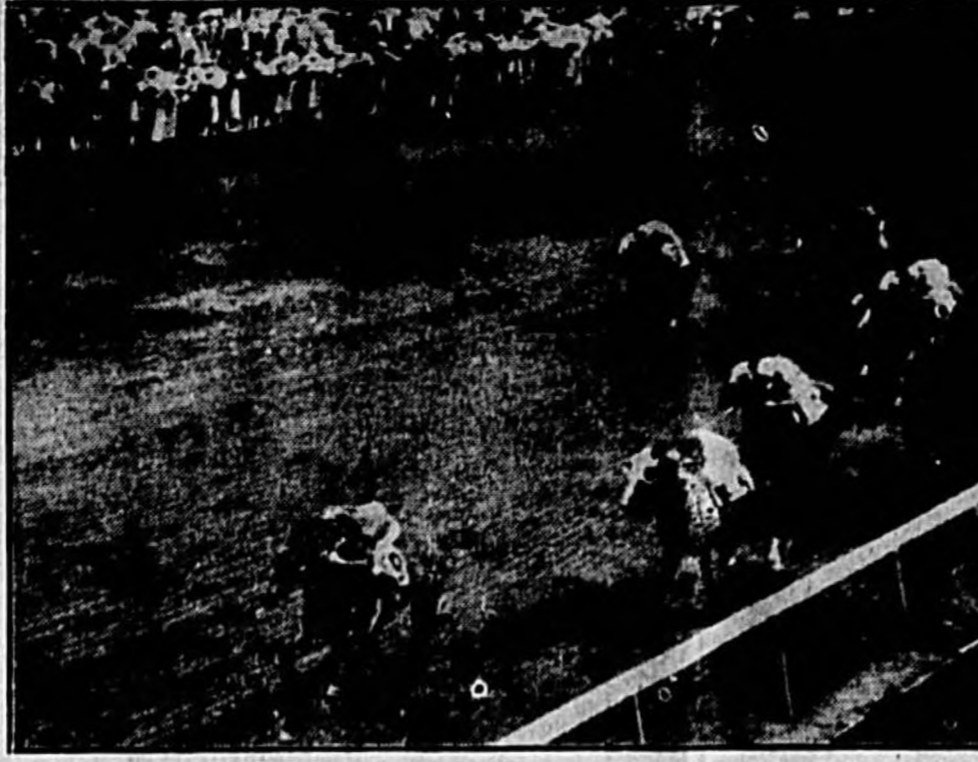
The two contestants were interrupted frequently as the school's officials substituted players left and right in an endeavor to give all an opportunity to display their wares in the first bit of competition.

Youths Tramp Back To Barracks For Defense Of Madrid In Spain's War

Strong Insurgent Attack Expected

Rebels In New Try For Advancement Near Guadalajara

MADRID, Mar. 10.—(AP) Between 10,000 and 12,000 newly mobilized youths are tramped today to their barracks to join the defense of the capital threatened by a strong mechanized insurgent army from the northeast.

The withdrawal of Government forces to more strategic positions along the Guadalajara-Zaragoza Highway, above Guadalajara, was announced after reports that the offensive had been halted 60 miles northeast of Madrid.

(Advice to insurgent headquarters at Avila said Gen. Franco's Guadalajara columns swept forward 12 miles along the road to Madrid and were within 17 miles of the provincial capital or 40 miles from Madrid.)

Cummings Issues Plea To Support Roosevelt's Plan

Public Health Program Urged By Safety Head

U. S. Attorney-General Asks Injection Of 'New Blood' Into Nation's Judiciary

WASHINGTON, Mar. 10.—(AP)—Attorney-general Cummings pleaded today for the adoption of President Roosevelt's court bill as a means of injecting "new blood" into the judiciary to avoid the "tortured construction of the Constitution."

He made his plea before the Senate Judiciary Committee at the start of hearings on the chief Executive's court reorganization proposals.

"The proposed increase in the number of judges is not for the purpose of enclaving the judiciary, nor for the purpose of making it an adjunct of the executive," he said. "Its purpose is to rejuvenate judicial machinery, speed justice and give the courts men of a fresh outlook who will refrain from infringing upon the powers of Congress."

Most of the 600 seats in the Senate caucus room were filled by a distinguished audience, many whom President Roosevelt last night attributed to the Supreme Court an improper exercise of "super-legislative powers."
