Battery May Not Be To Blame

Blaming starting trouble on the battery can be like blaming a broken leg on bone failure. In both cases, something is wrong but something other than the affected part is causing the problem.

A well-maintained battery should not cause starting problems. More likely, some other electrical component is at fault and is draining the battery power. For example, faulty wiring, worn spark plugs or a malfunctioning distributor may be overworking the battery during starting.

As a result, the battery wears down to a point that it may seem dead. A more visual sign will look beyond the battery as the cause of the starting failure, especially when he is reminded to do so by the customer.

To keep your battery in top operating condition, here are some pointers: A quick visual inspection every time you gas up and a voltage test every six months should assure you maximum efficiency battery life.

It's a simple job for the service attendant to check battery water level and condition of cables and terminals. This should be tested. At the same time, terminals should be cleaned thoroughly to get rid of any positive materials and dirt. Foreign matter on the terminals or cable clamps can cause battery failure.

Corroded terminals can shorten effective life of your battery. Clean off the corrosion with a solution of baking soda and water, applied with a stiff wire brush.

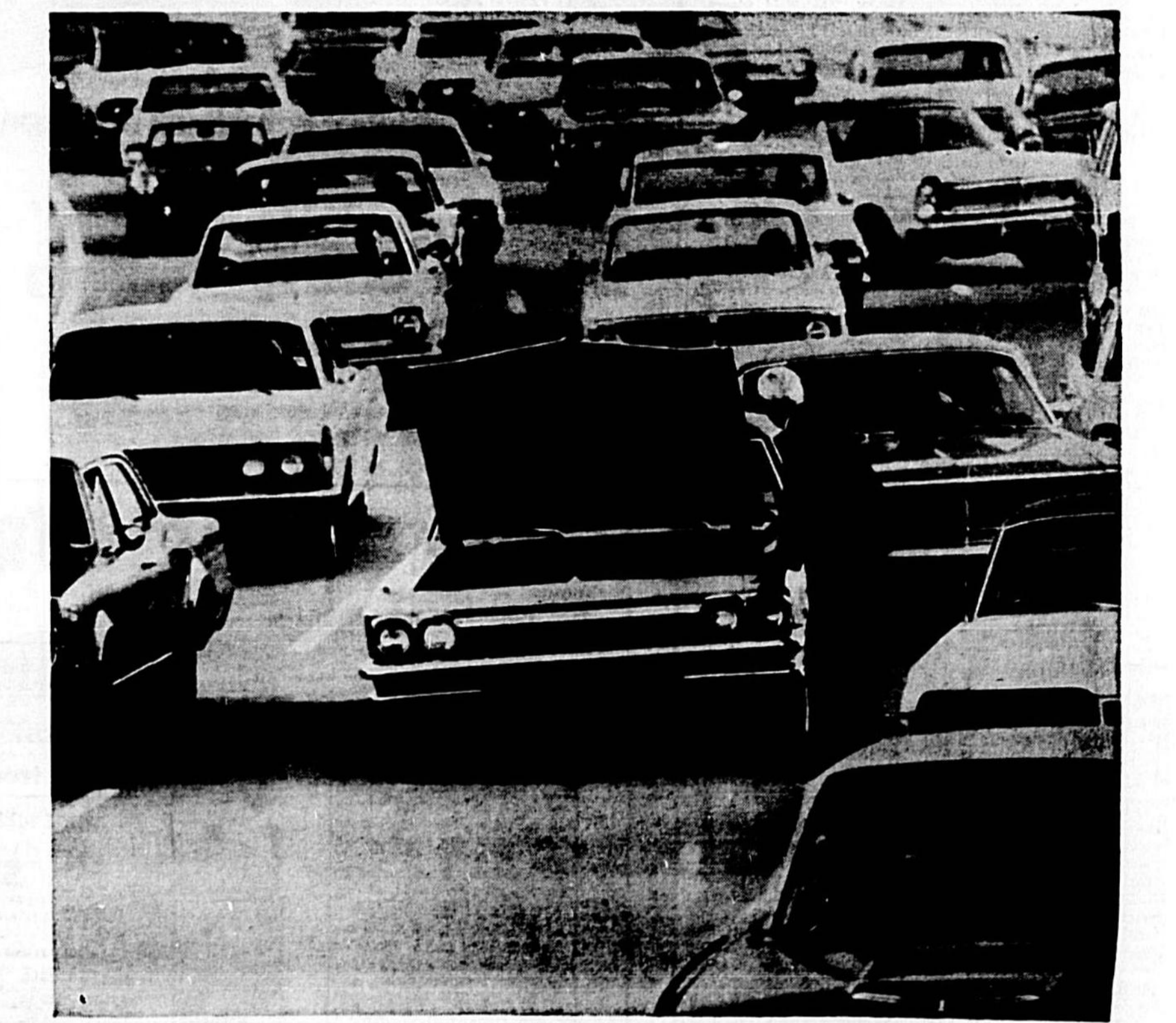

Seminole County School Board yesterday afternoon adopted a resolution approving the sale of \$18 million in school bonds. This sale will involve the balance of the \$103 million approved a year ago in a bond referendum by county freeholders.

