# U. S. Warplanes Bomb Red Oil Dump Near Haiphong

SAIGON (AP) — U.S. planes bombed a petroleum installation 12 to 14 miles south of Haiphong Sunday in the closest raid on the week to North Vietnam's chief port.

A U.S. spokesman reported a secondary explosion was set off in the raid on the Do Son depot, the highest of a day of air attacks against the North hampered by worsening weather.

Air Force and Navy planes flew 60 strikes and armed reconnaissance missions.

In South Vietnam, a Viet Cong mine exploded under a base 40 miles northwest of Saigon, killing 37 civilians and wounding 10, and the U.S. Command announced that 34 Americans were killed, 76 were wounded and four were missing in war operations in the past 48 hours. Six U.S. Army and Marine helicopters were reported downed by enemy fire.

A total of 46 enemy dead was reported by U.S. forces.

U.S. authorities announced

that two U.S. Air Force F4 Phantom jets were responsible for the accidental bombing Thursday of the refugee-packed Montagnard village of Lang Vei. The U.S. Command said the planes made three bombing and rocket passes, killing 83 civilians, wounding 75 and leaving 10 missing.

At yet, there was no explanation for the cause of the bombing mistake. Reliable sources said the planes dropped CHU antipersonnel cluster bombs

among other ordnance and this may have accounted for the large number of casualties.

The American ground casualties were disclosed under a new policy of giving specific numbers of men killed or wounded in action. The U.S. Command reported for the past 18 months had been reporting casualties only in terms of light, moderate or heavy, to deny information to the enemy, but American authorities said this frequently resulted in ambiguities and "mis-

understanding."

Many of the casualties reported today occurred in small engagements in Marine operations south of the demilitarized zone and in Operation Junction City, the big U.S. sweep in Communist war Zone C close to the Cambodian border.

But eight of the Americans were killed in Binh Dinh Province, about 300 miles northeast of Saigon, when enemy fire brought down a large CH-53

chopper. The aircraft was badly damaged.

The Viet Cong continued using their mortar in South Vietnam, hurling 100 rounds of 81mm and 60mm shells against a company from the U.S. 25th Infantry Division north of Tay Ninh, and dropping 30 to 40 rounds on the U.S. Marine jet airfield at Chu Sai, south of Da Nang. Twenty-two Americans were wounded in the first attack and seven in the second. Light damage was reported to jet aircraft at Chu Lai.

Viet Cong mortar also shelled a Vietnamese village near Chau Doc, at the edge of the Mekong Delta, killing one civilian and wounding 21 others. A Vietnamese spokesman said.

Scattered ground actions in Operation Prairie 2 south of the demilitarized zone accounted for 21 Viet Cong killed on Sunday. However, the skirmishing cost the lives of 11 Marines, and another 31 were wounded.

Two Marine HH-3 helicopters were downed by enemy gunfire in the area with both suffering moderate damage, and three Americans were wounded.

RF-4 bombers continued their attacks on enemy base and headquarters areas in South Vietnam Sunday and today, making three raids against targets in Quang Tri, Thua Thien and Tay Ninh Provinces. All were in areas near where military ground operations are taking place.



# City Landfill Appeal Denied

The County Commission today upheld the board of adjustment ruling denying the city of Sanford's use for a sanitary landfill operation north of Vhilen Road.

Indications are the city will now appeal the case to Circuit Court.

The commission unanimously denied the appeal citing the proposed landfill as a "detriment

to land values" in the area and health and safety factors.

City Manager W. E. Knowles appealed to the commission to repeal the board of adjustment ruling saying the operation "would be a model for the entire state." He stressed that there would be no burning or scavenging.

However, Attorney George Speer, who said he represented

close to 100 persons in the room and 100 property owners in the area, emphasized that a landfill operation would "downgrade the entire area."

He, as well as others, stressed the threat of air and water pollution in the proposed landfill area, which is located north of Vhilen Road and east of U.S. 1.

Many property owners spoke up at the board meeting saying they didn't want two dumps in the area. The county operates a dump near the proposed landfill.

In other business, the board agreed to remove from A-1 structures to C-4 commercial the northeast corner of the intersection of I-4 and Lake Mary Boulevard.

## 'We'll Dry Up And Die'-Oviedo 419 Alignment Hit

Predictions the town would "dry up and die" if the proposed new alignment of SR 419 by-passes Oviedo were heard from members of the Town Council Monday evening.

Pointing to other Central Florida cities whose downtown business sections have suffered by being bypassed by new state highways, the council strongly objected to the proposed plan for SR 419 which will "loop around the town."

"While we all agree 419 should be built within the city limits, we are not all in agreement that the road should be built through the downtown section," W. H. Martin, council chairman, declared to district County Commissioner Robert Parker, present for the meeting.

