NEW YORK CITY, Mar. 26, (AP)—The United Nation's Security Council came tary Not Get Relief smackup against the transaction this afternoon but Program Supplies recessed without taking a vote on whether to consider the Soviet-Iranian question. The recess found the Big Three divided on the issue, with the United States and Britain in favor of an immediate consideration of Iran's appeal to the Security Council. Russia took the opposite side.

Russia was backed by Poland. Nations which appeared more or less in opposition to the Soviet stand included, besides the United States and Britain, Mexico, the Netherlands, Egypt and Australia. Secretary of State Byrnea led the demand to have the Council consider Iran's appeal against the presence of Red army troops in the near east country. Soriet Apphasander Audret Gromye arnot fulfill the requirements for inclusion on the agenda. Gromyko argued that the case did not fail under the category of a situation endangering peace and socurity.