Private School Lease Nixed

Mills Murder Trial To Jury

Jury was out as press time neared today in the trial of Artis Mills charged with the murder of James Reid of West 16th Street last December.

Dr. Hegert testified he found numerous bullet wounds on the body and that death had been caused by "massive hemorrhage from the wounds."

Mills' attorney, Albert Pitts, asked for a directed verdict of not guilty declaring the state, represented by Assistant State Attorney Thomas Soper, had not proved the defendant had any connection with the dead man and that nothing had been shown that Reid did not die by his own hand or by accident.

Judge Williams denied the motion.

During recesses of the trial, Circuit Judge E. Thom Rumberger sentenced Ben Posoly, who pleaded guilty to a charge of grand larceny, to a term of one year in the county jail. The judge ordered that 90 days of the sentence would be spent in the jail with four years probation. As a condition of the probation, the defendant was ordered to make restitution of \$166.63 and to pay court costs of \$28.

In another case, Judge Rumberger gave five years probation to Steven Darryl Kimbro, who pleaded guilty to breaking and entering with intent to commit a misdemeanor. Kimbro was ordered to pay \$300 attorney fees and \$500 court costs.

Death Can Come From Common Spray Can

WASHINGTON (AP) — For two youngsters looking for fun in the common spray can, the common spray can can die after inhaling the contents of such products as mouthwashes and cleaning fluids, according to the Food and Drug Administration. Victims were mostly teenagers, but one was only 11 years old, an FDA spokesman said.

"These kids apparently have been spraying products into plastic bags and then sniffing them," reported Joshua Zatzman, the FDA's assistant commissioner for education and information.

"Then if they don't withdraw their heads fast enough, they die."

"It causes some dizziness and some elation with one breath, but if they take two or three breaths it freezes their capillaries, congests their lungs, causes asphyxia. It kills."

Zatzman said the effect of inhalation is so rapid that victims die within minutes. "It's the same as what you do when you have your air-conditioning on," he said.

The Federal Trade Commission, Zatzman said, has issued an order effective May 21 requiring manufacturers of the aerosols to label the cans with a warning.

The FTC warning states: "It is an unfair or deceptive act or practice to fail to provide a clear and conspicuous warning on the labels of such products, that the contents thereof should not be inhaled in concentrated form, and that injury or death may result if such inhalation occurs."

Zatzman said the FDA has discussed the problem with the Pharmaceutical Manufacturing Association and with the Toilet Goods Association which is launching a \$75,000 educational campaign against deliberate misuse of the sprays.

The first death attributed to aerosols, he said, occurred in March 1967 and the FDA became aware of it shortly afterwards.

Paul A. Pumpian, an FDA official, told Rep. Fred B. Rose, D-Pa., who raised the matter in Congress, that there are no plans to withdraw aerosols from the market.

A breakdown by the agency showed such free products as mouthwash directly caused 17 deaths; first aid sprays four; "cooking coat," a teflon-like plastic used to prevent food

Reese said McLeod was shot after he answered a holdup call at a Miami bar. McLeod obtained a description of the robber. 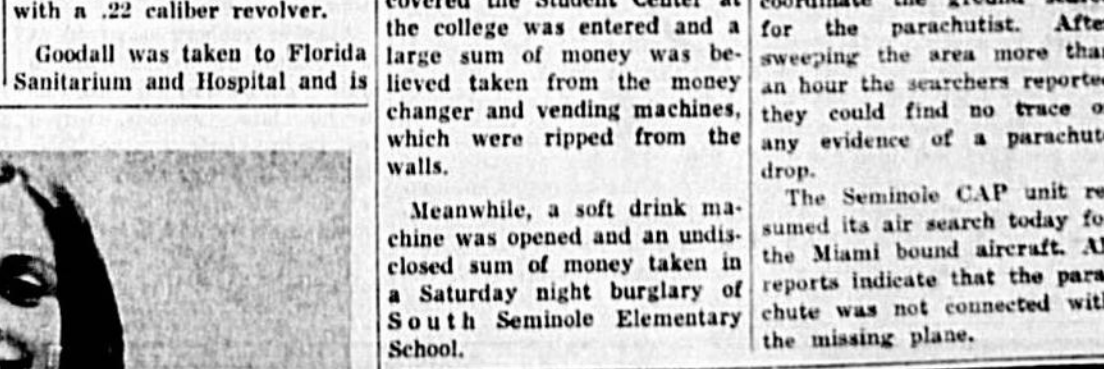