Full agreement was evidenced, however, among Councilmen Rex Clonts, Kirby Bucklew and T. L. Lingo Jr.

Parker advised council to hold town meetings to get "the feel" of the people on the best route of the road and then inform the County Commission of its desires.

Parker also pointed out that realignment of 419 may be many years in the future.

**Wildcat Strike**  
MANSFIELD, Ohio (AP) — A second wildcat strike within a month hit General Motors Corp.'s Fisher Body Division here today, amid reports of violence on the picket line.

**Elected**  
SAN SALVADOR, El Salvador (AP) — Col. Fidel Sanchez Hernandez, the candidate of El Salvador's government party, has been elected to his country's next president as expected with a majority over the three opposition candidates.

## Swofford Hits Road Program

County Commissioner W. Lawrence Swofford today blasted the primary and secondary road program to be presented to the State Road Department this afternoon, terming it an "inconsistent program."

While stating he is in favor of SR 426 being the top priority project in both programs, he pointed out "inconsistencies" in the program.

"SR 426 is given third and fourth priority in the primary program but only listed as 11 and 13 in the secondary program which provides money for the rights-of-way," he said.

"If we further placed SR 426 as number six in primary and number 12 in secondary requests.

"The board spent only two hours preparing this program. Not enough time was given to it and the State Road Department doesn't appreciate this kind of jumble," Swofford declared.

Swofford cast the only dissenting vote on the road resolutions at the meeting of the County Commission this morning. However, the board unanimously approved the urban primary program of the City of Sanford to be presented to the SRD.

## 'Clean-Up' Drive Set By Oviedo

A concerted clean-up drive will begin in the next few weeks in the Town of Oviedo under the direction of the State Board of Health.

While major purpose of the drive is the eradication of mosquitoes, side effect of it will be to free the town of trash.

Morris Dillard of the state board informed council, at their request, that a survey of the town will be done in early April to determine the amount of trash that needs to be removed. One or two days will be required for the survey.

The state will furnish four trucks and drivers for the project at no cost to the town and the town will supply three laborers to load the trucks.

The project itself will require seven or eight days for completion.

In other business, Council took under advisement the request for changing the name of Central Avenue to either Alafaya Trail or University Boulevard.

## Comprehensive Oviedo Plan?

A comprehensive plan will be for the Town of Oviedo by the Orange-Seminole Joint Planning Commission, Harlan Hanson agreed Monday evening, if either or both of the cities of Casselberry and Altamonte Springs desire such planning.

Hanson, executive director of the commission, appeared at the meeting of the study and general plan for land use, streets and community facilities.

Codes and ordinances development such as subdivision regulations, zoning ordinances, annexation procedure, housing code and land development of the other two South Seminole municipalities wished also to have such planning.

In that event, cost to Oviedo would be between \$1,900 and \$3,900. Planning would include maps, population study, economic in April.

## At Casselberry Council Talk Utility Proposals

City Attorney Kenneth McDaniel was directed by the Casselberry City Council at a continued session Monday night to make a counter proposal to Casselberry Utilities, Inc., regarding negotiations for the purchase of water and sewage facilities by the city.

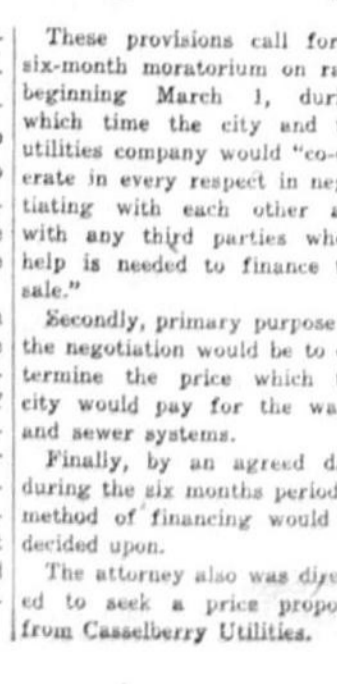
In a motion by Councilman Charles Woodruff, three of the provisions relative to sale, listed in a 14-page proposal of Feb. 20, were declared acceptable with others deferred for further negotiations. The conditions were included in a letter to the council from Robert Dyer, attorney for Hilliard Casselberry, owner of the utilities company.

These provisions call for a six-month moratorium on rate, beginning March 1, which time the city and the utilities company would negotiate in every respect in negotiating with each other and with any third parties whose help is needed to finance the sale.

Secondly, primary purpose of the negotiation would be to determine the price which the city would pay for the water and sewer systems.

Finally, by an agreed date during the six months period, a method of financing would be decided upon.

The attorney also was directed to seek a price proposal from Casselberry Utilities.
