A letter written by Albert Hartwig, of San Juan, Texas, stated that in October, 1919, he went on a "pleasure trip" from Kansas City and was "induced to buy, and later found that he had a piece of land I never saw."

Under date of May 7, 1918, George C. and Jennie A. Brown told of leaving Watertown, S. D., for "Magic Valley" in the Rio Grande valley on an excursion in which they were "shown a good time."

"Autos met us and whirled us through the towns and went from one show place to another," they wrote. "We were shown an alfalfa field which they said could be cut eleven times a year. We signed up on the return trip. Now we must sell our corn and hogs to the Mexicans."

Mr. Vanderlip's answer asserted that the plaintiffs "gave added and general circulation and publicity to the alleged and pretended slander" by publishing in the Star and other newspapers, a false report of the Ossining address. The

defendant quoted in full an editorial from the Star accusing him of bringing President Harding's name into the oil discussion and alleged that thus the added and general circulation to the current humor.

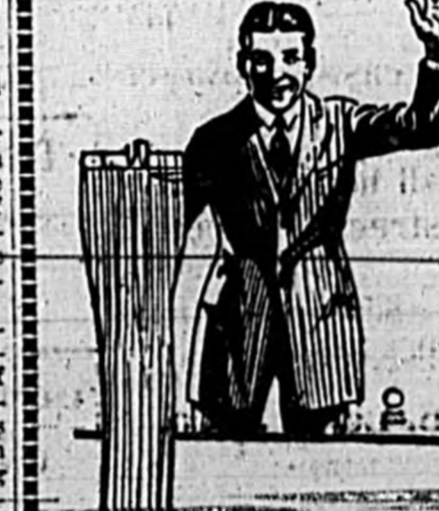

Continued from page 1 of the federal court of appeals, and former Governor Nathan L. Miller, of New York.

Indications were given during the day, however, that others still in the president's mind to a greater or less degree were Ar-

thur P. Rugg, chief justice of the Massachusetts supreme judicial court; Gov. Alexander J. Groesbeck, of Michigan, and Senator Borah, of Idaho.

The president during his conference with Senator Pepper and Secretary Weeks was understood to have inquired relative to the qualifications of the various men in his list. Chief Justice Taft called at the White House late in the day on another matter, but it was indicated that Mr. Taft was in the course of the conference, inquired of the chief justice as to the legal qualifications of those with whom Mr. Taft was acquainted.

The positive statement was made at the White House at the end of the day that no tender of the portfolio had been made but that the appointment probably would be made within a few days. The only concrete developments of the day beyond the conference appeared to be the addition of the name of former Governor Miller to the list of

those being considered and the virtual elimination of Chief Justice Rugg from the list.

The general belief of those close to the president is that he would like to appoint Chief Justice Rugg, and would do so if the chief justice were from any other state than Massachusetts. The president feels, however, that Massachusetts already has more than its share of federal offices. Numerous telegrams and letters urging appointments of various men were received at the White House today and indications developed of considerable pressure from the progressive wing of the Republican party in favor of Judge Kenyon, Representative McLeod, Republican, Michigan, at a conference with the president urged the appointment of Governor Groesbeck, who was formerly attorney general of Michigan.

Pepper Doesn't Want It. Senator Pepper, one of those conferring with the president, has himself been mentioned for the office but the general belief

is that Mr. Pepper would not take the place if it were offered to him and that moreover the president regards his services as of more value in the senate.
