






Lobbyists Linked To Campaign Cash

MIAMI (AP) — At least one fourth of all campaign money received by candidates for the Florida House and Senate last fall was raised or given by lobbyists, the Miami Herald said Monday. Some \$600,000 in contributions to the state legislative campaigns could be traced straight to lobbies or to fund-raising drives coordinated by lobbies the Herald reported.





underdeveloped lands in order to concentrate foreign aid funds on Vietnam. That fear is expressed around the Paris headquarters of the 16-nation Development Assistance Committee (DAC), which coordinates aid of the world's "haves" to the "have-

The crucial problem in the Indochinese peninsula will be to provide work for the million and a half war refugees in South Vietnam, the 700,000 in Cambodia and the 300,000 in Laos.

The trouble is that most underdeveloped countries have explosive unemployment problems too.

From 20 to 30 per cent of young people are out of work in the average developing country. estimates Edwin M. Martin, chairman of the DAC. Unemployment is even high among educated youths-the ones most likely to be envious, and to read Marx or Mao.

Reconstructing North Vietnam and South Vietnam, Laos and Cambodia will require an estimated \$7.5 billion in the next five years. The Nixon administration hopes that Congress will authorize 50 to 60 per cent of this, and that other countries will put up the remainder.

That way, U.S. foreign aid to Indochina would continue at approximately the 1971-72 level, and it would not be necessary to cut back aid elsewhere, says Martin.

DAC experts doubt if Russia can afford to increase the estimated \$415 million a year that it has been contributing to North Vietnam (in combined military and civilian aid.) China is not counted on to increase its estimated contribution of \$175 million a year.

Sweden has offered to spend \$75 million in North Vietnam. But that will not go very far when spread out over a projected three years. So the best bet for helping rebuild Indochina is Japan. It has proposed putting up half of a \$2 billion multinational investment in South Vietnam. But the Japanese are beginning to get

Dollar Needs Tough U. S. Defense

The buffeting of the dollar is a matter of intense concern o many Americans but continues to be a puzzle to most of

They are afraid that left to float in the international monetary sea, the dollar may promptly sink. But the gnomes of Zurich who understand these matters believe that floating the dollar is a necessary first step, sink

Representatives of the countries meeting in France over the dollar crisis agreed that the crisis was due to speculative Speculators dumped dollars on the market and bought marks, betting the United States would further devalue the

The new "float" means that the dollar will find its own level in the open market. That's good because the maintenance of artificial levels simply opens the way for speculators to make a big killing when the levels are changed

In the short run, a floating dollar may mean more expensive European vacation trips and higher prices for Relieved of the price pressure of foreign competition; some U.S. manufactured products may also increase in

Possibly under the influence of the national elections last year, the Federal Reserve Board allowed too much growth in

Nixon...Watergate? We'll Never Know

WASHINGTON INEA The probability is high that no inquiry and no public utterance is going to settle the question whether President Nixon personally ordered the 1972 rash of political spying and sabotage whose disclosure began with the Watergate bugging case last June.

An influential Republican source suggests convincingly that top aide H. R. (Bob) Haldeman is almost certainly the only man who would know directly whether or not the President ever issued such an order. It is clearly evident that Haldeman cannot be compelled to speak on this matter by the U.S. Senate, the courts, or anyone else. Nor should the nation hold its collective breath waiting for Haldeman's post-regime memoirs to set the record

My source, who cannot be properly portrayed as an apologist for Mr. Nixon on this issue, believes the President most likely did not order the controversial activity aimed at undercutting the Democratic party and its presidential candidates last year. Says this man: "The President, in my judgment, would have regarded

such an undertaking as counter-productive. If he had become aware of it at all (in the critical formative stage before the damage was done), he'd have stopped it." This Republican thinks that Haldeman, knowing and acting for Mr. Nixon as he does, also would have stopped

My informant is thoroughly persuaded that the President, early in 1972, understood his advantages over any plausible Democratic rival. Those were, of course, his incumbency, an improving economy, his widely approved overtures to Peking and Moscow, his winding-down of the Vietnam war and his peace efforts. Coupled with the Democrats' noisy internal stresses, these things would seem to have made spying and disruptive tactics unnecessary even to contemplate.

Nevertheless, not only the President's confirmed critics but many independent appraisers may find it hard to accept the idea of his non-involvement, at least to the extent of having knowledge of the undertaking and tolerat-A combination of factors-diligent investigative report-

ing by a few newsmen, Senate testimony by acting FBI Director Patrick Gray, public statements by some involved in the shenanigans-has drawn the whole enterprise into the White House, to the President's re-election committee, to high administration officials with presumed close access and responsiveness to Mr. Nixon. Well known now, of course, are the departures of such White House aides as Charles Colson and Dwight Chapin. the latter after disclosure of his dealings with the evasive political operator, Donald Segretti.

None of this truly proves Mr. Nixon either gave direction to these dubious activities or had personal knowledge of them at a time when he might have effectively halted them. It may say a lot about how some of Mr. Nixon's associates perceive him and interpret his wishes.

The theory went that the United States was in Vietnam to make sure the Vietnamese people were able to have a government that was, in its respect for its citizens and responsiveness to their needs, as close as possible to our 1 admittedly imperfect model.

Instead, what we see is a government that seems insecure to the point of paranoia in the face of this very same "peace with honor" that our own government finds so blissful. It is a government that reacts to news stories about its torturing political prisoners or violating the cease-fire not by disproving the stories or explaining them but by deceit and attacks on those who report the stories. Perhaps it is true that American journalists in South Vietnam at this point in history are meddling. But it would seem that even though the United States has more or less divorced itself from the day-to-day life of South Vietnam, we still retain certain visiting privileges.
