

Vietnamese Destroyed

\$780 Million In Supplies

WASHINGTON (AP) - Retreating South Vietnamese troops lost or destroyed about \$780 million in weapons, ammunition and other fighting equipment and supplies, according to a key Pentagon official who investigated the situation for President Ford.

Erich von Marbod said in an interview, "My findings during my visit with Gen. Fred Weyand's mission to Vietnam do not substantiate the \$5 billion to \$10 billion figure" used by Sen. Frank Church, D-Idaho, last week. The conflict in figures apparently stems from the different bases on which von Marbod and Church made their

Von Marbod said he used the actual price paid by the United States for tanks, aircraft and other equipment, some of it bought years ago when prices were lower. He used current costs for such "consumables" as am munition and fuel, he said. An aide to Church said the senator arrived at his figures

on South Vietnamese equipment losses by projecting the costs of replacing the equipment at current prices.

Clown Continues Smile

LAKE GENEVA, Wis. (AP) - As a clown, his name is Happy, and 16-year-old Rob Wandschneider is still smiling despite his battle against the rare nerve disease which killed baseball's Lou Gehrig in 1941. And now Rob, a victim of amyotrophic lateral sclerosis, is getting ready for a dream trip to the Clowns of America national convention in Denver this week. Rob has been a member of Cousin Otto's Clown Alley No. 22 for the past two years, appearing in parades and celebrations, entertaining at hospitals and nursing homes. His fellow clowns, his classmates at Lake Geneva's Badger High School and members of the community joined to collect almost \$1,000 for the Denver trip he starts Wednesday.







Assistance Plans: Another Rip-off

When are our government agencies responsible for welfare assistance and the food stamp program going to start cracking down on individuals who are defrauding us, the taxpayers, out of hundreds of thousands of dollars each year?

It's about time those people who deliberately lie on applications for assistance during this time of economic crisis and accept monies under false pretenses are prosecuted to the fullest extent of the

Within the past few days, a local merchant told The Herald of one family who had applied for credit at his business establishment. It seems the man of the house had a \$400 monthly income from a firm where he had been gainfully employed for approximately 18 years.

His 'wife' was the recipient of another \$196 monthly from the welfare agency in Seminole County and a daughter who lived at home was also

The catch is that the 'wife' was drawing the welfare money under another name, probably her maiden name, and no doubt had failed to tell the welfare agency that she had a husband who was

Granted, there may have been extenuating circumstances that entitled this family to receive governmental monetary assistance, even if she told the truth. However, it is obvious that no background investigation was made by any agency to establish the legitimacy of the woman's claim.

A Herald reporter was told that the only type of investigation made on these applicants is via a personal interview, unless a complaint is made against the party or anything of a suspicious nature might be divulged during the course of the in-

Is this type of an investigation sufficient?

Even though we fully realize that a greater staff would be needed to conduct more thorough investigations into these applicants for assistance, the cost would probably be worth the effort as it would undoubtedly save more money than is spent to hire the investigators.

Too, perhaps we could use some of the monies doled out by the federal government and put some more people to work doing the actual legwork of such investigations and get them off the welfare

Persons drawing monetary assistance from any level of government should be subjected to an intense investigation before their claim is accepted

We've often heard the old story of the person driving to the welfare agency in his-her Cadillac to pick up a welfare check and, while we know it was intended to be a joke, it's no laughing matter - not when you consider how much it's costing us an-

Just a few years ago a state legislator called for such investigations and a committee to which he was appointed proved there were many people guilty of fraudulent claims for assistance. For a while, the damper was put on out-and-out


frauds, but now it seems we're inundated with even more than in recent history.

There are too many people who desperately need assistance to have the entire aid program ruined by those who would deliberately falsify an application just for a few extra bucks. It has been proven, time and again, that people

will lie and take a chance of going to jail in order to get additional funds. And as long as there is no more thorough an investigation than a personal interview, it will continue to be a malignant cancerous growth on every taxpayer.

We implore our legislators to look into this matter immediately and try to halt this outrageous fraud being perpetrated upon all of us.

Courts in recent years have taken a dim view of local zoning laws and practices. Two recent decisions in this field by the highest courts of two states could eventually have nationwide ramifications.

The New Jersey Supreme Court has struck

Upholding a lower court decision, the New Jersey high court ordered Mount Laurel Township to provide for "an appropriate variety and choice of housing for all categories of people who may desire to live there."

In Ohio, that state's supreme court has ruled that voter veto over zoning law changes violates the due process clause of the U.S. Constitution. The Ohio ruling arose out of an appeal by a developer who wanted to erect a high-rise apartment building in Eastlake, a suburb of Cleveland. This would have necessitated the rezoning of about eight acres of land.

ALTAMONTE SPRINGS - City commissioners last night revoked the occupational license of the Florida Police Benevolent Association (FPBA) to halt its donation solicitation drive which had brought complaints from Sanford and South Seminole

Mayor Norman Floyd said the FPBA's "misrepresentation" on its license application was one factor in the revocation. The purpose of the business as listed on the application, Floyd said, was "law enforcement association (union)" and did not mention the telephone solicitation drive.

Norman Perry, of Fort Lauderdale, vice president of the state organization, said the employe who acquired the license for the group should have listed the activity as "campaign headquarters," adding the man has since been dismissed. He said the office at 222 Sanford Ave. was rented for a 90-day period for the fund-raising activity and the main offices of the

organization were in Miami, Orlando and Tallahassee. The fund-raising was not being done from an Orange County location, Steve Micciche of the Orlando Police Department and an officer of the Orange County PBA, said because of "political

Orlando attorney Dale Anstine, who represented the association, said a major reason both the Altamonte Springs and Sanford police departments were opposed to the FPBA fundraising drive is because of competition to their own money-

He added that many of the complaints received by the Sanford Police Department were solicited through a newspaper addetails as well as Thursday's vertisement; most of the complaints were vague; and further tides at Daytona Beach are that someone else could have been making the solicitations referred to in the complaints.

Anstine said the PBA's telephone solicitations were all monitored, but Perry said monitoring was done on a selected basis. The solicitors read a prepared statement to those called, Perry said, adding solicitors at times got over enthusiastic and deviated from the prepared remarks.

Sanford representatives said Sanford Patrolman Herb Shea was told by a solicitor the fund-raising campaign was under the auspices of the Sanford department and the moneys raised would be used to "help widows and orphans of Sanford policemen" and would also benefit the Little League.


Altamonte Commissioner George Perkins said the solicitor benefit. Neither department is to receive any part of the donations, representatives of both said.

Anstine said the proceeds of the drive will be used to hire attorneys and lobbyists with the bulk of the money to go to the Orange County PBA. It is recognized, Anstine said, that the FPBA is "solely responsible" through its lobbying efforts for passing the state police bill of rights and collective bargaining. He said the statewide organization will act as bargaining agent for many of the law enforcement units throughout Florida.

Commissioners first turned down on a 3-2 vote a motion "not to revoke" the license. Action to revoke the license was passed by 4-1 with only Commissioner Helen Keyser opposing.

The drive was to have continued through May 31.

Anstine asked City Attorney Joe Davis for an opinion of whether the city actually has authority over the statewide organization since it is a charitable group and whether it really needs an occupational license.
