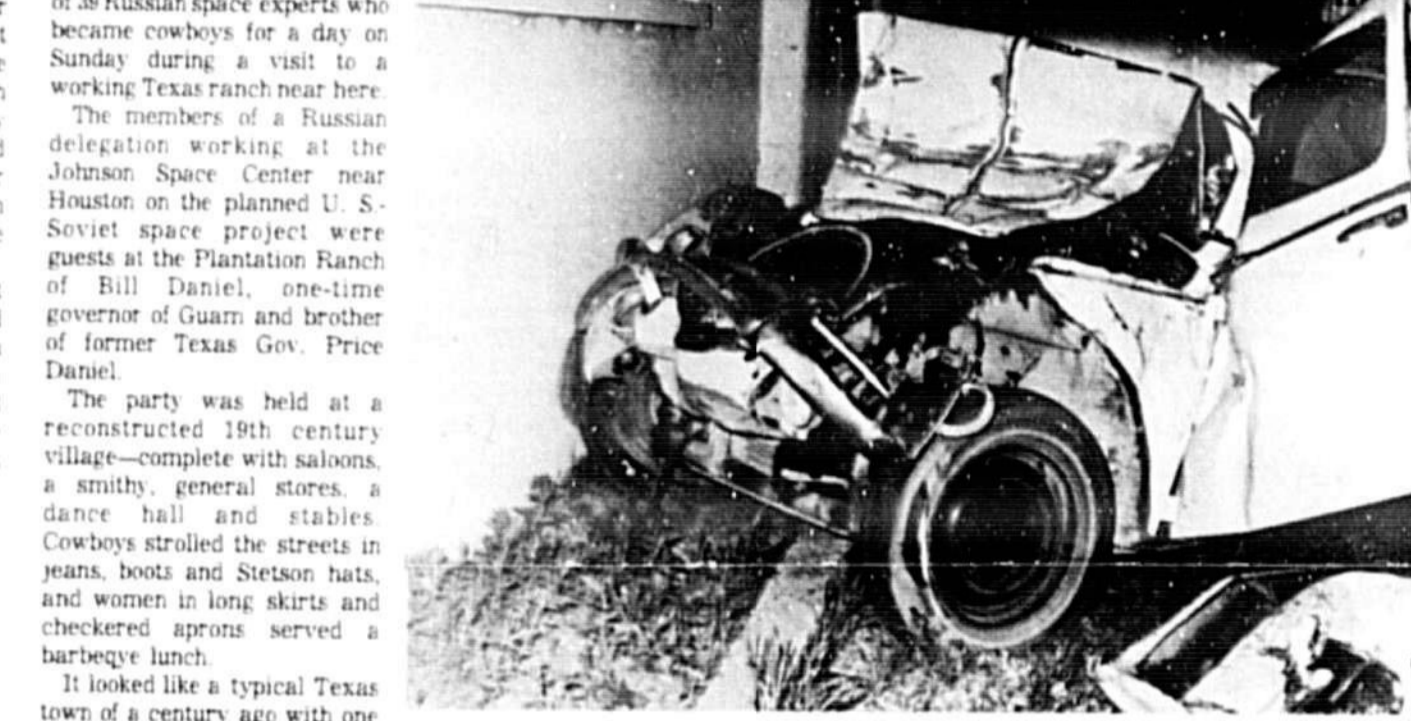
